Tullamore Decarbonising Zone Launch & Networking Event

Work continued on organising the Tullamore Decarbonising Zone Launch event which will take place on Monday July 14th in the Tullamore Court Hotel. The event is aimed at Tullamore businesses, community groups, public agencies, education practitioners and other interested stakeholders looking to explore opportunities and develop partnerships in decarbonising Tullamore, enhancing biodiversity and driving sustainability.



Energy Retrofit Programme

Work has commenced on both Offaly County Council 'SEAI Pathfinder **Programme'** which supports energy retrofit of non-domestic public buildings. The buildings under this phase are the most significant energy users, Áras an Chontae and Tullamore Aura Leisure Centre. In partnership with SEAI, OCC aims to complete deep retrofit measures to each building in order to help the organisation meet energy efficiency and carbon reduction targets. IN2 Design Partnership have been appointed as the multidisciplinary design team for the project and they have already completed initial site surveys and have commenced modelling certain potential energy

saving scenarios. An initial report on high level energy opportunities is due in Q3 which will lead to a detailed design stage thereafter.

Energy Management System

Offaly County Council are at an advanced stage in achieving the ISO Energy Management accreditation. The ISO standard provides a practical way to improve energy use, through the development of an energy management system (EnMS).

Our Energy Officer, Jerome Shannon, received the Auditors ISO 50001 Stage 1 Audit report in early June. The report highlighted some minor areas to be addressed before the Stage 2 Certification Audit. The Stage 2 (Certification) Audit is scheduled to take place on site from in September. It is anticipated that this will meet the accreditation standard.

ISO 50001 is based on the management system model of continual improvement so will see energy management integrated into the organisations overall efforts to improve energy and climate action. To support this, we are currently developing a strategy to develop staff awareness of the energy management system.

Sustainable Energy Communities

SEAI held their Nation Gathering 2025 for Sustainable Energy Communities Programme in Portlaoise on 7th June, 2025. The Community Climate Action officers from Laois & Offaly were invited to host a stand for the event.

CCTV

The Environment Section re-installed the bottle-banks at Daingean Road at the end of May. In order to deter illegal dumping and enforce litter and waste legislation, CCTV was installed at the site in accordance with the Codes of Practice adopted by the LGMA. A press release was issued to make the public aware the banks were in place and the presence of CCTV to monitor illegal dumping. Council staff monitor the site on a daily basis. To date, there has been one incidence of littering and one Litter Fine has been issued. The CCTV and the public awareness by the Council regarding same has proven to be an effective deterrent against illegal dumping thus far.

Waste Enforcement

Waste Complaints: To date Waste Enforcement has received and investigated 37 complaints relating to unauthorised waste disposal and sites.

Inspections: Waste Enforcement is on target to meet the EPA inspection rate for 2025 regarding the Producer

Responsibility inspections – Tyres, Plastic Bags, batteries, WEEE etc.

Brown Bin Collections:

- 1. Householders: In June, a total of 203 Householders were asked to demonstrate how they manage their waste collection ensuring they are segregating organic food waste from the residual bin, by means of home composting, brown bin collection or using a civic amenity site on a regular basis.
- 2. Commercial were inspected to ensure that food waste from Kitchens, canteens, deli counters are segregated from the residual bin collection by means of brown bin collection only. Some follow up inspections required but in general very good compliance rate.

Deposit Return Scheme

WERLA have contacted Environment to ensure the DRS are contacted in advance of Tullamore Show and National Ploughing Championships for the scheme to be available at both events. Government Agencies will need to see compliance before committing to appearing at Ploughing Championships.

Anti Dumping Initiative

DECC granted €80,000 to Offaly County Council for mattress amnesty and CCTV at dumping blackspots. Mattresses will be collected and processed at Longford plant where the material will be resource material for new mattresses – ensuring compliance with Circular Economy objectives

Civic Amenity sites:

Footfall at all sites remaining steady, slight decrease in Birr.

Mattress amnesty to occur at 3 sites in Summer, it is envisaged this will help advertise Birr Civic Amenity site. Issue with Clothes/Textile Recycling, authorised companies are encountering difficulty with their markets overseas. This has resulted in pausing of clothes collection at the Civic Amenity sites until WERLA/DECC have found alternative processes for companies.

Water Quality

Local Catchment (River) Assessments

The Water Quality Team has commenced LCA's which incorporate desktop studies, chemical and biological sampling to assess targeted rivers. The biological sampling is a kick sample, where the invertebrates that live on the river bed are assessed & quantified. The amount & type of inverts assessed is an indicator of the true health of the river. The LCAs' will support OCC in identifying the sections of rivers impacted and allow these impacts to be investigated and addressed through the implementation of mitigation measures as required. The LCA programme supports OCC in achieving OCC's objectives of the Water Framework Directive & River Basin Management Plan.

Air Quality

Offaly Co. Co. has been selected for inclusion in the Air Quality Pilot Project 2025, one of only six counties nationally selected. The Clean Air Strategy for Ireland set ambitious targets for ambient air quality across the country, where Ireland committed to meeting WHO interim target 3 (IT3) air quality levels by 2026.

Edenderry has been selected for the Air Quality Pilot Project 2025 with €90k of funding secured from DCEE. This multifaceted project will include a continued programme of air quality monitoring and analysis, communication and public engagement and programmes developing recommendation options on for improving air quality (e.g. such as buildings retrofit).





Flood Relief Schemes:

Portarlington Flood Relief Scheme

Stage I - Scheme Development and Design of Portarlington's Flood Relief Scheme (FRS) - is being advanced by Binnies and Nicholas O'Dwyer (B/ NOD), together with Laois County Council (LCC), Offaly County Council (OCC) and the project's Steering Group which consists of members from the Office of Public Works (OPW). Progress is ongoing in terms of development of the scheme design, engineering surveys and environmental assessments.

The Options Development report is being finalised and will be completed in the next period, including a detailed Climate Change Adaptation Plan, updated costing of the Scheme and Carbon Calculator.

Rural Water Services

Capital: We are currently awaiting the Rural Water Unit's Expert Panel decisions on the remaining Multi-Annual Rural Water Programme 2024 to 2026 capital grants.

Burial Grounds

Minor works: We are commencing a series of minor works in 2025, including the construction of additional plinths in St. Michaels Cemetery, Portarlington, which is nearing capacity. Works on the new driveway and entrance in Killeigh are due to commence in July.



Animal Control

Control of Dogs: So far in 2025 we cared for over 80 dogs in the dog shelter. On average 15% of the dogs are reclaimed by their owners, 15% are rehomed by the Care of Dogs Team and the other 70% are rehomed through animal rescue charities.

Housing Update:

- There are 573 on the Social Housing Support List at the end of June 2025.
- A further 422 active tenancies are currently being supported under the Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) Scheme, 3 signed up for HAP and 6 exited from HAP in June.

- At the end of June, 38 single people and 15 couples/families comprising of 19 adults and 37 children were supported in emergency accommodation.
- Number of maintenance requests received for month of June was 313.
- Total of housing stock at end of June is 2221.
- 2025 Annual Rent Review, 2,132 LA Rent Letters were issued on Friday 27th June 2025. New rents will be effective from the 12^{th of} July 2025.

Draft Portarlington Joint Local Area Plan 2025-2031

The Elected Members following consideration of the Chief Executives Report on Submissions received on the Material Alterations of the Draft Portarlington Local Area Plan 2025-2030 resolved to formally adopt the Portarlington Joint Local Area Plan 2025-2031 at the June Council meeting.

Residential Zoned Land Tax (RZLT)

The Council issued letters to landowners on June 26th who requested;

- a change to zoning of lands under Section 653I(4) of the Taxes Consolidation Act 1997, as amended up to and including the Finance Act 2024;
- that their land be excluded from the Residential Zoned Land Tax Map draft map under Section 653E(1) of the Taxes Consolidation Act, 1997, as amended.

7 rezoning requests were received, all of which were rejected by the Council while 4 of the 9 exclusion requests were accepted by the Council.

Just Transition



The Bioeconomy Demonstration Initiative Call 2 opened on 16th June 2025 and is now accepting applications. €10 million will support the development of two bioeconomy piloting and demonstration projects in the wider Midlands.

There are four indicative topic areas envisaged in the call:

- Developing biochar products to promote its use in agriculture and industry
- Innovative bio-based food and feed ingredients
- Biobased materials for the construction sector
- Bio-based value chains for valorisation of sustainable crops

Stakeholders along the entire bio-based value chain have been invited to apply in a balanced and integrated consortium - including SMEs, research performing organisations, universities, local authorities, clusters, primary producers, bioprocessing industries, and consumer brands.

Closing date for the call: **8 August 2025 at 12pm**

Community Development Committee held its monthly meeting on 12th June 2025. Main agenda items included the following:

Selection of Chairperson & Vice-Chairperson: Nominations were invited from the members for the selection of Chairperson & Vice-Chairperson to serve for a maximum period of three years. Mr. R. McDermott, representative of the local and community interests' sector was deemed to be selected as Chairperson. Ms. D. Arnold. representative of the PPN Social Inclusion Sector, was deemed selected as Vice Chairperson of Offaly LCDC. Members expressed their thanks to Cllr. J. Leahy & Ms. S. Sweeney for their significant contributions as Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson, respectively, with the LCDC over the past number of years.

Local Economic Community Plan 2024 – 2029 & LECP Implementation Plan 2024 – 2025:

Members were provided with a very comprehensive overview of the progress to date of the LECP Implementation Plan and the ongoing actions and objectives.

Ms. A. Mangan, Just Transition Officer was introduced and provided the members with a brief of how her role will provide support and guidance to community groups and provide signposting to appropriate supports in

terms of funding, grants, and training under the Just Transition Funding Scheme.

Local Enterprise Office (LEO):

An update was provided to members outlining the role of the LEO and the members were informed of a vast range of supports and opportunities available to business start-ups in the county.

An update on the progress of the Community Recognition Fund 2024 (CRF) and the Local Enhancement Programme (LEP) 2025 were outlined.

Local Enhancement Programme 2025:

The Minister for Rural and Community Development and the Gaeltacht, Dara Calleary TD announced the successful projects under the Local Enhancement Programme (LEP) 2025 on 13th June 2025,

including the awarding of €177,225 to 145 Offaly Groups, as approved by Offaly's LCDC on 27th March 2025. The Local Enhancement Programme 2025 provides vital support to community groups to help them with ongoing costs and small-scale capital expenses to improve their facilities.

The festival runs over four days during the October mid-term break Wednesday 29 October – Saturday

1 November 2025 in Birr, Tullamore, Edenderry, Clara and Kilcormac.



FILMOFFALY

We're pleased to announce that our **Documentary Mentorship Programme** is now open for applications to take part. Those accepted will receive training in the essential skills needed for making documentaries, and they will also receive a professional assignment collaborating with local producer Garret Daly on the short documentary "Closed For Lunch".

With peat production no more, the documentary reflects on the good times, and especially the lunch times had with co-workers. In an age where delis and food courts are the new norm, this will be a nostalgic look at canteen craic and the social connections made during lunchtime.

This is a huge opportunity for budding filmmakers from the Offaly area and provides vital professional experience for anyone's CV. This is an inclusive project, and anyone is welcome to apply regardless of their level of experience. Because of the subject matter, we particularly welcome interest from the communities and families directly impacted by the peat factory closures.



We successfully delivered two training workshops this month. Firstly, we held a series of **Podcasting**

Workshops the Kilcormac at Development Centre's (KDA)'s new purpose-built podcasting facility. This was a small course designed to help local podcasters turn their ideas into sustainable podcasting projects (including how to use video complement their work), as well as promoting use of the KDA's new facilities. The professional podcasting trainer also shared a wealth knowledge with the KDA to help them make the most of this new resource.

Next, we welcomed the National Talent Academy Film & TV and Poca Productions to run an intensive **Smartphone Filmmaking Course.** After some online sessions, the attendees met in Birr. Over the course of four days

they were taught the practical aspects of making films with their phones, as well as working together to make a staggering



nine short films in and around the town. We are particularly grateful to the Castle and the European Tech Hub for letting us use them as locations. The next phase of the course deals with editing and post-production, but we can't wait to see the results and hope to arrange a screening when everything is complete.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES, RESIDENCIES AND BURSARIES

Birr Writers Residency Award 2025

The Birr Writers Residency award callout closed on May 19th. The call-out has received an unprecedented high number of applications - 43 applications have been submitted by writers and poets from Ireland and abroad. Assessment panel met in June and 4 writers/poets were selected for the residency; all confirmed their dates with Brendan House. Public events will be held in Birr as part of the programme. Birr Writers' Residency offers professional writers' accommodation and workspaces for five nights, at Brendan House in the centre of Birr, County Offaly.



Midlands Professional Development Initiative in Performing Arts

Offaly Arts Office is committed to fostering the growth and development of the performing arts sector within the county, supporting both emerging and

established artists. This new initiative unique and presents valuable opportunity for Offaly-based performing arts practitioners to engage in an exceptional development programme. Offaly Arts Office will support two bursaries of €200 each for Offaly-based practitioners to attend this programme in August, ensuring they have the participate in opportunity to transformative series of workshops and masterclasses.

COMMUNICATIONS

The Arts Office continues to produce a bi-monthly newsletter *Offaly Arts Alert*, offering updates and information on Arts Office event and opportunities etc. as well as promoting and sharing funding and bursary opportunities that might be of interest to artists and communities that have a shared interest in the Arts. The Newsletter for July - August will be disseminated at the beginning of July by email and on social media.

Arts Office Team continues to be active on social media (Facebook and Instagram), with the number of followers on both increasing by a quarter in the past 6 months.

Creative Places (CP) Edenderry



CP Edenderry have received funding from the Arts Council for the final two-year funding,

commencing in July 2025. Their main focus for Year five & six will be to engage people in Edenderry who have not yet been involved in Creative Places, Edenderry and to support the artists and groups we have been working with regularly to become more independent of the project.

Creative Places, Edenderry, a project funded by the Arts Council, led by Creative Lives in partnership with Offaly County Council Arts Office and Edenderry Municipal District was awarded a 4th year of funding by the Arts Council and goes from strength the strength hosting an array of different arts-based activities, workshops and events in a wide range of art forms including Visual Arts, Music, Poetry,


Healthy Offaly held their showpiece networking and wellbeing event on Tuesday 10th June in Mucklagh

With over 70 participants from across the county, representing multiple nationalities, the event was a vibrant celebration of diversity, culture, friendship, and the power of inclusion through the universal language of soccer. A huge thank you to everyone who took part and helped make this event such a huge success.



Community Sports Development Programme

Two programmes commenced delivery in June:



 i. Social cycling for Teens in Belmont – a 10k out and back cycle along the Grand Canal Greenway from Belmont to Shannon Harbour, two sessions were delivered in June with an average attendance of five at each session. Additional sessions will run in July and August.

ii. Teens kayaking – based in Shannon Harbour, four come try kayak sessions for 40 teens were delivered in June. Additional sessions will run in July and August.

Sports Inclusion Development Programme

Three programmes were delivered in June: -

- i. 10-week multi-sport programme with a focus on fundamentals in the Marian Preschool in Clara. The pre-school offers specialised, tailored support for children with a global developmental delay such as neurodivergences with additional physical and/or complex needs.
- ii. Eight-week gym programme with St Hilda's Services in Ferbane GAA. St. Hilda's is a voluntary organisation that provides a comprehensive quality service to people with mild, moderate and severe intellectual disabilities.
- iii. July provision three sports days were hosted in Leah Victoria Park, Tullamore, while a number of schools were also supported individually. In total, 300 pupils across 15 schools (St Marys Edenderry, Tullamore College,

Educate Together Tullamore, St Patricks Edenderry, Clara Boys School, Gortnamona, Mucklagh, Clara Girls School, Ballinagar, Daingean, Ballinamere, Kilcormac, Killeigh, Kileen, Seir Kieran and Offaly Special School Tullamore) were supported to participate in the programme. Thanks to all who attended and our fabulous tutors who assisted on the programme.
