Forward Planning Residential Zoned Land Tax (RZLT)

Landowners who made submissions requesting their lands be removed from 2025 annual draft RZLT maps were notified of local authority decisions in advance of July 1st as required by legislation. A total of three sites are to be removed from RZLT maps following consideration of criteria contained in Section 653B Taxes Consolidation Act 1997 (as amended).

Just Transition

Offaly County Council signed a Strategic Partnership Agreement with Failte Ireland in November 2023. On foot of this, OCC submitted by the closing date of 29th February 2024, applications under the Failte Ireland Schemes C and D – State Agency and Local Authority Strategic Partnerships – EU Just Transition Fund Regenerative Tourism and Placemaking Scheme (2023-2026) under the EU Just Transition Fund(EUJTF) 2021-2027. On **19th June 2024**, Failte Ireland announced the results of these applications. Offaly County Council were successful as follows:

Shannonbridge Plaza to Callows €218,000

This project is for the development of a sustainable visitor experience in the heart of Shannonbridge in County Offaly. The focus of the project is on the planning and design of a 'plaza' / public amenity area off the Main Street which will lead down to the Shannon Callows, and the planned Dublin – Galway Greenway, together with the feasibility planning and design of a floating walkway over the Callows. This project will also seek to locate the plaza area and any potential for parking thereon, within the wider context of parking requirements within the village itself.

Birr Destination Town – Paving at William Street €188,000

This project has the objective of enhancing the visitor experience in the Town Centre of Birr, Co. Offaly. This will be done by the improvement of pedestrian connections to visitor amenities and attractions. ('Walkable Urbanism')

The paving element consists of the provision of high-quality granite pedestrian paving to improve access to Birr Castle Demesne along its boundary at William Street. The path will be significantly widened as part of this development, which will also serve to slow vehicular traffic. This serves to enhance the already significant works which have been undertaken in the vicinity of Birr Castle, including the new visitor entrance and improvements to the access roads to the castle such as in Green Street.

Heritage Team – April to June 2024

The Offaly Heritage Forum met in May in the County Archives Building in Axis Business Park.

Offaly County Council projects World Heritage Site – Astronomical Observatories of Ireland - UNESCO project

The Council continues to support the work of the Astronomical Observatories of Ireland (Birr, Dunsink and Armagh) to progress their application to proceed to the Tentative List for Irish sites to be considered for World Heritage Site status. Attended two key meetings in Birr on 23 April and Armagh on 24 June.

Clonmacnoise Master Plan

This project commissioned by the OPW and Failte Ireland a year ago by Denis Byrne Architects has been signed off by the OPW and in June €7.8 million euros has been announced under the Failte Ireland EU Just Transition Fund Regenerative Tourism and Placemaking Scheme (2023-2026) to upgrade the visitor experience at Clonmacnoise.

Biodiversity

Offaly Biodiversity Action Plan 2025 - 2030 The pre-draft public consultation ended on April 24th with 30 submissions received. The Biodiversity Working Group met on May 1st to consider all public submissions and suggested actions. An internal OCC think-in on May 20th was held to engage with colleagues across relevant sections of OCC. The draft plan is currently progressing and will be discussed at the Biodiversity Working Group meeting on June 10th with next steps scheduled also.

Local Biodiversity Action Funding

The National Parks and Wildlife Service has agreed funding for 12 projects with a total contribution of over €90,000 funding awarded. Funding has been approved for the projects listed below.

Creative Ireland

Oversight for the Offaly Creative Ireland programme which has a budget of c. €200,000 and a cross-department team in the Council. A range of community projects which incorporate aspects of heritage are underway having received funding offers. Cruinniu na nOg is a substantial day focused on Creativity for Children which was delivered by the library service on Saturday 15 June.

Tidy Towns Support Programme

Worked with Community Section to host a talk for the Tidy Towns Network by judge Christy Boylan providing insights into how the judge's judge!

Built Heritage

Historic Towns Initiative funding of €80,000 -Heritage Council - Birr Courthouse

Work on the cross-directorate Council team to progress the Part VIII planning process with consultants Howley Hayes Cooney. Liaising With Birr 2020 Vision Working group that proposed the Creative Court concept.

Offaly's Built Heritage Show

The two-day show was hosted on Oxmantown Mall in Birr and featured talks in Birr Theatre and skills demonstrations on the Mall, in addition to a range of Children's workshops.



Held on the weekend of 15 &16 June. led by the Irish Georgian Society, it received funding and assistance from Offaly County Council through the Heritage Stewardship grant from the Heritage Council. Rachel McKenna, senior executive architect led the liaison with support from the Municipal District and the heritage team for promotion and awareness.




Lime Mortar for Homeowners of Vernacular Buildings

The Bibliography of books and articles by John Feehan was launched in Birr on 10 May – supported by Offaly County Council – documenting the most extraordinary range and number publications.

REGENERATION

Rural Regeneration Development Fund Edenderry Phase III

The Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, announced on 13th May, a grant of €12.2m for the Edenderry Regeneration Project -Phase 3. This grant, awarded under the Rural Regeneration Development Fund, will allow for the redevelopment of 33/34 JKL Street, the former Tesco Supermarket site into a new Town Centre development of a newly consisting constructed Community Library and Arts Space with outdoor programming areas. The development also includes a new pedestrian and cycle connection from JKL Street to Blundell Avenue and to the greater Blundell Area, site boundary treatment and enabling works and public realm improvements including biodiversity landscaping, accessible parking, resting area and an urban plaza.

This grant requires match funding of 20% from Offaly County Council's resources of €3m which Offaly County Council has committed to. The total project cost is €15.2m.



Banagher Marina & Environs Masterplan Launch

Cathaoirleach of Offaly County Council, Eddie Fitzpatrick officially launched the Banagher Marina & Environs Masterplan at Crank House, Banagher on Friday 12th April 2024.

The Marina Master Plan was funded through the Department of Rural and Community Development under the Rural Development Regeneration Fund in partnership with Offaly County Council and sets out a vision to enhance the marina to improve the built fabric, waterway access and green infrastructure. The plan will act as a catalyst to drive future regeneration projects to sustain tourism and improve the social and economic development of Banagher.

Kilmalogue and Daingean were both awarded €10,000 each under the Town Centre First Town Team Support Fund Measure 1. These funds will be used to establish Town Teams and to support town research and data collection which will help identify the key priorities for these towns and assess the vitality, resilience and performance of the town centres which will help to develop high quality project applications for available funding schemes in the future.

TVR 2022 Project Development Measure - Daingean Town Hall

Consultants Howley Hayes Cooney presented the final draft of the conservation masterplan at a stakeholder meeting which included Daingean Development Group, elected members and Regeneration staff on Thursday 30th May.

Shinrone Library Public Engagement Event

A public engagement event was held in the former Shinrone Library building on 15th May 2024. The aim of the event was to give members of the public an opportunity to see the building and for Council staff to gather local input at an early stage in the process thereby ensuring that local knowledge informs the end uses and opportunities for the property over the coming years.



For those unable to attend the in-person event, an online consultation option was available. The event proved very worthwhile with over 30 members of the public attending and some great suggestions as to what the building might be used for following refurbishment.

Outdoor Recreational Infrastructure Scheme

Derryounce 10 Year Plan Launch

The Derryounce 10 Year Plan was launched by Cathaoirleach of Offaly County Council, Cllr. Eddie Fitzpatrick on 20th May in Portarlington Golf Club. This plan is



supported and funded by the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS) 2021, under the Department of Rural and Community Development and will, in time have an extremely positive impact in the area from an economic, social and environmental perspective.

Community Centre Investment Fund Grants to upgrade existing Community Centres

The Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD,

announced on 14th June a capital fund of €20m under CCIF 2024 Refurbishment Grant which will provide funding of up to €100,000 to upgrade existing community centres in both urban and rural areas.

A wide range of works eligible for funding including Refurbishment of Kitchens & Toilets, Upgrades to Windows & Doors, Energy Efficiency Upgrades & Improving access for people with disabilities. Funding will be available under 2 Categories, with grants of between €10k and €100K available:

Category 1: Small scale projects/improvements to facilities €10,000 to €25,000

Category 2: Larger scale projects - €25,001 to €100,000

A minimum of 5% match funding is required for Category 1 and 10% for Category 2. All applicants must register as users on the online portal in advance of the application process which will open on 29th July 2024. The closing date for applications is 29th August 2024.

Fáilte Ireland Regenerative Tourism and Placemaking Scheme

Over €406,000 funding was awarded in June to Offaly County Council through Fáilte Ireland Regenerative Tourism and Placemaking Scheme, part of the EU Just Transition Fund. This funding will assist in the development of two projects including the development of a sustainable visitor experience in the heart of Shannonbridge, the gateway to Clonmacnoise, and showcase that Birr is a centre for tourism through the enhancement of existing attractions and by the strengthening of connectivity between attractions.

This first round of approved investment grants for projects under the EU Just Transition Fund, also included €7.8m for the Redevelopment of the visitor centre at Clonmacnoise, including refurbishment and extension of buildings to enhance the experience for visitors. €3.6million was announced towards the creation of up to 79km of new walking and cycling trails, across suitable parts of the Bord na Móna landbank including large parts of lands in East & West Offaly.

Public Consultation for Grand Canal Harbour Masterplan

The Tullamore Grand Canal Harbour Masterplan is available inspection in the offices of Offaly County Council, Áras an Chontae, Tullamore Municipal District, Tullamore Library during normal office hours from 13th of June 2024 to 11th July 2024. A successful open day was held in Tullamore Library on 20th June.

The Tullamore Grand Canal Harbour Masterplan, jointly commissioned by Waterways Ireland and Offaly County Council, has provided the prism through which future transformation and regeneration of the harbour area can be envisioned. Grafton Architects as the appointed consultancy team, have culminated their assessment of the study area in a Masterplan that reimagines the harbour area through a catalogue scaled development opportunities. of The Masterplan study area also includes the Grand Canal Harbour and adjacent lands, the Canal Spur Line enabling access into the harbour basin, and Young's Store - a three-storey former warehouse with an approximate floor area of 275 square metres fronting the canal along Convent Road.

Retrofit Programme

In deciding on a works programme, local authorities are urged to choose a mix of properties across a range of BERs to allow for homes which need significant expenditure to be balanced out by those needing lesser spend so as to achieve the overall average cost of €34,000 per property. A BER rating of B2 must be achieved.

Community Development Programme

- Estate Management Funding for Birr, Edenderry and Tullamore Municipal Districts have been agreed at Municipal District meetings. Works will be scheduled to commence for all approved works.
- Housing Liaison Officers are continuing to support established resident committees and engaging with other groups and communities in an effort to establish them and thereby support the development of their community.
- Housing staff will provide Games on the Green in a number of local authority estates scheduled to take place in July in collaboration with Offaly Sports Partnership,

Community Culture and Emergency Services

Local Enhancement Programme 2024

On the 22nd May 2024 the Minister for and Community Development, Rural Heather Humphreys TD, and Minister of State with responsibility for Community Development and Charities, Joe O'Brien TD, announced the 113 successful projects in Co. Offaly under the main programme of the Local Enhancement Programme (LEP) 2024. An additional announcement was made on 5th June 2024 by the Minister in respect of the 14 successful Women's Groups in Offaly who were awarded €27,099.89 under the same Programme. The successful projects can be viewed on the www.offaly.ie website.

The Local Enhancement Programme 2024 provides vital support to community groups to help them improve their facilities. It supports small-scale funding for projects which range from purchasing equipment to minor renovations to buildings. These investments allow community groups to carry out the invaluable work they do on behalf of others in local areas throughout the country.

Community Recognition Fund (CRF)

Offaly was allocated €1,002,543 under the scheme specifically targeted at capital projects that are located in communities, towns and villages that are hosting the Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection and/or International Protection Applicants ('new arrivals') including towns identified for the rapid build homes programme. The scheme aims to promote the development of facilities that will be used in the future by all members of the community. A meeting of the LCDC Evaluation Committee was held on 28th May 2024 to assess the 31 submissions which were received and to decide which projects to recommend for approval to the Department. The Department of Rural and Community Development will consider the recommendations from the LCDC in detail over the coming months and will advise the LCDC which projects may proceed to the next stage. The final window for submission of projects under the CRF 2024 will be in January 2025. Details will be provided through Offaly PPN, the Council website and social media. All projects are due to be completed by November 2026.

Age Friendly Strategy 2024-2029



The Offaly Age Friendly Strategy 2024-2029 was adopted by

Offaly County Council at its meeting in Cloneyhurke on the 20th of May 2024. The Strategy sets out the ambition and goals of the Offaly Age Friendly Programme over the next 6 years. It should be seen as a continuation and enhancement of the goals and targets outlined in the previous strategy.

The overarching goal of the strategy is that Offaly should be a good place in which to grow old. The actions contained in the strategy seek to ensure that the supports and services required are properly coordinated and that the needs and requirements of older people are met. The voice of our older citizens is articulated in the surveys and consultation which were conducted during 2022 and 2023 and which are visible in the World Health Organisation themes and priorities such as housing, transport, communication, health and outer spaces. The Offaly Age Friendly Alliance, which is comprised of key stakeholders including the Older Peoples Council, the HSE, LOETB, the Gardai and Offaly Local Development Company, will monitor implementation of the actions contained in the strategy over the coming years.

National Older People's Council Convention Kilkenny 2024

Our Age Friendly team attended the NOPC Convention in Kilkenny on the 9th & 10th of May 2024. This year's theme was 'Ageing with Independence'. The National Older Peoples Council Convention brings together the Older People's Councils from all across Ireland giving an opportunity to discuss topics, network and learn from each other. The benefit of the Convention is to contribute to the work of the Older People's Council.

There were many information stands for people to visit, from Healthy Age Friendly Homes, An Garda Siochána, Kilkenny Fire and Rescue Service, Acorn, Alone, to name but a few.

The event, attended by Minister Mary Butler, TD, Minister of State for Mental Health and Older People at the Department of Health, the Older People's Councils and 31 local authority representatives, featured discussions from panel speakers including:

- Áine Flynn, Director of the Decision Support Service
- Mark Harrington, National Manager, Healthy Age Friendly Homes.
- Garret Doocey, Assistant Secretary from the Department of Transport responsibility with for Land Transport, Investment and Public Transport Policy will be discussing transport supports such as the travel assistance scheme, JAM card, Wayfinding centre and accessibility improvements to bus shelters, buses, age-friendly car parking and Age Friendly train stations.
- Philip Hogan, CEO of Cliffrun Media, a Dublin-based technology company specialising in technology solutions for older individuals such as the ACORN Age-Friendly Smart Tablet, will be demonstrating technology that supports ageing.
- Diarmuid Angland, a Department of Finance specialist, who is leading the development of a National Payments Strategy, will outline the meaning of digital inclusion and the implications of a cashless society.

'Memories of Charleville Castle' – Felting Project

A variety of community groups in Offaly recently joined forces to commemorate Bealtaine with a craft felting project that went on display at Tullamore and Kilcormac Libraries. This collaborative initiative brought together eleven ladies from the Offaly community, including Chair and Vice Chair of Offaly OPC, Molly Buckley and Frances Kawala, to reminisce about their cherished memories of Charleville Castle, culminating in a display of their creative expressions for the wider community to enjoy.

Under the expert guidance of LOETB tutor Pauline McNelis, the participants embarked on a six-week journey down memory lane. Through sharing and reflection, they unearthed a treasure trove of anecdotes, recollections, and heartfelt moments associated with Charleville Castle. These memories were immortalised through the art of felting.

Tullamore Age Friendly Train Station

In 2023, MacDonagh Station, Kilkenny won the Transport Award at the Age Friendly Ireland Annual Awards in Wexford. MacDonagh Station became Ireland's first Age Friendly Train Station after undergoing the World Health Organisation's four stage process to be recognised as Age Friendly. Ultimately Iarnród Éireann intends that all of its stations achieve the same WHO Age Friendly status.

Building on the success of MacDonagh Station, Tullamore Station is one of ten stations that Iarnród Éireann have initially identified across the Irish Rail network to concentrate on, with a view to also being recognised as Age Friendly. Our Age Friendly team met with members of larnród Éireann in early June 2024 for an initial site visit. Watch this space for further updates!

Public Participation Network

The month of May was a very eventful month for the PPN



with lots of activities taking place including:

Participation in the Offaly Laois PPN's Biodiversity Dusk Walk at Derryounce Lakes with Ricky Whelan. It was a great evening of learning and networking with members from both Offaly & Laois PPN in attendance.





Offaly PPN also Participated in Offaly Sports Partnership Bike Week attending the Women's Spin event in Ferbane. Preparation is underway in the compilation of a Brochure for Disability Awareness Week coordinated by the PPN June $10^{th} - 14^{th}$ 2024. This is an awareness raising piece of work that takes place annually with services and supports opening their doors to the general public.

As a precursor to Disability Awareness Week, a disco took place on May 20th 2024 for young people with disabilities in conjunction with ODEN, OLDC, Tullamore Community Gardai and Tullamore Credit Union.



Offaly PPN partnered with Offaly Older Persons Network, Offaly Age Friendly, LOETB, Offaly Libraries and OLDC to deliver a creative arts piece which culminated in the Project exhibition launch taking place in Tullamore library on May 21st. A lovely evening showcasing the work of the participants and their feltwork pieces were on display. There are plans to move the exhibit to other library spaces too.



Other activities this month included participation in Offaly Volunteering Week, attendance at the Killeigh Community Centre Open Day and the Biodiversity event with Bracknagh Heritage.





To end the month, we held the launch of the PPN Community Energy Charter, a first in the country with lots of interest from across the country in utilizing this model.



This was a collaborative piece of work,



where Offalv PPN sourced Leader funding to produce the Charter. Offaly Green were successful in their tender and carried out work the on the Charter.



Members of the Collaboration include PPN membership, Offaly CoCo, Climate Action Team, Offaly LCDC and OLDC. Speakers on the day included Ann Dillon Offaly CoCo Director of Services; Brian Flynn Community Voluntary Worker with An Síolán in the Ferbane Area and John Aston ELSA Earning Local Support for Energy Projects.

Environmentalist Éanna Ni Lamhna launched the Community Energy Charter which was attended by a broad spectrum of people from Offaly and further afield.

The Launch took place in Esker Arts Centre, the perfect location with excellent support from Sean and the team to ensure the



venue, sound and lighting were at their optimum.

A call out went to Artists Nationwide to depict the theme Energy. This artistic display was very effective as the rolling backdrop.





On May 3rd 2024 Offaly Comhairle na nÓg joined with JIGSAW - as part of

JIGSAW's National Fundraising Campaign; **Colour Climb** - for a sunset hike on Friday the 3rd of May in the Slieve Blooms starting at Kinnitty Castle.



Members meetings were held, and the group developed a proposal to develop Book Clubs in branches of Offaly Libraries. Members believe that having **Book Clubs** in local libraries throughout the county, specifically for teens, could have a positive impact on the mental health of teenagers in Offaly. Their proposal was circulated to Offaly Library Branches explaining their rationale, practicalities of how to run the clubs, event ideas and promotional ideas.

May began with the welcome news that the 2023 annual programme and Healthy Ireland



Coordinator salary returns were paid by Pobal on receipt of all queries answered in relation to both 2023 annual returns being completed in April.

This funding will allow an ambitious programme of work for 2024 to be delivered. All actions for 2024 have now commenced with a progress update due to be provided by partners at the Healthy Offaly Subcommittee June Quarterly meeting. Just a reminder on the projects being delivered this year.

- 'Minding Me' is a twelve-week exercise and health education programme for over 65's hosted and delivered by Tullamore Library and their partners Edufit. The budget assigned is €4,982.65.
- The 'Cycling without Age' project in Lough Boora Discovery Park will provide an online booking system for rickshaw bicycle and to purchase second bicycle and storage shed for use by volunteers to bring those older or infirmed into areas of the park that would previously have been inaccessible to them. €27,952.20 has been set aside for this venture.
- 3. 'Active Aging for Kilcormac' is an initiative provided by Kilcormac Development Association and Crinkle Sports & Recreation Centre to provide a series of weekly Boccia, Pickleball, Activator Poles classes for older adults to increase

physical activity levels and enhance wellbeing. Light refreshments are provided after each session to encourage participation. The cost of this action is €9,600.

- 4. 'Creative Dance and Movement Edenderry' seeks to increase physical activity levels among its participants by providing free dance and movement workshops and classes for children, young people and adults in the local community. The budget is €20,000.
- 'Exercise your way to wellness' is a joint initiative between Edenderry GAA and Exwell Medical to provide group exercise classes to increase physical activity and lower obesity levels among chronic illness sufferers in the Edenderry area. The cost of this action is €19,050.
- 6. The 'Drop & Move' project aims to increase the percentage of adults meeting their recommended levels of physical activity (150 minutes per week). OSP have selected 10 locations in the County where adults are already congregating in the community e.g. GAA youth training, village halls etc. and providing а physical activity programme for them. Drop & Move was piloted last year and returns for a second year.
- 7. The 'Traveller Men's Football Team' action was set up last year to improve the physical and mental health status of male Travellers in Co. Offaly. The project returns for a second year. Traveller men's interest in football is the medium through which this will be achieved. The associated budget is €20,000.

- 8. The 'Children's Afterschool Physical Activity Programme' seeks to increase the percentage of children meeting the recommended physical activity guidelines (60 minutes per day). This is also a 2023 action which has returned for 2024. It will be run as a 12-week programme, consisting of 1 hour session x 3 days per week for 7 10 and 11 13-year-olds, respectively. The budget assigned is €9,000.
- 9. The 'Invest in Yourself' programme will offer an opportunity for people with clinical lifelong conditions from the area referred by the GP, to avail of a supervised exercise class, twice a week for 6 months for 30 people. Clara C&FRC have engaged the services and expertise, of EXwell Medical, who have a track record of providing appropriate community-based rehabilitation programs. The budget assigned is €17,400. 'Invest in yourself' was piloted last year and returns due to increased demand.
- 10. Healthy Offaly have partnered with Offaly Athletics to provide financial support for the Healthy Offaly 5K Road Race Series 2024. This support will encourage 'couch to 5k' and 'fit for life' runners to take up and maintain running to increase physical activity levels. The series has a huge reach with over 300 participants at each of the eight races.
- 'Activator Poles for Portarlington' is

 a joint initiative between Healthy
 Offaly and Healthy Laois to provide
 24 pairs of walking poles and kit
 bags to Portarlington Library to add
 to the lending offering. This will

facilitate older adults in particular to 'get out and active' by borrowing the poles from their local library.

June

The month of June has been a very busy one for Healthy Offaly. All actions are progressing well with updates provided from all partners at the Healthy Offaly quarterly subcommittee meeting on 18 June 2024. The quarterly meeting <u>report</u> has been updated with summarised reports from the implementing partners.

The Healthy Ireland Coordinator visited six of the eleven funded actions with further visits planned to the remaining actions in the coming weeks. Participants, Tutors, and project administrators were consulted on how the action was progressing and if there were any issues that needed to be resolved.



At the Healthy Offaly Subcommittee, a literacy awareness presentation was delivered by Tamara Latham from Laois Offaly Education and Training Committee (LOETB). Implementing partners such as the Football Association of Ireland and Clara Community & Family Resource Centre are currently working with LOETB to increase literacy awareness and to develop skills to deal with an unmet literacy needs.

Healthy Offaly are at present are working with LOETB and a coalition of other partners to deliver a Community and Family Fun Day in St. Columba's Place Housing Estate, Clonminch, Tullamore in mid-August. The purpose of the event is to connect with the community through a series of Health and wellbeing initiatives in a fun and interactive manner to residents of the estate and neighbouring estates.

Organisations such as Offaly Local Development Company, the HSE, Tullamore Family Resource Centre etc. are working alongside LOETB and Healthy Offaly to discuss services each provide with local residents and to engage in a more impactful manner with the communities they strive to serve.

Healthy Offaly have engaged the services of Crinkle Sports and Recreation Centre to provide games and activities for young and not so young that will incorporate a numeracy dimension for all participants.



Africa Day 2024

Offaly Sports Partnership hosted its third annual Africa Day event in the Tullamore Harriers for over 300 participants from seven counties and nine schools. Over 100 participants were children of African descent



Bike Week 2024

A range of events were delivered as part of national Bike Week including club events in Daingean, Ferbane Tullamore; and the and running of the second annual Grand Canal Greenway Cycle from Edenderry to Ferbane. 65 participants took part in the club events; while 150 took part in the Grand Canal Greenway Relay. Tullamore Cycling Club also hosted stage 1 of the Rás Tailteann 2024





Urban Outdoor Adventure Project

Tullamore - seven further schools' splash and dash days, two community splash and dash sessions and the first of five summer camps were delivered. Additionally, canoe polo, open boating and kayak programmes for people with additional needs were also delivered. To date 650 participants have been reached with the available programmes

On Saturday, 6th April, Storm Kathleen led to the postponement of some events at Lough Boora Sculpture Park. These events will now take place on **Saturday 22nd June** at Lough Boora Sculpture Park, facilitated by the Arts Office with support from Esker Arts and Bord na Móna.



The day commenced with Soil Portraits led by Dr. Eileen Hutton, artist and lecturer at The Burren College of Art. On this guided walk and talk, visual artist Eileen Hutton discussed the temporary installation of soil chromatography 'trail markers' located along sections of the Sculpture Trail in Lough Boora. The workshops offered an immersive way to approach the unique landscape of Lough Boora.



Another event, 'La na Móna,' was a curated theatrical experience by Rita Duffy and Nuala Hayes, a performer and storyteller, who offered a whimsical journey through Lough Boora Sculpture Park, with much diversion, entertainment, and inspiration for participants. This surreal and multisensory adventure in the rejuvenated natural setting featured surprise guests including renowned whistle player Séan Ryan, storyteller Michael Creagh and Druid/Seanchai Eimear Burke. Séan Craven and Seamus Barnes brought the past to life with their recounting of the working lives of Bord na Móna workers, whilst actors from local drama group TADS brought fictional characters, inspired by the surroundings to life, to the delight of the audience present.

submitted. The shortlisting, workshops and interviews for the FilmOffaly Short Film Award 2024 took place in May and June and the winner has been notified. Announcement of the winner will hopefully be made in July following signing of contracts.

FilmOffaly Resource Development Project Film Offaly was successful in a recent application to the Just Transition fund receiving funding of €252,985 for a twoyear programme. The new initiative which will be a huge boost for film in Offaly over the coming years. As part of the approved funding the two-year fixed term post of Film Officer has been advertised by Offaly County Council in June – closing date is for 18th July 2024.

Funding Opportunities The 2024 Youth Arts Commissions

Two projects have been undertaken having received arts office funding: Emma Barone's visual art project, 'Creative Spaces Art Programme – Empowering Youth Through Creativity' with at-risk young people in the Birr area. Music Generation Offaly's Songwriting Project in collaboration with Tolü Makay centres around vocal health, songwriting, and recording.



Culture Night 20th September 2024

The Culture Night and Hullabaloo coordinator roles have been filled and we are delighted to welcome Emma Hanley as co-ordinator for both programmes in 2024. Two opportunities were open to the public:

Professional Artists proposals for an artist commission – a project and presentation as part of the 2024 Culture Night Offaly programme. This year sees a new focus on young people, sustainability and diversity with strands developed for projects under these criteria.



And for **Communities and Venues** - Offaly County Council's Culture Night Event Fund which supports the cost of events programmed for Culture Night 2024. **Both awards deadlines are now closed and the programme is under development.**

Hullabaloo! Offaly's Children's Arts Festival

Planning for the 2024 festival is underway with delivery partners Birr Theatre & Arts Centre and Esker Arts, along with Offaly

Libraries and Clara Family Resource Centre and Creative Places Edenderry, working alongside the Arts Office and



programme coordinator Emma Hanley. The artists facilitator callout is also now closed with work now taking place on the development of the programme.

Creative Places Edenderry

Creative Places, Edenderry, a project funded by the Arts Council, led by Creative Lives in partnership with Offaly County Council Arts Office and Edenderry Municipal District, continues to host an array of different arts-based activities, workshops and events in a wide range of art forms including Visual Arts, Music, Poetry, Playwriting, Creative Movement; Dance; Ceramics; Drama; Radio, Photography.



Creative Places Edenderry ran an open call for artist commission proposals from local, national, and international professional artists. creatives or arts organizations/collectives that sought to collaborate artistically with individuals or groups in Edenderry on creative projects that would create an artistic impact for the people and place of the area had the opportunity to apply. 

Litter Management National Litter survey report

IBAL recently published (24th June) results from Survey 1 (of 2) and Tullamore has




improved since 2023 where they achieved 23rd place out of 40. The first survey of 2024 shows improvement to reach 19th place out of 40. This classifies Tullamore as *"Clean to European Norms"*. A positive comment was made regarding the action which OCC undertook in relation to the removal of bring banks at Daingean Road car park. However, it is planned to reinstall the bring bank in the coming months.

Background - Since 2002, Irish Business Against Litter has commissioned An Taisce to carry out litter surveys of our main towns and cities according to international standards. The towns and cities are then ranked in a league table format.

CCTV

Following the recent adoption of the CCTV Codes of Practice for litter and waste offences and the use of drones for illegal waste activities, as well as the guidance documents and templates issued by WERLA, the Environment Section has established an **Oversight Board**. This is the initial step in implementing CCTV and it is hoped that when all procedures are in place that the Section can successfully



install CCTV for littering and illegal dumping in litter black spots subject to funding.

Waste, Air and Noise Management Waste, air and noise complaints

Waste, Air and Noise Team received the following number of environmental complaints since 1st January 2024

- 13 noise complaints, all inspected –
 3 are closed, open cases will be resolved following further enforcement action.
- 7 Air Quality complaints, all were investigated and resolved, no further action required.


Noise Management

The Draft Noise Action Plan was completed in May 2024 and has been advertised in local newspapers, the Offaly County Council website and a hardcopy displayed for public access at the Municipal District offices in Edenderry, Tullamore and Birr. The Draft version was also translated into Irish and both versions uploaded to the Offaly County Council website. Prior to been sent out for public consultation the Draft NAP was also presented to the Councillors the Climate Action, Environment & Transport SPC meeting in May and any queries received were reviewed and acted on.

The Public consultation period ended on 5th July and any submissions will be reviewed and the



final draft will be completed and forwarded to the EPA prior to publishing.



Waste Management

Anti- Dumping initiative approved for 3 projects – value of €80,000.

- ADI Project 1 Project to address dumping in Chancery Close, in cooperating with Tullamore MD and Housing Estate Management.
- ADI Project 2 Mattress Amnesty to happen shortly at Birr Civic Amenity site,
- ADI project 3 CCTV at Bottlebanks, currently advancing extensive procedures and documentation to facilitate this project.

Deposit Return Scheme inspections commenced 1st June 2024 on the retail sites, generally all sites are complying, some bedding in issues with Return Scheme, reporting to WERLA for assistance.

Burial Grounds St. Mary's Cemetery, Edenderry

Works have commenced in June on the extension to the cemetery and should be substantially complete in August.



RURAL WATER SERVICES



Capital

Applications for capital funding from the Multi-Annual Rural Water Programme 2024 to 2026 were submitted to the Rural Water Unit, Dept of Housing, by 12/04/2024. Applications for a total of 36 projects were submitted, seeking funding to the value of €2,513,838.00. We are currently waiting for the announcement of funding from the Rural Water Unit.

Subsidy

We have received subsidy applications from 14 GWSs and the payments of these will be made by September.

Veterinary Control of Dogs

In the first half of the year we have cared for over 100 no. dogs in the dog shelter and on average 15% of the dogs are reclaimed by their owners, 15% are rehomed by the Care of Dogs Team and the other 70% are rehomed through animal rescue charities. The Control of Dogs team has also dealt with 47 no. complaints so far this year and has assisted AGS on a number of occasions.

Control of Horses

To date in 2024, we have dealt with 11 no. complaints, there have been no seizures to date.

TRANSPORTATION

Speed Limit Review and preparation for the introduction of new National Default Speed Limits

In line with Department of Transport Circulars RST-02-2024 and Circular RST-03-2024 we now must prepare to implement the new speed limit requirements across our Local Road Network. The initial review which has now commenced will only focus on the application of a 60km/hr default speed limit to all of our Local Roads and will be enacted by the Government in November 2024(tentative date). The full speed limit review requires the following changes.

- All Local Roads (Primary/Secondary and Tertiary) will have a default speed limit of 60km/hr.
- All Regional and National Secondary Roads will have a default of 80km/hr.
- Designated Urban Roads will have a Default Speed limit of 30km/hr.

The implementation of default speed limits for both the National Secondary road network and the Urban roads are tentatively scheduled for enactment in the first half of 2025.

Birr North Distributor Road

Contract Tender documentation has now been completed for the Birr North Distributor Road Project. Offaly County Council are now awaiting approval to issue these documents to the market place with the intention to commence construction in 2024.

Regional Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Strategy

Offaly County Council in our roles as the lead authority have completed the procurement and tender assessment stages for the appointment of a Specialist Consultant to formulate our Regional Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Strategy. Approval to proceed with the appointment which is 100% funded from Zero Emission Vehicles Ireland(ZEVI) has been received. The appointment process will be completed in July 2024 and the report delivery has an initial indicative 9-month timeline for delivery.

R400 Peat Roads Pilot Scheme

Contract Tender documentation has now been completed for the 2024 R400 Peat Road Pilot Scheme. Offaly County Council are now awaiting approval to issue these documents to the market place with the intention to commence construction in September of 2024.

Public Lighting Maintenance Contract

The procurement and tender assessment stage related to our updated Public Lighting Maintenance Contract has now been completed. The successful maintenance contractor will be appointed and in place by the end of July 2024.

The following is a breakdown of the Public Lighting failures across the County. There are **124** faults on the system presently. **27** of these faults require third party intervention and as such cannot be repaired by the maintenance contractor. These anomalies are being addressed by the yearly public lighting capital program.

Therefore, the current actionable faults amount to **97** <u>faults or 1.04 %</u> of the lighting stock.

The breakdown of the **97** faults across each MD are as follows:

The number as shown above are most likely distorted by seasonal variations and in order to offset same a full visual fault survey of the lighting inventory will commence in July 2024.

PLEEP

Works on the physical installation of new LED lights under the PLEEP is now underway and as of the 28th of June 636 of the total 4989 lights currently included within the contract have now been upgraded to LED units.
