# MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING FOR OFFALY COUNTY COUNCIL

HELD IN ÁRAS AN CHONTAE, CHARLEVILLE ROAD, TULLAMORE ON MONDAY 2<sup>ND</sup> NOVEMBER 2020 AT 2.00 P.M.

	Cllr. J. Carroll, Cathaoirleach opened the meeting and welcomed the recent funding announced in the amount of €3.5m by Minister Burke to assist with the loss of rates revenue from the impending closure of Shannonbridge Power Plant. He thanked the Chief Executive, Head of Finance, the members and the Oireachtas members for their efforts in highlighting the need for funding.
	Ms. A. Delaney joined with the Cathaoirleach and members in welcoming the funding and she acknowledged the efforts and support of the Council and Oireachtas members. She noted that this will assist in balancing the budget for 2021 but continued efforts will be made for a full package for the next number of years.
ESB PRESENTATION	Mr. Jim Murray provided the members with a presentation detailing the history of the Shannonbridge Power Plant beginning in 2005. He advised the members that the PSO licence expired in 2019 and an ESB Planning application to switch to biomass was rejected by an Bord Pleanala. He noted that the ESB have looked at various options and they have concluded that none are commercially viable. He gave the members an overview of the site outlining the various other stakeholders land packages and he pointed out that the building is really a protective structure around the boiler and as such the building has no other viable use.
	He advised the members that as the PSO licence has expired production has to cease at the end of 2020 and all employees that wish to remain will be offered alternative positions. He informed the members that the plan going forward is to review and explore the sale of assets and under planning, site

remediation must be completed by the end of 2022. He referenced their OJEU notice for expressions of interest to demolish the building and chimney noting that this is very specialised work. He advised the members that the ESB would investigate other uses for the brown field site including wind and solar generation, synchronised compensator, battery storage and flexible generator uses.

In responding to his presentation Cllr. E. Dooley requested that the ESB work with Offaly County Council and other stakeholders to provide a package for the West Offaly area. He requested that the ESB look at partnerships with Community Gain Funding, Bord na Mona and other stakeholders. He also requested that the ESB apply to extend their de-commissioning period to 36 months to allow them to explore other options. Cllr. J. Leahy joined with other members in requesting a better financial package than the current offer of €5m. The members also raised concerns for the employment opportunities available to the workers, they highlighted the responsibility the ESB have to the community and the area and queried if the building could be used for other purposes.

In responding to the members concerns Mr. J. Murray stated that significant community and stakeholder engagement has already taken place. He noted that the ESB contribution has been mutually beneficial to all parties over the year, he reiterated their commitment to the Just Transition and that the €5m fund is significant. He highlighted the issues facing the ESB with changes in the environment and the challenging energy market. He advised the members that the ESB have ongoing activities in Offaly and that a number of the roles offered to employees will provide career, promotional and personal benefits to them. He stated that regretfully the site has no further purpose.

Cllr. E. Dooley stated that if the ESB are successful in recouping some of the €5m through the PSO they should then reallocate some of it to the Council.

Cllr. J. Carroll acknowledged the contribution of the ESB over the years, but reiterated that there is a lot of frustration and further engagement is required.

### DRAFT DEVELOPMENT **CONTRIBUTIONS**

Mr. G. Conlon provided the members with a presentation on their submissions, highlighting that the development contributions for commercial and residential have not been increased in 6 years and agricultural in 10 years.

#### Data Centres.

On the proposal of Cllr. Quinn and seconded by Cllr. Clendennen the following amendment Data Centres would be charged at a rate of €31 per m2. No other proposals were made in this category and was deemed adopted.

#### **Wind Farms**

Prior to the meeting the Elected Members has entered submissions requesting a change to €15,000 per MW. Cllr. Moran, Cllr. Fitzpatrick and Cllr. Quinn.
