Endrim Construction Services Limited	Two warehouse / storage units, a single storey link building and car parking. Ferbane Business Park.
Lumcloon Energy Limited	Extension to the existing battery energy storage system (BESS) facility (consented under Planning Ref 19/55) Lumcloon, Cloghan.

Forward Planning

The Two-Year Progress Report on the Implementation of Development Plan objectives since it came into effect in October 2021 is being prepared.

Preparation is taking place for consultation on the making of the draft Joint Portarlington Local Area Plan 2024-2030.

Just Transition

The Secretariat for Technical Assistance for Regions in Transition (START) and Offaly County Council agreed a Service Level Agreement and Workplan for the provision of 72 days of Technical Assistance to Offaly. Following on from a site visit by the START Team in March 2023 and a review meeting in June, the first of two planned one day workshops took place on 13th September **2023.** The aim of the workshop was to assemble all relevant stakeholders to discuss issues around the transition of the region away from peat harvesting and towards a sustainable and diverse regional economy. It was also to devise a mechanism which will support the development of a new partnership in vocational / tertiary education, training and research to promote a local just transition. A second workshop is planned for 7th November 2023.

EU JTF Community Facilities EV Charging Scheme

The first of the funding schemes under the EU Just Transition Fund launched on 28th July 2023. A new scheme through Zero Emission Vehicle Ireland (ZEVI) was made available in Ireland's EU JTF territory to Electric Vehicle chargers install community facilities. The €15 million scheme provides grants, with the support of the EU Just Transitions Fund which is cofinanced by the Irish Exchequer and the European Union, to cover 100% of costs associated with civil, electrical, and installation works necessary to install publicly accessible 50 kW electric vehicle chargers. The scheme closed on Monday 2nd October 2023. 119 applications in total

were received, including one from Offaly County Council which included 11 locations.

EU JTF Bioeconomy Demonstration Initiative Scheme

The second call for proposals under the EU Just Transition Fund (EU JTF) was launched on **16th August 2023** and remains open to **12.00pm noon on 13th October 2023.** The Bioeconomy Demonstration Initiative Scheme will support the development of bioeconomy piloting and demonstration projects in the wider midlands area.

Failte Ireland Investment Grand Aid Scheme for Private & Community SMEs

Failte Ireland announced that from 30th August 2023, they would be accepting Expressions of Interest under scheme. The purpose of the scheme is to deliver grant-aid to private community-based micro enterprises and SMEs to help them improve the quality of the visitor experience with the ambition of attracting more visitors, increasing their dwell time, and securing overnight stays in the region because the visitor has confidence that there is lots to see and do. The rolling call will remain open until 30th June 2024 with a closing date for applications of 31st December 2024.*

*The closing date for rolling call / application in relation to the Digital Transformation category closes on **30**th **November 2023.**

Streetscape - Clara

Streetscape for Clara is now complete. Clara was selected under the Town & Village Renewal Scheme Streetscape Enhancement Measure 2022. The aim of the Streetscape scheme was to improve the visual appearance of the town, making Clara a more attractive place to live in and to visit.

Expressions of Interest were sought from property owners in the project area of Main St., River St., & Bridge St. to apply for Streetscape Enhancement

works on their properties, commercial/residential also unoccupied/derelict buildings were considered for inclusion. 66 applications were received, with 40 properties successful.

Urban Regeneration and Development Fund 2020

TOBIN Consulting Engineers have been appointed for the design and construction management of the O'Connor Square to Church Street Link, Urban Garden and Remote working hub under the Urban Regeneration and Development Fund 2020. TOBIN have commenced work on the surveys and design for Part 8 Planning documents.

Business Users Support Scheme Kerosene

The Business Users Support Scheme for Kerosene (BUSSK) will compensate eligible businesses for 50% of the increased cost of Kerosene purchased for heating their business premises during the period from 1st March to 31st December 2022, compared to the average retail price for the same period in 2021. There will be a guaranteed minimum subsidy payment of €500. Full details are available here: Enterprise-ireland.com/Business-Users-Support-Scheme-Kerosene

Businesses that have commercially rate-able premises and purchased a minimum of 1,000 liters of Kerosene during the eligible period, can apply to the scheme.

Housing Update

Social Housing Assessments (SSHA) 2023 has commenced. All relevant approved applicants on Offaly County Council's Social Housing Support List, using the current address provided by the applicant, have been written to and completed forms should be returned to the Housing Section by Friday, 15th September 2023. If any applicant has changed accommodation or contact information since the last SSHA they must request an SSHA Update Form - forms are available on http://www.offaly.ie/eng/Services /Housing or from the

- Edenderry or Tullamore Municipal District Offices. Completed forms must be returned before Friday, 15th September 2023.
- The 'Winter Emergency Period' under the Residential Tenancies (Deferment of Termination Dates of Certain Tenancies) Act 2022 has ceased and accordingly, deferred tenancy terminations may take effect over a staggered period from 1st May. Further information on the various pathways available Tenants on valid Notice of Termination are available at https://www.offaly.ie/c/housing/ on the Notice of Termination Information link.
- There are 543 on the Social Housing Support List at the end of September 2023.
- A further 639 active tenancies are currently being supported under the Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) Scheme,8 signed up for HAP and 11 exited from HAP in September.
- At the end of September, 29 single people and 17 couples and families were being supported in emergency accommodation.

Housing Adaptation Grants for Older People and People

Housing received notification on 28th April 2023 that the combined capital allocation to Offaly County Council for the payment

of the Housing Adaptation Grants for Older People and People with a Disability scheme for private homes in 2023 is €1,579,375 which is composed of €1,263,500 Exchequer funding (representing 80%), and €315,875 matching local authority funding (representing 20%) to be provided from the authority's own resources. The Council anticipating the budget have committed a significant portion of this funding to date and to allow for works to be completed and funding claimed during the financial year.

The Department has approved Housings request for additional funding in July 2023 bringing the combined revised allocation to €1,600,000 for 2023.

Disabled Persons Grants 2023

Housing received notification in May of the Council's 2023 DPG funding. Total funding received towards the programme of works is €732,000, i.e. 90% departmental grant of €658,800 and 10% Local Authority funding of €73,200.

Works on completing 26 adaptions and 4 extensions are taking place.

Retrofit Programme

In deciding on a works programme, local authorities are urged to choose a mix of properties across a range of BERs to allow for homes which need significant expenditure to be balanced out by those needing lesser spend so as to achieve the overall average cost of €34,000 per property. A BER rating of B2 must be achieved.

Local Community Development Committee



Offaly LCDC held their monthly meeting on Thursday, 14th of September 2023.

Main agenda items included the Rural Development LEADER Programme 2014–2020 & Transitional LEADER Programme 2021–2022, LEADER Programme 2023–2027, Social Inclusion Community Activation Programme (SICAP) 2018-2023, Community Support Fund update and the Community Recognition Fund 2023.

Community Support Fund 2022/23

Ministerial approval was received on the 21st June 2023 for funding totalling €283,843 to be awarded to 188 successful community groups. The Community Support Fund supports community groups with either their Operating/Running Costs such as utility bills, insurance, etc., or capital costs which aim to enhance facilities or purchase equipment. To date 183 groups have been paid their grants amounting to €272,983. The remaining 5 groups must submit outstanding paperwork prior to payment.

LECP 2024-2029

Development of the LECP 2024-2029 plan is continuing. The consultation stage is completed, and the feedback is being assessed. The next stage is to develop the structure of the plan and ensure the key priorities are included. Once a draft is prepared, a round of consultation will take place to include the Regional Authority, the

MDs and the SPCs with adoption by the full council planned for December 2023.

Community Recognition Fund 2023

Final approval for the 26 successful projects amounting to €636,206 was received from DRCD on 22nd May 2023. Funding Agreements have been agreed between OCC and the successful applicants. All projects must be completed by 18 October 2024. Seven of the projects are completed, and 7 partly completed in 2023. Twelve of the successful projects have decided to wait until 2024 before commencing works.

Pride of Place 2023

Judging for the three Offaly entries took place on 6th and 7th September 2023. The judges for the two days were Mr. John Briggs, former Chief Executive of Armagh Council, and Mr. Declan Nelson, former Chief Executive, Monaghan County Council. The awards ceremony will be held on Friday 10th November 2023 in Armagh.

Arts Strategy 2024-2029

Following an open call and selection process the Arts Office commissioned arts consultant John O'Brien to assist with the planning, consultation and writing of the new Arts Strategy 2024-2029. The new strategy will align with the newly adopted **Arts Infrastructure Strategy 2023-2028**. The development of the new strategy will be through a phased approach of research, consultation and writing throughout 2023. The consultant is now beginning the consultation phase, and a number of public meetings have been organised for Oct.

ARTS OFFICE PROGRAMMES Lough Boora - Art in Landscape Project Funding

Offaly County Council Arts Office in collaboration with Mayo County Council Arts Office and Visual Artists Ireland were successful in securing project funding under the Art Council's Invitation for



Collaboration Scheme. OCC Art's Office is the lead partner on the project. The project includes an artist commission in Offaly and Mayo, and a planned series of events taking place at Lough Boora Sculpture Park, Esker Arts and Tír Sáile (County Mayo) in April 2024. Curator Helen Pheby, who works as an associate director of programming for Yorkshire Sculpture Park, was appointed as Curator for the project. The artists commissioned to work in Offaly and Mayo are international artists Hardeep collaborating Sahota. with the photographer Tim Smith. As part of their

research and community engagement the artists met with a number of artists, individuals and groups in September and more have been planned to take place in October 2023.

FilmOffaly offers an annual bursary award of 10,000 euro towards the production of a short film. The funding aims to foster creative, resourceful filmmaking in the county, creating opportunities for talented new filmmakers and professionals to develop unique, original stories in film. The FilmOffaly Award 2022 entitled, Missing, shot was on location in Offaly in March 2023, is now completed. Missing was produced by Maggie Ryan, Escape Pod Media and written and directed by Maura Foley. The film will have a local premiere in Birr during the OFFline Film Festival in October 2023 followed by a national premiere at Cork Film Festival. The film will then enter the film festival circuit. FilmOffaly Review – The FilmOffaly Review undertaken by researchers; Culture Works across the Summer months is now in the final stages of the draft.

Annual Programme

Culture Night took place on Friday 22nd September and was a great success. Planning for Hullabaloo Children's Arts Festival and Mini Movies is nearing completion, with these projects coming to fruition across the last quarter of the year.

Hullabaloo! Offaly Children's Arts Festival

will be a broader offering this year also, with the inclusion of Esker Arts as a partner in the festival this year. The programme was launched September and will see artists from all over Ireland delivering workshops and performances in across a number of art forms for children up to 12 years of age.

Culture Night

As promised Culture Night on Friday 22nd September was indeed 'one night for all' as venues and public spaces across Offaly opened their doors to host a programme of

– an island-wide celebration of arts,

heritage and culture. Celebrating its thirteenth year, Offaly Culture Night brought a packed programme of events that reflects the eclectic cultural exuberance within the county - a great night for all family and friends. This year there was a thirty per cent increase in number of events from 2022, with an emphasis on diversity and inclusion with all communities encouraged to come and be part of a range of multi-disciplinary events. There was a rich range of cultural treats to choose from, across the perimeters of the County from Edenderry to Birr.

Some of the highlights included:

Birr was a buzz with Birr Theatre & Arts Centre hosting the commissioned work by poet Eileen Casey and photographer Jackie Lynch, and later in the evening a concert, with flautist Karin Leitner.

Also in the town, a pop-up portrait studio was hosted by commissioned artist Tim Quinlan at Birr Technology Centre, and a medley of music, dance, recitals and spectacle took place at The Growery. The Creative Ireland funded, Mosaic Mural project was launched in the town and Brendan House held a charming event called Granny Thompson's Costumed Ragdolls.

In Banagher at JJ Hough's Singing Pub, commissioned artists Patrick Hough and Sheila Hough held a one-night film screening and exhibition titled 'The Two Faces of Tomorrow'.

Clara Musical Society hosted 'Musical All Sorts' at Friends Meeting House. And in Edenderry there were choral delights with Eden Chorale's at Edenderry Library, as well a cultural community social event hosted by Creative Places Edenderry and the Voices of Edenderry Open Mic Night. Commissioned artist Veronica Nicholson

held an exhibition at Edenderry Library showcasing the work of a collaborative project with students of Oakland College.

In **Kilcormac**, the Kilcormac Development Association launched their project *Capturing Our Story*, with recordings that capture memories of life as it was lived in earlier days in the home, the workplace, the farm and the bog. This project was funded by Creative Ireland.

In Moneygall at the Community Café an inclusive international event was hosted, inviting local and international residents to unite for an evening where we can all flavour the cultures, national dishes, music and song.

It was a special night for Esker Arts in Tullamore, as this was their first Culture Night since opening earlier this year. The place was buzzing, and events for all included workshops, an Open Youth Busk hosted by Music Generation Offaly. A magnificent array of dance including a commissioned work by dancer Amy Donlan and a showcase of youth ballet at the start of the evening. Youth events featured strongly with the young people from **The** Acorn Project in Edenderry taking centre stage with the premiere of their short film 'Stand Up' a short film set in Edenderry about boxing and making a choice. And an exhibition of photographs Through My Eyes, a result of a year-long project with Offaly Down Syndrome Association and photographer James Crombie. The evening ending with a lively conversation between Paddy Slattery and John Connors on the event of the launch of Slattery's new book Quiet Thoughts, But Out Loud.

Also, in Tullamore Rahan Comhaltas hosted 'Faces Of Creativity & Culture' in Charleville Castle. Rahan Comhaltas with

have fully commenced in September with good attendance numbers reported.

The other four actions are:

 Clara Community and Family Resource Obesity intervention measure 'Invest in Yourself' catered

- to those overweight and overcoming chronic illness.
- The FAI's 'Traveller Men's Football Team' action is specifically targeting traveller men aged 18-35 to get active in a team sport, organised training sessions and matches in a soccer league.
- Social Farming Ireland's 'Physical Activity through Farming' action whereby those vulnerable and most disadvantaged would have the opportunity to undertake manual tasks and to be out in nature to increase physical activity levels.
- Crinkle Sports & Recreation Centre's 'After School Physical Activity' programme for primary

school aged children to meet up in Crinkle after school and take part in a series of fun games and activities to encourage exercise.

The work of the Healthy Ireland Coordinator during September has largely centred around meeting with Community Groups and potential implementing partners to discuss the possibility of animating new projects for the last quarter of 2023 and for 2024. Control of Dogs

So far in 2023 we have cared for 195 dogs in the Dog Shelter and managed to reunite and rehome 191 of them. This represents an increase of 10% in surrenders and seizures compared to the same period last year. We also received 61 complaints during that period.

Control of Horses

We have dealt with 20 complaints under Control of Horse legislation so far in 2023, which resulted in the seizure of 11 horses and donkeys. All issues are closed or are under investigation.

PLEEP

Survey works on all of the PLEEP assets is now substantially completed. Light replacement works will now commence in early 2024.

Winter Service Plan

Offaly County Councils Winter Service Plan will commence on the 16th of October 2023 and will run until the 30th of April 2024.

EV – Charging/Strategy

Offaly County Council in collaboration with our colleagues in Laois, Westmeath, Roscommon and Longford have commenced the Regional EV strategy. Offaly County Council are the lead authority.

De-Carbonisation of Corporate Fleet

We have now taken delivery of 4 of our 5 electric vehicles and commenced the migration of our fleet over to Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil or HVO which will produce a 90% reduction in our CO2 emissions.

Grand Canal Greenway

The final contract on the Grand Canal Greenway was issued to tender in September. It is now anticipated that Offaly County Council will have completed the Grand Canal Greenway from Edenderry to Shannon Harbor by later Q1 2024.

National Road Pavement Improvements

Offaly County Council have received additional TII funding for pavement protection and renewal works at Blueball on the N52 and Ballinasrah on the N80. Works will commence in late October.

Speed Limit Review

The speed limit review Public Consultation period has now closed and it is expected that our Speed Limit report and proposals will issue to the Elected Members for consideration and approval in Q4 2023.
