1. Introduction

The question has arisen as to whether or not the proposed single-storey extension to rear of existing dwelling is or is not development and is or is not exempted development at Killeigh, Co Offaly, R35 YF58.

2. Background

The dwelling is located opposite the green in Killeigh Village, which is 7.5Km south-east of Tullamore Town. The subject site is zoned as *Existing Residential* in the *Offaly Conty Development Plan 2021-2027*. The existing dwelling is located off Local Secondary Road L-2002-1.




Figure 1: Site location map (red arrow)

3. Site History

4. Legislative Context

In order to assess whether or not the proposed works constitute exempted development, regard must be had to the following items of legislation:

(i) Statutory Provisions

(a) Section 2 (1) Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, states as follows:

"house" means a building or part of a building which is being or has been occupied as a dwelling or was provided for use as a dwelling but has not been occupied, and where appropriate, includes a building which was designed for use as 2 or more dwellings or a flat, an apartment or other dwelling within such a building;

"works" includes any act or operation of construction, excavation, demolition, extension, alteration, repair or renewal and, in relation to a protected structure or proposed protected structure, includes any act or operation involving the application or removal of plaster, paint, wallpaper, tiles or other material to or from the surfaces of the interior or exterior of a structure.

- (b) Section 3 (1) Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, defines development. "development" means, except where the context otherwise requires, the carrying out of any works on, in, over or under land or the making of any material change in the use of any structures or other land.
- (c) Section 4 (1) (a) (l) Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, sets out what is exempted development for the purposes of this Act including:
 - (h) development consisting of the carrying out of works for the maintenance, improvement or other alteration of any structure, being works which affect only the interior of the structure and which do not materially affect the external appearance of the structure so as to render the appearance inconsistent with the character of the structure or neighbouring structures.
- (d) Section 4 (2) (a) Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended states that the Minister may by regulations provide for any class of development to be exempted development for the purposes of this Act where he or she is of the opinion that
 - by reason of the size, nature or limited effect on its surroundings, of development belonging to that class, the carrying out of such development would not offend against principles of proper planning and sustainable development.
- (ii) Regulatory Provisions
- (a) Article 6 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended) states, inter alia, that:

"Subject to Article 9, development of a class specified in Column 1 of Part 1 of Schedule 2 shall be exempted development for the purposes of the Act, provided that such development complies with the conditions and limitations specified in Column 2 of the said Part 1 opposite the mention of that class in the said Column 1".

(b) Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended) Schedule 2 - Exempted Development, Part I - Development Within the Curtilage of a House, Class 1 specifies: The extension of a house, by the construction or erection of an extension (including a conservatory) to the rear of the house or by the conversion for use as part of the house of any garage, store, shed or other similar structure attached to the rear or to the side of the house.

Proposed developments are is considered to be exempted development if the following limitations are complied with: 1.

- Where the house has not been extended previously, the floor area of any such (a) extension shall not exceed 40 square metres.
- Subject to paragraph (a), where the house is terraced or semi-detached, the floor area of any extension above ground level shall not exceed 12 square metres.
- Subject to paragraph (a), where the house is detached, the floor area of any extension above ground level shall not exceed 20 square metres.

2.

- Where the house has been extended previously, the floor area of any such extension, (a) taken together with the floor area of any previous extension or extensions constructed or erected after 1 October 1964, including those for which planning permission has been obtained, shall not exceed 40 square metres.
- Subject to paragraph (a), where the house is terraced or semi-detached and has been extended previously, the floor area of any extension above ground level taken together with

the floor area of any previous extension or extensions above ground level constructed or erected after 1 October 1964, including those for which planning permission has been obtained, shall not exceed 12 square metres.

- (c) Subject to paragraph (a), where the house is detached and has been extended previously, the floor area of any extension above ground level, taken together with the floor area of any previous extension or extensions above ground level constructed or erected after 1 October 1964, including those for which planning permission has been obtained, shall not exceed 20 square metres.
- 3. Any above ground floor extension shall be a distance of not less than 2 metres from any party boundary.

4.

- (a) Where the rear wall of the house does not include a gable, the height of the walls of any such extension shall not exceed the height of the rear wall of the house.
- (b) Where the rear wall of the house includes a gable, the height of the walls of any such extension shall not exceed the height of the side walls of the house.
- (c) The height of the highest part of the roof of any such extension shall not exceed, in the case of a flat roofed extension, the height of the eaves or parapet, as may be appropriate, or, in any other case, shall not exceed the height of the highest part of the roof of the dwelling.
- 5. The construction or erection of any such extension to the rear of the house shall not reduce the area of private open space, reserved exclusively for the use of the occupants of the house, to the rear of the house to less than 25 square metres.

6.

- (a) Any window proposed at ground level in any such extension shall not be less than 1 metre from the boundary it faces.
- (b) Any window proposed above ground level in any such extension shall not be less than 11 metres from the boundary it faces.
- (c) Where the house is detached and the floor area of the extension above ground level exceeds 12 square metres, any window proposed at above ground level shall not be less than 11 metres from the boundary it faces.
- 7. The roof of any extension shall not be used as a balcony or roof garden.




Figure 3: Proposed floor plan including rear extension (marked Kitchen/Dining)

7. Evaluation

Question: Whether the proposed works (as listed) to the existing dwelling is development and if so, are they exempted development?

In considering the proposed works against the definitions of 'development' and 'works' as provided in the Act, it is the view of the Planning Authority that the proposed works are deemed as development as it includes refurbishments and extension to the existing dwelling.

Question: Is this proposal considered Exempted Development?

Based on the information submitted and the provisions of *Schedule 2 – Exempted Development, Part I - Development Within the Curtilage of a House, Class 1* of the *Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended)*, the following is considered:

- 1.
- (a) Where the house has not been extended previously, the floor area of any such extension shall not exceed 40 square metres.

The house has not been previously extended, and the gross floor area of the proposed extension is $22.1 m^2$.

- (b) Subject to paragraph (a), where the house is terraced or semi-detached, the floor area of any extension above ground level shall not exceed 12 square metres.

- (c) Subject to paragraph (a), where the house is detached, the floor area of any extension above ground level shall not exceed 20 square metres.

(a) Where the house has been extended previously, the floor area of any such extension, taken together with the floor area of any previous extension or extensions constructed or erected after 1 October 1964, including those for which planning permission has been obtained, shall not exceed 40 square metres.

The gross floor area of the extension is less than 40m². There is no evidence of previous

- Where the rear wall of the house does not include a gable, the height of the walls of any such (a) extension shall not exceed the height of the rear wall of the house. N/A
- Where the rear wall of the house includes a gable, the height of the walls of any such extension (b) shall not exceed the height of the side walls of the house. N/A.
- The height of the highest part of the roof of any such extension shall not exceed, in the case of (c) a flat roofed extension, the height of the eaves or parapet, as may be appropriate, or, in any other case, shall not exceed the height of the highest part of the roof of the dwelling. The height of the proposed extension does not exceed the height of the highest part of the roof of the existing dwelling.
- 5. The construction or erection of any such extension to the rear of the house shall not reduce the area of private open space, reserved exclusively for the use of the occupants of the house, to the rear of the house to less than 25 square metres. The area of remaining private open space to the rear of the dwelling will exceed 25m².

6.

Any window proposed at ground level in any such extension shall not be less than 1 metre from (a) the boundary it faces.

All windows are located greater than 1m from the boundary they face.

- (b) Any window proposed above ground level in any such extension shall not be less than 11 metres from the boundary it faces.N/A.
- (c) Where the house is detached and the floor area of the extension above ground level exceeds 12 square metres, any window proposed at above ground level shall not be less than 11 metres from the boundary it faces.

- 7. The roof of any extension shall not be used as a balcony or roof garden. There is no balcony or roof garden proposed.

From the information submitted, the Planning Authority are satisfied that the proposed extension meets the conditions and limitations attached to Class 1.

8. Appropriate Assessment

The subject site is located 3.3Km from the River Barrow and River Nore SAC 002162. Having regard to the nature of the proposed development which comprises a single-storey extension to the rear of an existing dwelling at Killeigh, Co Offaly R35 YF58 and due to a lack of any pathway to a European site it is considered that the proposed development would not be likely to have a significant effect individually, or in-combination with other plans and projects, on the Natura 2000 network and appropriate assessment is not therefore required.

9. EIA Screening

The proposed development does not fall within a class of development set out in Part 1 or Part 2 of Schedule 5 of the *Planning and Development Regulations 2001, as amended* and therefore is not subject to EIA requirements.

10. Other Screening:

The proposed development is not contrary to the RSES and so it was not referred to the Eastern and Midland Regional Assembly.

11. Conclusion

Having assessed the information received, it is considered the proposed rear extension to the existing house is development and is exempted development.
