Just Transition

Local and Regional Economic Support Strategies Support Scheme

Offaly County Council submitted five applications between **8th December 2023** and **23rd January 2024**. They were in relation to projects which would support enterprise and employment both across the county and included the specific areas of Shannonbridge, Rhode and Tullamore. All projects were aligned with the objectives of the Offaly Local Economic and Community Plan. Offaly County Council has been notified as follows:

- Economic Development Unit to progress the Offaly Economic Development Strategy and Action Plan 2022-2027 – total application costs
 €1m – Unsuccessful
- Film Offaly Resource to act as a film development coordinator – total application costs €252,985 – Successful
- Tullamore Enterprise Hub total application costs **€1m Unsuccessful**
- Dalton Centre Re-purposing, Shannonbridge to create an employment / enterprise space – total application costs €1m – Unsuccessful
- Technical Consultancy Services to identify a services corridor to the Rhode Green Energy Park – total application costs €537,634 -Unsuccessful

JTP GROUNDWORK Technical Assistance

Offaly County Council are supporting the SEAI Sustainable Energy Communities Programme who have been successful under the Just Transition Platform Groundworks Technical Assistance scheme. This partnership which is supported in the region by Roscommon and Longford County Councils and by the Eastern and Midland Regional Authority (EMRA), will engage with a European Technical Assistance

team, from current date until early 2025. The objectives are based on:

- Capacity building in the communityowned energy sector
- Accessing EU funding sources
- How to influence Irish government policy to be more supportive of community-owned energy
- Technical information and advice



REGENERATION

Town & Village Renewal Scheme - 2023

The Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, has announced on 29th April 2024, details of the projects that have been approved for funding under the Town and Village Renewal Scheme 2023. A total of €500,000 was secured for Offaly's Towns and Villages.

The 2023 scheme had a renewed focus on town centre economic and social recovery and regeneration, through projects focusing on town centre regeneration, enhancing streetscapes and bringing vacant and derelict buildings back into use

as community multi-purpose spaces through refurbishment and renovation. This year the scheme also included a focus on Town or Village Centre Markets e.g. Farmers Markets, Open-Air Markets, Local Trader Markets, Artisan Markets or similar in alignment with the Programme for Government.



Community Centre Investment Fund - 2023

On 24th April 2024 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, announced a grant of €1.4 million to deliver a new community centre in Moneygall under The Community Centre Investment Fund.



This grant requires 10% match funding of €157,000k secured via Local Property Tax raised in Offaly of €117,000 with Moneygall Development Association providing the additional €40,000.

The Community Centre Investment Fund was launched in March 2023 to provide investment for 'shovel-ready' new build community centres.

Moneygall Community Centre is a 327m² multipurpose centre, which will be open to and used by a broad range of individuals and groups within the local community.

Outdoor recreation Fund -2023

Heather Humphreys TD, Minister for Rural and Community Development, announced on March 28, 2024, that Offaly County Council received a grant in the amount of €60,000 towards maintenance and repair work on the Slieve Bloom Way and ancillary loops at Cadamstown and Kinnitty, in addition to the Offaly Way and

ancillary loops at Kilcormac and Lough Boora.

The funding is part of the 2023 Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme, which supports both new outdoor recreational infrastructure development and the upkeep of existing facilities in rural Ireland providing support for the necessary repair, maintenance, enhancement or promotion of existing outdoor recreational infrastructure in rural areas across Ireland.

Just Transition

In January 2024 Mary Hensey was appointed as the EU Just Transition Fund Tourism Activator for County Offaly, Mary is playing a pivotal part in supporting and guiding private and community-based Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs) in developing high-quality project proposals and grant applications through Fáilte Ireland's EU Just Transition Regenerative Tourism and Placemaking Scheme. A number of information meetings were held throughout the county and Mary is liaising with potential applicants offering advice and support with their **Expressions** of Interest Application forms.

Meitheal

Meitheal is a two-day face-to-face workshop that gives the Irish tourism industry and overseas tourism buyers from over 20 different countries the opportunity to meet and do business. Over 10,000 appointments were conducted over two days with many new and important contracts signed.

The 2024 show was held in the INEC in Killarney on 11th & 12th April. Four Offaly businesses attended in person with further businesses/attractions listed in the Buyers Guide which is distributed to all attendees. The Tourism Officer attended offering advice and support to the trade and establishing vital contacts in the industry.


Local Authorities throughout the country, key government and agency partners attended the 2-day event, sharing best practice experiences, with a varied, interesting and inspiring programme.

Housing Update

- There are 537 on the Social Housing Support List at the end of April 2024.
- A further 578 active tenancies are currently being supported under the Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) Scheme, 10 signed up for HAP and 8 exited from HAP in April.
- At the end of April, 32 single people and 22 couples and families were being supported in emergency accommodation.
- A rent review of Social Leasing Scheme Tenants (including Rental Accommodation, Short Term Leasing, Repair & Lease and Mortgage to Rent) and HAP Tenants has commenced. All

relevant Tenants have been written to and outstanding rent assessment forms and supporting documentation should be returned immediately. Tenant queries can be directed to our email at RentReview@offalycoco.ie

Retrofit Programme

In deciding on a works programme, local authorities are urged to choose a mix of properties across a range of BERs to allow for homes which need significant expenditure to be balanced out by those needing lesser spend so as to achieve the overall average cost of €34,000 per property. A BER rating of B2 must be achieved.

The scheme aims to promote the development of facilities that will be used in the future by all members of the community. A comprehensive presentation was delivered outlining the scheme criteria.

EU Just Transition Fund: Regenerative Tourism & Placemaking Scheme 2023-2026 and Investment Grant-Aid Scheme for Private & Community SMEs: Ms. M. Hensey, EU Just Transition Fund Tourism Activator provided a detailed presentation to members and outlined supports available and keys dates for submissions.

HEALTHY OFFALY

April began with the first quarterly Healthy Offaly Subcommittee meeting of

2024 taking place on Wednesday 3rd of that month. It was an important meeting as most of the new implementing partners who are rolling out actions on behalf of Healthy Offaly this year, were in attendance. It was a great networking opportunity for these new partners to meet their Subcommittee colleagues from 2023 and the various representatives of the other agencies who comprise the Subcommittee. Updates on action progress were given by all partners informing the meeting that 2023 actions are in progress and 2024 actions having also started or nearing commencement.

Also, in April the 2024 service level agreements for the coming year were signed and submitted by all implementing partners. The first 50% grant payment allocations were also processed for payment with all partners now having received the necessary funds to progress their actions. The remainder of the month was spent answering queries from Pobal regarding the 2023 Healthy Ireland Coordinator Salary return and Programme Return. This was cumbersome task with many multiple queries received and exacting levels of detail required. The Healthy Ireland Coordinator continues to attend meetings and training provided by the Healthy Ireland National Coordinators network with some good ideas to progress the Healthy Ireland agenda received.

ARTS OFFICE PROGRAMMES Lough Boora - Art in Landscape Festival of Change



The Festival of Change took place in early April this was a joint project between Offaly County Council, Mayo County Council, and Visual Artists Ireland and supported by the Arts Council's Invitation to Collaboration Scheme.

The festival presented a diverse and stimulating agenda of activities and gatherings, delving into the influence that art, both tangible and intangible, could exert on communities and locations, encompassing social, economic, and cultural dimensions.

The festival was connected to two distinct sites across the counties: the Tir Saile Sculpture Trail in Mayo and the Lough Boora Sculpture Park in Offaly. In Offaly, the festival commenced at Tullamore's Esker Arts on the morning of Friday, 5th April, with 'Tionól', a gathering of selected individuals, groups, and artists who presented their ideas regarding the potential held by 'art in the landscape' to an intrigued audience.

Artists and community groups were invited to be part of the audience and witness the blue-sky thinking with regards to running art projects. This led into an informal networking session called the 'Conversation Café,' providing a platform to further develop ideas from the 'Tionól'.

Throughout the day, a variety of discussions and activities took place, including an illustrated discourse by photographer and filmmaker Tim Smith, accompanied by Hardeep Singh Sahota and a soulful performance by folk artist Ruairí O' Shea. The evening witnessed the unveiling of 'Midland: Mother Myth Memory,' an exhibition by the esteemed artist Rita Duffy, by Cathaoirleach of Offaly County Council Cllr Eddie Fitzpatrick.

The official opening was followed by a Bhangra Ceili. Comhaltas groups, set dancers, belly dancers — all types of dancers either novices or more established were invited to this fun event — the first of its kind in the Midlands, which produced an evening of colour and cultural exchange.

On Saturday, 6th April, Storm Kathleen led to the postponement of some events. Details will be announced via Offaly Arts and Esker Arts in due course of the date for rescheduled events. Hardeep Singh Sahota hosted a Bhangra Dance workshop in Esker Arts before the festival culminated with 'Rhythm of Light,' an exhibition premiere and commission showcase by Hardeep Singh Sahota. The exhibitions continue at Esker Arts up to May 25th, 2024, and are open to the public free of charge during opening hours.

with the production team, Jason Branagan, (Director) Mark de Carreau, (Actor, Producer) Emer Durcan (Producer) and Brian Durcan (Cinematographer) of Western Front Studios is currently in post-production and will be hoping to have its national premiere in the coming months.

Film Offaly Award 2024

The call for the FilmOffaly 2024 Award closed on **Monday 11th March 2024.** The award saw a great response from filmmakers across Ireland with 46 scripts submitted, which are currently going through the assessment process.

Funding Opportunities The 2024 Youth Arts Commissions

Two projects are currently in progress having received arts office funding - Emma Barone's visual art project, 'Creative Spaces Art Programme – Empowering Youth Through Creativity' with at-risk young people in the Birr area.

A transformative six-week programme designed to foster creativity through self-expression, the project will run in collaboration with Birr Subgroup, and Music Generation Offaly's Songwriting Project in collaboration with Tolü Makay centred around vocal health, songwriting, and recording. This ambitious project will see students from Tullamore working with renowned recording-artist Tolü Makay, in the creation and recording of original work.

Creative Places Edenderry



Creative Places, Edenderry, a project funded by the Arts Council, led by Creative Lives in partnership with Offaly County Council Arts Office and Edenderry Municipal District, continues to host an array of different arts-based activities, workshops and events in a wide range of art forms including Visual Arts, Music, Poetry, Playwriting, Creative Movement; Dance; Ceramics; Drama; Radio, Photography.

connection to and interest in Edenderry and the surrounding area.



Climate Action Climate Action Plan 2024-2029:

April saw the official launch of Offaly County Council's Climate Action Plan 2024-2029 with the ceremonial planting of a native oak tree in Lloyd Park Tullamore by Minister of State Pippa Hackett, Cathaoirleach Cllr Eddie Fitzpatrick, and CE Anna Marie Delaney. To mark the occasion all local representatives were invited, and the official party were joined on the morning by a number of sitting councilors, candidates, and members of the Climate Action Team. Hard copies of the plan can be viewed at Aras an Chontae, each of the 3 MD offices and at our 8 libraries throughout the county.

To mark the successful development, adoption, publication and launch of all 31 local authority Climate Action Plan's, Minister Eamon Ryan TD, and officials from DECC and CARO offices organized an event in Ennis County Clare to mark the occasion. Climate Directors, Coordinators and Officers from around the county came together to discuss common actions and approaches on transitioning from plan development and adoption into the next

phase of plan implementation. (OCC plan directly under Minister Ryan)



Community Climate Action Fund

At the expiry date for submissions, Offaly County Council received 24 applications through our on-line application portal, Submit.com. Those applications totaled approximately €850,000 which indicates the huge community interest in the scheme. All completed applications are being reviewed, and as the scheme is oversubscribed by almost 100%, an evaluation committee convened to score each application before being sent to DECC for final approval.



Climate Action Initiatives

The Climate Action Team were delighted to be invited to attend and speak on the topics such as the recently adopted LACAP and Bring Your Own Cup initiatives at the recent business breakfast in the Bridge House Hotel expertly organized by colleagues from LEO on Lean, Green & Digital. The main speaker on the day, Mr. John O'Shanahan gave an inspiring talk to more than 50 attendees from the business community on how their businesses can increase profitability by embracing a green sustainable pathway and availing of various supports offered by Offaly LEO.

Offaly County Council are supporting Tullamore businesses take climate action with the deposit return scheme aimed at eliminating single use coffee cups in the town. With sponsorship from Tullamore Chamber, KMK Metals Recycling and backed by Tullamore Credit Union, Tullamore Tidy Towns and Team Tullamore local businesses are encouraged to sign up to the initiative in order to provide customers with a sustainable alternative to single use cups.

The Environment Section was successful in a waste enforcement case in Tullamore District on 12 April against an individual under Section 32 of the Waste Management Act, 1996 relating to the illegal collection of waste from a property in Dublin and the dumping of same at Finnamore Lakes, Boora. After a detailed investigative process, the defendant pleaded guilty in Court and the Judge convicted him and issued a penalty of €2,500 plus €700 costs to the Council.

Dangerous Structures

Environment Team issued 2 no. Section 3 Statutory Notices on properties situated in Offaly and has updated the Dangerous Structures Register accordingly. Environment Team will proceed in accordance with the Local Government (Sanitary Services) Act 1964

Burial Grounds St. Mary's Cemetery, Edenderry

A contractor is being appointed to carry out the works to the extension of the cemetery and works are due to commence by mid-May.



Cemetery Committees

We currently work with 17 cemetery committees, and we look forward to working with new committees in 2024. There are grants and assistance available form the CA-ENV-RW section and we welcome engagement from groups that are currently maintaining their local cemetery or planning to form a committee to do that.

RURAL WATER SERVICES:

Capital

Applications for capital funding from the Multi-Annual Rural Water Programme 2024 to 2026 were submitted to the Rural Water Unit, Dept of Housing, by 12/04/2024. Applications for a total of 36 projects were submitted, seeking funding to the value of €2,513,838.00.

Veterinary Control of Dogs

So far in 2024 we have cared for 77 dogs in the Dog Shelter of which we have managed to re-home 70 so far.

On average 15% of the dogs are reclaimed by their owners, 15% are rehomed by the Care of Dogs Team and the other 70% are rehomed through animal rescue charities.

The Control of Dogs team has also dealt with 25 complaints so far this year and has assisted AGS on a number of raids and have carried out inspections of premises under DBE and Animal Health and Welfare legislation.

Control of Horses

To date in 2024, we have dealt with 11 complaints, there have been no seizures to date.

Veterinary Inspections

Offaly County Council continues to operate the Shared Service Agreement for Veterinary Services in the Westmeath County Council administrative area.

Water Quality Farm Inspections

Targeted farm inspections have commenced in accordance with the Good Agricultural Practice Regulations, SI 113 and 393 (Good Agricultural Practice for the Protection of Waters) Regulations 2022 as amended. i.e. The Nitrates Regulations,

Nutrient Management Plan

9 no. Nutrient Management Plans have been assessed and approved in 2024 to date.

Domestic Wastewater Treatment Systems (DWWTS) inspections

Domestic Wastewater Treatment Systems (DWWTS) inspections have commenced in accordance with the National Inspection Plan for Domestic Wastewater Treatment Systems.

Discharge Licences

Discharge Licence sampling has commenced in accordance with the 2024 sampling programme which was prepared following a review of chemical analysis data, non-compliance rate and process performance for each licensed site during 2023. There are currently 11 Licenced sites in Offaly.

Water Framework Directive Sampling

The WFD sampling programme has commenced under the WFD River & Lake Sampling Programme 2024. The sampling programme is designed to provide a representative geographical spread of surveillance and operational monitoring sites across all hydrometric areas.

TRANSPORTATION

Edenderry Town Inner Relief Road Phase 2

Construction works on Phase 2 of the Edenderry Inner Relief Road were substantially completed in April 2024 with the scheme scheduled to open for use in May 2024.

Expansion of our Velocity Patcher Fleet

We have placed an order for our 3rd Velocity Patcher Unit to complement the 2 new units deployed across our Road Network in 2023. Each Municipal District

will now have a permanent machine assigned within their fleet on receipt of the new vehicle.

Roads Program 2024

Preparatory works across all the program headings in the 2024 Roads program have now commenced across each Municipal District. While weather conditions are restricting some works from commencing we are now scheduled to commence some of our Macadam works and Surface Dressing program works in May 2024.

Public Lighting

The following is a breakdown of the Public Lighting failures across the County on the 29th of April. There are **169** faults on the system presently. **32** of these faults require third party intervention and as such cannot be repaired by the maintenance contractor. There are also 23 of the **32** third party faults that are historical records that include private housing estates whereby a survey was uploaded regarding a public lighting asset that was never commissioned in the first instance hence cannot be a fault. These anomalies are

being addressed by the yearly public lighting capital program.

Therefore, the current actionable faults amount to **137** <u>faults or **1.47** %</u> of the lighting stock.
