1. BACKGROUND

The National Transport Authority (NTA) Investment Programme was introduced in 2021 and is one of a series of national and local support measures designed to increase the number of walking and cycling networks so that walking, cycling and public transport will account for 50% of all journeys made by 2030.

It is proposed to upgrade the public realm of Cloghan under the National Transport Authority (NTA) Investment as per scope of works listed below.

2. PLANNING

In accordance with the Planning Development Act 2000 (As amended) and Part 8 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (As amended) Offaly County Council has to inform and consult the public, relevant authorities and the elected members of the planning authority of the proposed National Transport Authority (NTA) Investment Programme works.

As prescribed in the regulations Offaly County Council has placed a site notice at the works and advertised in one local newspapers.

Offaly County Council has prepared an EIA Screening Report in accordance with the requirements of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended). On the basis of this Screening Report, Offaly County Council has completed EIA screening and has determined that there is no likelihood of significant effects on the environment. (Article 120 of Planning and Development Regulations, amended 2018) Accordingly, it has been determined that EIA is not required in respect of this proposed development. Any person may, within 4 weeks beginning on 1st February 2024, apply to An Bord Pleanála for a screening determination as to whether the development would be likely to have significant effects on the environment.

Plans and particulars of the proposed Cloghan Active Travel Scheme are available for inspection or purchase during public opening hours at the offices of Offaly County Council, Áras an Chontae, Charleville Road, Tullamore, County Offaly (R35 F893) and the offices of Birr Municipal District, Birr Civic Offices, Wilmer Road, Townparks, Birr, County Offaly (R42 X271), for a period of four weeks ending **1**st **March 2024**.

3. LOCATION

Cloghan is located at the junction of the N62, R356 and R357 on the Birr to Athlone road corridor. It is approximately 29km from Tullamore, 15km from Birr and 29km from Athlone. Due to its strategic location, the village experiences high volumes of passing traffic. The proposed works conform to the objectives set out in The Cloghan Village Plan.

4. SCOPE OF WORKS

The proposed works will include the following:

- Footpath widening and replacement works.
- Widening of existing road to accommodate footpath works.
- Installation of 1 number pedestrian crossings.
- Junction Tightening Works at Estate T-Junctions to improve pedestrian safety.
- Improvements to the Public Lighting Infrastructure.
- Improvements to the Surface Water infrastructure.
- Land acquisition to accommodate footpath improvement works.
- Relocation of ESB Pole to accommodate footpath widening works.
- Removal of 4 No Trees tagged T752, T753, T754 and T755 to accommodate footpath improvement works. Tree planting of replacement trees (8 No.) within Hillview Green Area.
- Installation of new warning signage and road lining.
- Including all associated works.

The Cloghan Village Plan is contained within in the Offaly County Development Plan 2021-2027. The Cloghan Village Plan outlines a number of Settlement Objectives. The Healthy Place Making and Infrastructure Objectives included in the Cloghan Village Plan states the following:

"SO5 - To continue public realm improvements in the village including signage, public seating, hard and soft landscaping and improvements to the road and footpath network".

The proposed works conform to the objectives set out in the Cloghan Village Plan/County Development Plan 2021-2027.

5. ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS

The main environmental impacts to be considered are as follows:

<u>Noise</u>

There will be an increase in noise pollution for the duration of the works. On completion of the works the noise levels will revert to existing levels.

<u>Visual</u>

There will be an impact the village visually for the duration of the works. On completion of the works the National Transport Authority (NTA) Investment

Programme works listed above will visually enhance the appearance of the Cloghan village.
