AND WHEREAS Offaly County Council, in considering this declaration request, had regard particularly to:

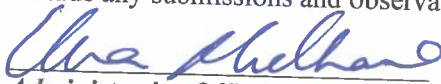
(a) Section 2(1), 3(1) and 4(1)(h), of the Planning & Development Act 2000, as amended.

AND WHEREAS Offaly County Council has concluded that the proposed works is development and is exempted development.

NOW THEREFORE Offaly County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 5(2)(a) of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended), hereby decides that:

- The renovation of existing dwelling (as detailed in the submitted documentation) **is development and is exempted development** at Curraghavarra, Banagher, Co. Offaly.

Such matters include any submissions and observations received by it in accordance with statutory provisions.

1. Introduction

The question has arisen as whether the proposed renovation work (as detailed in the submitted planning documentation) to the existing dwelling is or is not development and if so, are they exempted development.

2. Background

The detached dwelling is located within Banagher Town and is zoned as *Existing Residential* under the Banagher Town Plan, contained in Volume 2 of the Offaly County Development Plan 2021 -2027. The property comprises a vacant semi-detached single storey dwelling. The Applicant confirms that the existing dwelling is connecting to all main services (sewerage, water and electricity).

3. Site Inspection

A site inspection was carried out by the Area Planner in June 2025.

4. Site History

On Site – No recent planning history associated with the subject site.

Enforcement – No recent history associated with the subject site.

Adjoining Lands – Section 5 Declaration ref. 25/69 received by the 22nd May 2025 for the renovation of the adjoining dwelling. Decision due date 18th June 2025.

5. Legislative Context

In order to assess whether or not the proposed works constitute exempted development, regard must be had to the following items of legislation:

Statutory Provisions

Section 2 (1) Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, states as follows:

“house” means a building or part of a building which is being or has been occupied as a dwelling or was provided for use as a dwelling but has not been occupied, and where appropriate, includes a building which was designed for use as 2 or more dwellings or a flat, an apartment or other dwelling within such a building;

“works” includes any act or operation of construction, excavation, demolition, extension, alteration, repair or renewal and, in relation to a protected structure or proposed protected structure, includes any act or operation involving the application or removal of plaster, paint, wallpaper, tiles or other material to or from the surfaces of the interior or exterior of a structure.

Section 3 (1) Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, defines development.

“development” means, except where the context otherwise requires, the carrying out of any works on, in, over or under land or the making of any material change in the use of any structures or other land.

Section 4 - Exempted Development

Section 4 (1) (a) – (l) sets out what is exempted development for the purposes of this Act including:

- (h) development consisting of the carrying out of works for the maintenance, improvement or other alteration of any structure, being works which affect only the interior of the structure and which do not materially affect the external appearance of the structure so*

as to render the appearance inconsistent with the character of the structure or neighbouring structures.

Section 4 (2) (a) - The Minister may by regulations provide for any class of development to be exempted development for the purposes of this Act where he or she is of the opinion that -

- (i) *by reason of the size, nature or limited effect on its surroundings, of development belonging to that class, the carrying out of such development would not offend against principles of proper planning and sustainable development.*

6. Proposal by Applicants

The Applicant has advised that they wish to apply for the Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant for the subject site and have been requested to seek a Section 5 Declaration. They confirm that there will be no additions or extension to the existing dwelling.

The list of proposed works includes:

- A list of Proposed Works** to be undertaken during this renovation is included below:
- Removal of existing internal floors and the installation of new DPM, insulation and Concrete Screed,
 - New Electrical Installation,
 - New Mechanical [Plumbing & Heating] Installation,
 - New Window and External Door installation,
 - Repairs to existing chimneys,
 - Internal drylining installation throughout,
 - New external sand and cement napped plaster finish,
 - Removal of any decayed or damaged timbers within the building and replacement with new elements,
 - Removed decayed timber lintels and the Installation of new prestressed concrete lintels over all openings,
 - Removal of the flat roof from the existing rear extension and the installation of a new replacement flat roof,
 - Replace fascia and rainwater chutes.

7. Evaluation

Question: Whether the proposed works (as listed) to the existing dwelling are development and if so, are they exempted development?

In considering the proposed works against the definitions of 'development' and 'works' as provided in the Act, it is the view of the Planning Authority that the proposed works are deemed as development as it includes refurbishments to the existing dwelling.

Question: Is this proposal considered as Exempted Development?

With regard to the proposed works which as described in the submitted documents, the Planning Authority are satisfied that the proposed works would not result in a material alteration to the appearance of the dwelling and would not be inconsistent with the character of area. The refurbishments proposed by the applicants is harmonious with Section 4 (1) (h) of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended).

It is therefore the opinion of the Planning Authority that these works meet the criteria of exempt development under statutory provisions.

8. Appropriate Assessment

Having regard to nature of the development which comprises of the renovation of an existing dwelling at Shinrone; distance of approximately 0.7km from the Middle Shannon Callows SPA and the lack of any pathway to a European site it is considered that the proposed development would not be likely to have a significant effect individually, or in-combination with other plans and projects, on the Natura 2000 network and appropriate assessment is not therefore required.

9. Environmental Impact Assessment Screening

Please refer to Appendix A; no EIA required.

10. Conclusion & Recommendation

It is recommended that the Applicants be advised that the proposed development **is development** and **is exempted development**.
