Forward Planning

Progress Report on the Implementation of County Development Plan

The CE's two-year Progress Report on the Implementation of Development Plan objectives was discussed at the November Council Meeting. This report provided an overview on the progress made in relation to headline objectives dealt with in the development plan since it came into effect on 22 October 2021.

OPR Review of Offaly County Council

The Review by the OPR was completed November 2023. Overall, the review found that Offaly County Council is delivering its planning functions on an effective basis with evidence of best practice in some respects. While the review notes that the Council must pay some attention to the resourcing of its planning function, in a general sense, the Office is left with the impression that the department is well organised with dedicated staff in place who are delivering a quality service for the public.

Just Transition

The Secretariat for Technical Assistance for Regions in Transition (START) and Offaly County Council agreed a Service Level Agreement and Workplan for the provision of 72 days of Technical Assistance to Offaly. Following on from a site visit by the START team in March 2023 and a review meeting in June, the first of two planned one day workshops took place on 13th September 2023. A second workshop took place on 27th November 2023 with a view to devising a mechanism which will support the development of a new partnership in vocational / tertiary education, training, and research to promote a local just transition. The final report from the START team is due by December 2023.

Local and Regional Economic Support Strategies Support Scheme

The above-mentioned scheme was launched on 13^{th} October 2023, to be administered by Pobal. This scheme will see the disbursement of $\notin 24m$ for projects aligned to Local Economic and Community Plans and the disbursement of $\notin 5m$ for projects aligned to Regional Enterprise Plans. The key dates are as follows:

- LA led LECP aligned project applications – closing date 8th
 December 2023. Offaly County Council will be applying for funding to support the objectives of the Local Economic and Community Plan and the Offaly Economic Development Strategy and Action Plan 2022-2027.
- Local Authority REP aligned project applications – closing date 8th December 2023.
- LECP aligned projects concept papers due **17th November 2023.**

Offaly County Council submitted 5 papers. Feedback is currently being received which will inform the full applications.

 LECP aligned projects – if successful at concept paper stage, closing date for full applications 23rd January 2023.

Failte Ireland

Offaly County Council and Failte Ireland Recently signed a Strategic Partnership Agreement which will facilitate:

- (a) The post of Tourism Activator. A three-year contract post in Offaly County Council which will be 100% funded by Failte Ireland. This person will engage directly with private tourism operators within the county. This post will be filled in early January 2024.
- (b) Offaly County Council will be invited to submit applications directly to Failte Ireland in respect of tourism projects in the county.



The Bovine Breathalyser developed by Agri Data Analytics is a non-invasive machine that measures enteric methane emissions from ruminants and was recognized for contributing to a more sustainable, better farming practice.

- Social Housing Assessments (SSHA) 2023 has been finalised having regard to all returns submitted to the Department.
- Information on the various pathways available to Tenants on valid Notice of Termination is available at <u>https://www.offaly.ie/c/housing/</u> on the Notice of Termination Information link.
- There are 522 on the Social Housing Support List at the end of November 2023.
- A further 606 active tenancies are currently being supported under the Housing Assistance Payments

(HAP) Scheme, 11 signed up for HAP and 27 exited from HAP in November.

 At the end of November, 30 single people and 18 couples and families were being supported in emergency accommodation.

Housing Stock – Number, Maintenance & Repair

- Total housing stock at end of November 2023 is 2,096.
- 395 maintenance calls were logged in November.

Housing Capital Programme Update

Housing Adaptation Grants for Older People and People

Housing are finalising Housing Adaption 2023 Grant claims to the Department. Housing are working with successful applicants to collate the required documentation in order that claims can be processed and claimed in the financial year.

Disabled Persons Grants 2023

Housing are working with contractors to progress works as far as possible to maximise the claim for 2023. The process of selecting applicants for the 2024 programme is underway, procurement of contractors and works are expected to commence in early 2024.

Retrofit Programme

In deciding on a works programme, local authorities are urged to choose a mix of properties across a range of BERs to allow for homes which need significant expenditure to be balanced out by those needing lesser spend so as to achieve the overall average cost of €34,000 per property. A BER rating of B2 must be achieved.

Arts Strategy 2024-2028



Following an open call and selection process the Arts Office consultant John

commissioned arts O'Brien to assist with the planning, consultation and writing of the new Arts Strategy 2024-2029. The new strategy will align with the newly adopted Arts Infrastructure Strategy 2023-2028. The development of the new strategy has developed through a phased approach of research, consultation and writing throughout 2023. The writing phase is now in draft stage and the report has been submitted for review by the Community and Culture SPC, with the aim to submit to the council early in 2024 for approval.

Lough Boora - Art in Landscape Project Funding

Planning for the Art in the Landscape Festival of Change, taking place in Offaly and Mayo in April 2024 is currently ongoing with calls to artists and communities being released before the end of the year. As part of the Art in Landscape: Festival of Change there will be an event called Tionól – a gathering of ideas; a creative space to share ideas and an opportunity for



participants to share their 'big' or 'small' ideas around Art in the Landscape. The purpose of the event is to share ideas and spark conversations locally. A call has been issued to anyone interested in, working in or volunteering in arts, heritage, culture, tourism, community development, the environment or economic development or a local community member living near Lough Boora Sculpture Park, to submit their ideas to share as part of the event. Ideas will be shortlisted based on having a mix of ideas from different sectors at the event. Selected presenters will have presentation slots of 10 minutes each.

FilmOffaly

The FilmOffaly Award 2023 has been awarded and the Arts Office are delighted to announce the winning script *A Simple Killing* by Mark Conway. This film will be produced in Offaly in 2024 by the production team, Jason Branagan, (Director) Mark de Carreau, (Actor, Producer) Emer Durcan (Producer) and Brian Durcan (Cinematographer) of Western Front Studios.

The successful team have expressed their delight of being awarded the funding. Award winning writer and director Jason Branagan said 'I'm delighted to be a part of the team bringing Mark Conway's script to life. 'A Simple Killing' is a taut thriller that gripped me from first read, and it's been a lot of fun working with Mark, Emer, Brian and Mark De Carreau in developing the film'.

Script writer Mark Conway explained how he got the team together as part of the application process for the award, 'After I watched the fantastic award-winning short Bruise, I knew I had to get Western Front Studios (Brian & Emer Durcan) involved with my short A Simple Killing for Film Offaly and was delighted when they came on board. They brought with them Mark De Carreau, an actor and producer who has worked on multiple shorts including the award-winning Calf and director Jason Branagan who's no stranger to short films and who has credits including Eastenders, Fair City and most recently the short Picture Day also with Western Front Studios. I just want to thank them all because without them none of this would have been possible'.

Offaly County Council Arts Office are delighted to be working with such a talented team under the production of Emer and Brian Durcan (Western Front Studios) and Mark de Carreau, producer, who said 'We are extremely grateful to Film Offaly for choosing us to produce this project. It's exciting that Mark Conway should get his first script produced and that we are the ones to do it. Under Jason's direction we are hoping to make a film that is worthy of Oscar selection.



FilmOffaly Review

The FilmOffaly Review undertaken by researchers; *Culture Works* across the Summer months has been completed. The report has been presented to the Community and Culture SPC , FilmOffaly board and the Management of Offaly County Council. Following these presentations recommendations and actions will form part of the new Arts Strategy 2024-2028.

Annual Programme Hullabaloo!

Offaly Children's Arts Festival was a much broader offering this year also, with the inclusion of Esker Arts as a partner in the festival this year. The programme was launched September with inclusion from artists from all over Ireland delivering workshops and performances in across a number of art forms for children up to 12 years of age. This was the 17th edition of Hullabaloo! and it was the largest festival to date with a record 101 events taking place across venues in four towns in Offaly from November 1st to November 4th showcasing an eclectic blend of artforms and experiences for children and their families to enjoy. In Birr, Clara, Edenderry and Tullamore there were 1,381 in attendance at the festival.

A broad offering of workshops including activities in crafting, visual arts, dance, circus, drama and mixed media. Families were treated to some stellar family performances including the renowned Whistle Blast Quartet who brought classic fairytales to life in a stunning classical music concert. Circus 250 brought environmental issues and sustainability to the forefront in two wonderfully subversive and interactive circus shows with leading Italian female clowns. A Little Door Theatre brought us a visually stunning theatre show about love, connection and belonging using shadow play, puppetry and story-telling. Equality and Inclusion was to the forefront of programming this year, with the addition of some bespoke workshop experiences in traditional Ukrainian crafts with Ukrainian artist Katerina Putintseva which proved to be highly popular with all audiences. Inclusive theatre-maker Jess Rowell, artist in residence at Draíocht Arts Centre created a workshop for children with additional needs. This sensory movement and music workshop was crafted for children with physical and intellectual disabilities.



Creative Places Edenderry







Creative Places, Edenderry, a project funded by the Arts Council, led by Creative Lives in partnership with Offaly County Arts Office and Edenderry Council Municipal District, has had a dynamic 2023! with an array of different arts-based activities, workshops and events throughout the year. These have included: Visual Arts, Music, Poetry, Playwriting, Screenwriting and Creative Writing; a Lego Clinic; Creative Movement; Dance; Ceramics; Drama; Radio, Photography and

more. Towards the end of the year, the project saw a more collaborative way of working emerge with different groups across the Community coming together to respond to the ethos of the project. For example, the ASD Friends for Life group, The Parkview Residents Association, The Rainbow Room - parents group at St. Patrick's Primary School, Edenderry Library and more. Creative Places, Edenderry funded six Creative Grants of €500 each in the and Community three Artist Commissions ranging from €4500 _ €12,000. Seonaid Murray, Creative Places Edenderry Co-ordinator has said 'I am most proud of the growth in confidence within the Community and witnessing the realisation that this really is an all-inclusive project where all Creative ideas are welcome and supported in a safe, positive environment.'

Edenderry Library and Arts Base

The Arts Office continues to work in close collaboration with the county librarian in the development of plans for a Multi-Purpose Arts space and Artist's Studio's to be incorporated into the planning of the new library for Edenderry, this include the audience and participant development as part of the Creative Places Edenderry project.

HEALTHY OFFALY



As year-end approaches work has significantly ramped up on all Healthy Offaly Round 4 year 1 actions. All Healthy Offaly

actions are due to be completed before 31st December with financial and progress reporting to be submitted to Pobal by 16th February 2024.

At the final quarterly Healthy Offaly Subcommittee meeting, a new 'one stop shop' progress report was launched. The report (click link to access) lists details on the composition of the Subcommittee, the genesis of Round 4 and most importantly, a progress report on the six actions currently being rolled out. All six implementing partners gave submitted updates for the progress reports which were discussed at the minute. The Healthy Ireland Coordinator gave a detailed briefing to the partners on what financial and progress information is required to be submitted at year end. booking project is also being finalised with Bord Na Mona to report in mid-December that a supplier has been identified to provide the booking service.

A deadline of 19th January 2024 has been set for all implementing partners to submit their invoices/bank statements/payslips and final project progress reports. In addition to proof of spends and action summaries a list of pre and post project participant questionnaires have been requested from the partners to be submitted to the Healthy Ireland Coordinator. From there the questionnaires will be analysed with Dr. Diane Cooper from Edufit and a report, on whether the goals set by our increasing physical activity and combatting obesity have been achieved, will be drafted. The report will be available for viewing in February 2024.

Science of Music event on Thursday, 9th November.



Local Authority Climate Action Plan

Offaly County Council have developed our draft Climate Action Plan 2024-2029 for

adoption before 23rd February 2024.As part of this process and in line with Section 16 of the Climate Action and Low Carbon Development (Amendment)



Act 2021, this

draft plan is currently on public display for consultation purposes.

The public consultation period runs from 24th October until 4.00pm, Wednesday 6th December 2023, and submissions or observations are welcomed in writing or by using our dedicated on-line portal available through the council website.

Community Climate Action Fund

The Community Climate Action Fund (CCAF) will be launched within Offaly on 13th December 2023, and remain open for application for 12 weeks, until 6th March 2024. The Community Climate Action Programme, under the Climate Action Fund, has been developed under two strands addressing both direct climate action, and climate education and capacity building.

Strand 1 has two parts: strand 1 entitled Building "Action: Low Carbon Communities" for €24 million, and strand 1a entitled "Shared Island Community Climate Action" for €3 million.

Strand 1: Action: Building Low Carbon Communities

€444,000 is being provided to Offaly Co. to work in partnership with Co. communities, large and small, rural and urban, within their areas of operation to build low carbon communities in a considered and structured way. The projects will address the following five themes:

- Home/energy
- Travel
- Food an waste •
- Shopping and recycling
- Local climate and environmental • action

Strand 1A: Shared Island Community Climate Action

In addition, a total of €3 million is being provided by the Government's Shared Island Fund to support cross-border and community climate action all-island initiatives as an integrated part of the Community Climate Action Programme. Strand 1a enables communities and LAs to propose a cross-border project in partnership with organisations in Northern Ireland. The themes are the same as strand 1.

Offaly County Council is hoping to receive applications to avail of the €444,000 allocated for community groups in Strand 1. Suitable projects will receive 100% funding and must be completed within 18 months of the signed grant agreement (between OCC and relevant community group). The Community Climate Action Officer will co-ordinate this fund within Offaly Co. Co. Expressions of interest will be through an on-line application form available on <u>www.Offaly.ie</u>

Energy

Offaly County Council Energy Action Team launched their "Energize Offaly" campaign aimed at raising awareness amongst staff and elected members of the work done to date to increase energy efficiency across the organization and promote further action to help achieve statutory targets.

Offaly County Council have again signed up to the SEAI "Reduce Your Use" for 2024, which aims to reduce unnecessary energy consumption across the public sector.



Environmental Management

From January to end of November, the Environment Section received 926 environmental complaints. All were investigated in a timely manner and resolved where possible.

Environment Complaints

Offaly County Councils website has been updated to include an online environmental complaint form. This means that it is easier for members of the public to register a complaint. Environments Complaints Handling procedure has also been amended.

Litter Management

Following the positive feedback from the area offices regarding the solar compaction litter bins, Environment applied for and was approved for funding for additional bins under the Anti-Dumping Initiative. This allowed the Council to increase the quantity of bins across the county to 15. The bins can hold up to 8 times more litter than a conventional litter bin and allow for more efficient streamlining of the Council's Street cleansing services. Bins were installed in the following locations:

 ✓ Heritage Centre, Ferbane & Emmet Square, Birr & Market Square, Birr & Clara Square

- ✓ Tullamore Millenium Plaza & St. Kyron Street & O'Connor Square
- Edenderry JKL Street. & Town Hall, Medical Hall & Main Street
- ✓ Mountbolus Park
- ✓ Harbour Road, Banagher
- ✓ Crinkle Village and Cloneygowan Village

An additional benefit is that the bins have advertising panels on each side, which allow for environmental messages and themes to be exhibited. Environment has taken the opportunity to promote the Council's Climate Strategy to raise awareness among the public. These panels can be changed to allow for any environmental theme to be advertised.



Environmental Awareness

The Environment Department participated in a pilot programme "Composting for Schools". Four schools who expressed an interest in composting were selected to work with Composting Ireland. The programme consisted of workshop training for teachers and community members, onsite training on how to compost, develop wormeries and manage organic waste within the school. The schools who are participating are: Scoil Naomh Mhuire, Cloneygowan, St. Mary's NS, Pullough, Scoil na Croise Naofa, Geashill and St. Josephs NS, Arden, Tullamore. So far, the feedback has been very positive, and it is hoped to extend this programme in the coming year to more schools.

Burial Grounds



St. Mary's Cemetery, Edenderry: We are currently in the process of tendering for the construction of the extension to St. Mary's

Cemetery Committee Grants: This year we have supported seventeen cemetery committees with grants for the upkeep and enhancement of their local cemeteries. The overall standard of work carried out by these volunteer groups continues to be very high and we will continue supporting these groups in 2024, and we look forward to working with new committees in 2024.

RURAL WATER SERVICES

Subsidies The GWS annual subsidy was paid to the 15 no. Private and Public Group Water Schemes, amounting to €1,072,067.00

Capital The Rural Water Unit of the Department of Housing have advised that the next Multi-Annual Rural Water Programme capital funding scheme will be announced imminently. Under the most recent programme over €2m of funding was secured for 24 separate projects ranging from public health measures to amalgamation of group water schemes.



Well Grants Grants are available from Offaly County Council to assist with the improvement of a water supply to an individual private dwelling (this means a water supply providing water intended for human consumption and domestic purposes that serves only one house).

The key features of the scheme are:

- The grant payable for rehabilitation works is 85% of approved costs subject to a maximum of €3,000.00, where the Local Authority agrees that this is the most appropriate solution.
- The grant payable for the provision of a new well is 85% of approved costs subject to a maximum of €5,000.00, where the Local Authority agrees that this is the most appropriate solution.
- The provision of a water quality treatment system (typically filtration and Ultra Violet treatment) qualifies for 100% funding up to a maximum of €1,000.00, where the Local Authority agrees that this is the

most appropriate solution. This can be claimed on its own or in addition to either the grant for rehabilitation works or the grant for a new well. This does not include water softeners in hard water areas.

• The minimum grant threshold is €750.00

Please note that this scheme does not apply to houses to which a Public Water Supply or a Group Water Scheme has already been provided or can reasonably be provided.

In the past 12 months we have assisted 15 households with grants under this scheme totalling €65,549.95.

Domestic Waste Water Treatment The DWWTS grant scheme will be amended from 01/01/2024, removing the requirement for the septic tank to be registered and also increasing the grant to 85% of allowable costs up to a maximum of €12,000.00

Grants for a Septic Tank or Domestic Waste Water Treatment System (DWWTS), to assist with the costs of remediation, repair or upgrading works to, or replacement of, such DWWTS are only available from a Local Authority where a septic tank has been inspected by the Local Authority or Local Authority Waters Programme Office (LAWPRO) under one of the following inspections regimes:

National Inspection Plan

 Prioritised Areas for Action, as outlined in the River Basin Management Plan, and remediation, repair or upgrading works or replacement of the DWWTS is recommend after inspection by the Local Authority. Where a dwelling is in a High Status Objective Catchment Area, and remediation, repair or upgrading works or replacement of the DWWTS are recommend after inspection by the Local Authority.

If persons have been recommended remediation, repair or upgrading works or replacement of your DWWTS as per above then they may be entitled to a grant towards the works required and the application form for the DWWTS grant will be provided to you by Offaly County Council.

Domestic Lead Remediation Grants

The Domestic Lead Remediation Grant Scheme has been in existence since 2016 and the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage have revised the eligibility criteria with effect from 1 December 2022.

Lead is a naturally occurring metal that was used for pipework and plumbing in some houses built up to, and including, the 1970s. However, exposure to lead in drinking water has been identified as a serious public health risk. The grant scheme was introduced in line with the Government's National Lead Strategy in order to reduce people's exposure to lead in drinking water.

The aim of the grant is to assist households with the cost of replacing lead pipes and fittings within the boundaries of the property. The grant is available if you receive a water supply from either a public or private water supplier.

According to the World Health Organisation, there is no completely safe level of lead in drinking water. The best and most effective way of dealing with lead in drinking water is to replace all lead pipes and all lead plumbing delivering drinking water to the house concerned.

The new eligibility conditions in the revised grant include:

- Removal of the means test requirement;
- Introduction of a uniform grant rate of 100% of the eligible costs of the replacement of any such lead pipes and/or related fittings, or €5,000, whichever is the lower;
- An additional eligible cost can be claimed to a maximum of €200 for the provision of a certificate from a laboratory or notification from a registered building professional, as outlined at (b) and (c) above and provided for in Regulation 5(1)(b)and 5(1)(c). This cost is to be included in the calculation of the maximum eligible cost total of €5,000. Note, any indirect costs incurred by the applicant themselves are not eligible costs;
- The house concerned must be occupied by the applicant as their normal place of residence;
- Minimum expenditure on eligible works in order to qualify for a grant has been increased from €200 to €750.

Veterinary

control of Dogs In the past 12 months we have cared for over 300 dogs in the Dog Shelter which is an approximately 10% increase on the previous 12 months. On average 15% of the dogs are reclaimed by their owners 15% are rehomed by the

by their owners, 15% are rehomed by the Care of Dogs Team and the other 70% are rehomed through animal rescue charities. The Control of Dogs team has also dealt with 72 since the start of the year and brought 2 successful prosecutions through the courts in 2023.

Control of Horses We have dealt with 21 complaints under Control of Horse legislation from January to August 2023, which resulted in the seizure of 11 horses and donkeys.

Veterinary Inspections Offaly County Council continues to operate the Shared Service Agreement for Veterinary Services

Electric Vehicle Fleet

The Roads and Infrastructure Department has taken delivery of 5 new Electric Vehicles which will be deployed in the coming weeks. The 5 new vehicles will play a significant role in Offaly County Council's migration towards service provision using Zero or Low Carbon Fleet. The arrival of these vehicles coupled with the commencement of the migration of the remaining fleet towards Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil in 2024 will on completion provide a Corporate Fleet Carbon reduction well in advance of 90%.

Edenderry Inner Relief Road

The main contractor is making good progress on the delivery of Stage 2 of the Edenderry Inner Relief Road. The works remain on schedule for a completion date of April 2024.

Grand Canal Greenway

Works on the remaining 3 contracts on the Grand Canal Greenway project are progressing on program. It is anticipated that the entire Grand Canal Greenway mainline scheme will be completed in Q1 2024. Funding to commence the links to the Greenway has been secured for 2024 with the Edenderry Harbor to the Greenway due for tender in Q1 of 2024. Approval has also been secured for the

in the Westmeath County Council administrative area.

Ballycommon Trailhead scheme to proceed to tender and it is anticipated that this will be constructed in 2024 subject to funding approval. It is also planned to commence and progress a feasibility study with regards to continuing a link from Shannon Harbour to Banagher in order to terminate the scheme within an urban setting.

Speed Limit Review

Following engagement with Transport Infrastructure Ireland we are awaiting final agreement from TII on minor amendments to the speed limits on the National Secondary Road Network. It is anticipated that the Speed Limit review will now come before the members in February 2024

Public Lighting Maintenance

Due to the nature of the asset and the ongoing failure rate across our Public Lighting Network, our maintenance contractor has deployed additional resources to Offaly County.

The following is a breakdown of the Public Lighting stats as of the 12th of December. There are 253 faults on the system of which 40 require third party intervention and as such cannot be repaired by the maintenance contractor.

Therefore, the current actionable faults amount to 213 faults or 2.29% of the lighting stock. It is expected that this number will greatly reduce due to the additional resources assigned across the County from week beginning the 11th of Dec 2024.
