#### DATES FOR YOUR DIARY

The "Local Authorities (Traffic Wardens)
Act 1975 (Fixed Charge Offences)
(Amendment) Regulations 2021"

This comes into operation on the **1st day of February**, **2022**. This legislation relates to fixed charges as follows:

- €80 charge for parking a vehicle on a footway, a grass margin or a median strip,
- €80 charge for parking a vehicle in a cycle track where traffic sign number RUS 009, RUS 058 or RUS 059 is provided.
- €80 charge for parking a vehicle in a bus lane or on a bus only street.

#### **Development Management**

Planning applications continued to increase during 2021 despite lockdowns due to COVID-19. The figures above represent an annual increase of 23% on the 2020 figures and a 40% increase on 2019.

The Planning Department has assessed a wide range of large-scale developments including; large residential developments, retail, commercial, industrial and mixed use developments. In addition, the Planning Department has seen a marked increase in the number of 'Green Energy' applications submitted in 2021 including several Solar Farm and Wind Farm applications.

In excess of 300 pre-planning consultations were carried out during 2021. With respect to planning applications received by the Planning Department over the past year, the following has been observed:

#### **Housing Developments**

The high volumes of the level of preplanning meetings undertaken has resulted in a significant increase in the number of large housing developments and schemes lodged to the Planning Department. In addition, there has been a marked increase in the volume of 'multiple unit housing development' planning applications submitted to the Planning Department in 2021. Towards the end of 2021 these applications increased significantly

#### Forward Planning

The Offaly County Development Plan 2021-2027 was adopted 10th September 2021 and came into effect 6 weeks later on 22nd October 2021. The Forward Planning Team commenced preparing Local Area Plans at the end of 2021. Each LAP will require an Area Based Transport Assessment.

# Outdoor Recreational Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS)

On 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2021 The Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys announced details of approved funding under the 2021 Outdoor Recreational Infrastructure Scheme for Offaly as follows:

€200,000 grant for Clashawaun River Walk, Clara with match funding of €23,000 from Offaly County Council. (Measure 2 project) This project consists of creating a new 400m river walk amenity along the banks of the River Brosna at Clashawaun, Clara, to help restore connections to the river for the community and visitors.

€50,000 grant for Derryounce project development with match funding of €20,000 from Offaly County Council (new project development category) This grant will provide for a development plan for the expansion and new complimentary uses at the already successful Derryounce Lake and Trails.

### **Town and Village Renewal Scheme**

The Department of Rural and Community Development announced a call for TVR 2021 funding on 3<sup>rd</sup> May, 2021. 6 applications were submitted. Announcements of successful applications is still pending, due shortly.

On 18<sup>th</sup> November, 2021 the Department of Rural and Community Development announced a call for Town Centre Masterplan Initiative (Phase 1). Phase I, a town selected by the Minister from Offaly County Council's nominated towns will be funded up to €100,000 to develop a Master Plan. Clara was the priority town selected for the phase I stage. It is envisaged that Clara's Town Centre Master Plan can reimagine the potential of the town and focus in particular on its centre and immediate surroundings. The plan will identify specific interventions including tackling dereliction and vacancy, decarbonisation, maintaining a strong local economy, creating high value job opportunities and promoting compact growth.

### **Rural Regeneration Development Fund** (RRDF)

On 6<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 The Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys announced details of approved funding under the 2021 Category 2 Rural Regeneration Development Fund for the following 2 landmark projects in Offaly:

• €2,149,408 grant for Edenderry Regeneration Phase II project and will require match funding from Council funds bringing the total to almost €2,686,760. This project will continue the regeneration of the Blundell Master Plan area including demolition works of the Old Tesco Site and enabling works to allow for further development of a new Community Library on the site. It will also fund the design team for the new library building and further appraisal of sites in the Blundell Master Plan area for leisure, community, cultural and services provision with a further Category 1 RRDF application in the future.

€546,400 grant for Ferbane Regeneration which will require match funding from Council funds bringing the total to €683,000. This project is the first phase of regeneration for Ferbane through the redevelopment of key buildings in particular St Joseph's Convent as multi-purpose community/enterprise hub. This grant will form the foundations of a Category **RRDF** application in the future.

#### **ROADS**

### **Roads Programme 2022**

Planning, design and procurement of schemes for 2022 are ongoing. Offaly County Council received the 2022 National Roads Allocation of €2,744,000 from the TII and we are awaiting the grant allocation for the Regional and Local roads in the County. The 2022 Roads Programme will be prepared for March 2022.

#### N52 Tullamore to Kilbeggan Link

Public consultation stage 3 (emerging preferred corridor) has concluded. The conclusion of the Route options selection process is now scheduled for early in Q1 2022.

# Active Travel and Outdoor Infrastructure

The NTA schemes are progressing throughout the County. The Roads section and MDs are continuing to engage with the NTA to plan and deliver additional active travel projects in Offaly in 2022.

#### **TII Fencing Retrofit**

Upgrading of fences comprising horizontal rail elements bounding National Roads recommenced in November. Works will



be ongoing this month to conclude the works. c.700m of existing post and rail fencing will be upgraded to the TII's approved Tension Mesh Fence near Derrinlough on the N62.

Edenderry Town Inner Relief Road Works on this project commenced in October 2021. Works resumed following the Christmas break on Jan 4th and continue to progress well. Construction works to deliver the scheme will be ongoing into Q2 2022.

#### **Winter Service**

The winter service period commenced in October 2021. The weather has continued quite mild for the time of year but salting has occurred on a limited number of cold nights. The Winter Service plan covering the 2021/2022 period is available on Offaly.ie to be viewed by members of the public.

#### **ENVIRONMENT AND WATER**

#### **Climate Action**

Offaly County Council have successfully meet their 2020 energy efficiency targets of 35%, however, these targets have increased to 50% by 2030 which makes the capture/M&R of energy usage across the organisation entire all the important. A significant shift towards decarbonisation is evident in the new Climate Action Plan, with a target of 50% carbon emission reduction again by 2030 required. This will require significant input by all within the organisation backed up by the required investment.

Offaly County Council continues it engagement and membership of the Midlands Energy Agency. Each LA within the MEA is encouraged to identify an "Exemplar" project to put forward for "Pathfinder" funding (50% SEAI funding of capital works or consultancy fees).

# **Environment Burial Grounds**

Fifteen Community Burial Ground Grants, totaling €24,500.00, were paid in 2021 supporting the upkeep and maintenance efforts and special projects being carried out by voluntary burial ground committees around the county. We will continue to engage with these committees, and are planning to set up more, in 2022.

Kilreghan cemetery extension has been completed, and works continue on the tender documents for Kilcoursey cemetery extension. It is hoped to have the tender issued in early 2022 with works to commence in 2022.

### Litter & Waste Management IBAL, Irish Business Against Litter Survey

Tullamore - Top ranking sites included O'Connor Square / associated car parking and Tullamore Town Park - both of these were exceptionally well presented and maintained. Columcille Street was a very freshly presented shopping street with all aspects of the area surveyed in very good order. However, the Bring Centre at Daingean Rd was in a very poor state and subject to significant dumping. Meath Lane was also identified; both these areas will be inspected by our Litter Wardens to identify actions.

#### **Court Cases**

17 prosecutions were initiated in 2021, all of which were successful. Some of those were settled outside court and a couple currently working their way through the court system.

#### **Litter Management Plan**

Every 3 years a LA has to write and publish a Litter Management Plan. Our previous Plan expired in 2018 and was extended for 3 years in accordance it the legislation – Litter Pollution Act, 1997.

The draft plan was presented on the 15<sup>th</sup> of December to the SPC members. They were advised of our intention to go forward to the full Council in January 2022. Following this we go through a public consultation process before final adoption of the LMP.

# Feasibility study: Rahan Village, flood relief

Environment Section are completing a feasibility study to carrying out flood relief works at Rahan Village in conjunction with the OPW. The proposal would include approximately 220m of embankment to protect the rear of College View, protection of the Waste Water Plant and a flood defence to tie in to the bridge. It is intended that the flood relief works project to be fully funded by OPW under Small Schemes funding.

#### **Water Quality**

The *Draft River Basin Management Plan* 2022-2027 was published on 27th September 2020. The document sets out the current situation in relation to water quality in Ireland, which despite focus and progress in recent times, the overall water quality is again in decline in Ireland, primarily due to nutrient pollution. The plan is now open for public consultation until 31st March 2022 and is available at <a href="https://www.gov.ie/draftRBMP">www.gov.ie/draftRBMP</a>. The RBMP was presented to the SPC on the 15th December 2021.

#### Water

Works on the upgrade of the Tullamore, Birr and Clonaslee Water Treatment plants are on-going. The three plants have now begun their 1 year operation phase, after which time they will be returned to OCC staff to operate. Watermain rehabilitation works are completed in Newtown Rahan and are ongoing in Tullamore. Works are due to commence on the Agall-Holmshill rising main and a section of watermains in Fahey, Rhode. Design work is ongoing on 12km of watermains in the Pollagh area.

#### **Draft Regional Water Resources Plan**

Irish Water are now seeking feedback through public consultation on the draft RWRP: Eastern and Midlands and associated SEA Environmental Report and Natura Impact Statement.

A thirteen-week statutory consultation is running from the 14 December 2021 to 14 March 2022 during which time the draft RWRP Eastern and Midlands and associated environmental reports can be viewed and downloaded from the website and at your local authority's planning office during their normal opening hours. #### **October Housing Update**

- There are 489 on the Social Housing List awaiting housing support at the end of December 2021.
- A further 803 active tenancies are currently being supported under the Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) Scheme, 18 signed up for HAP and 6 exited from HAP in December.
- At the end of December, 19 single people and 6 families were being supported in emergency accommodation.
- 29 Rebuilding Ireland Home Loans applications have been received in 2021. 11 have been approved, 14 declined, 2 ineligible and 2 withdrawn. Overall 15 RIHLs have been drawn down since the commencement of the programme.
- Following a competitive tendering process, a consultant has been appointed to carry out Private Rented House Inspections to ensure that the property complies with the Minimum Housing Standards Act.

# **Housing Stock – Number, Maintenance** & Repair

- Total housing stock at end of December 2021 is 1969.
- 275 maintenance calls were logged in December. Maintenance of non-emergency works is continuing with Covid-19 precautions in place.

#### **Housing Capital Programme Update**

- Raheen, Clara development (38 units) The Stage 4 approval application was submitted to the Department on 21<sup>st</sup> December 2021. Works will commence on site in Q1, 2022 subject to department approval.
- Dargan Drive, Chancery Lane (20 Units) Stage 2 was approved on

- 17<sup>th</sup> November 2021. The Pre-Part 8 process is in progress and Part 8 consultation will be advertised in January 2022. Stage 3 submission is due to the DHLGH on 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2022.
- Moneygall (4 units) Stage 4 approval was granted on 15<sup>th</sup> November 2021. Contracts were signed on 12<sup>th</sup> January 2022 and works will begin on site by 21<sup>st</sup> January 2022.
- Circular Road, Daingean (9 units) Stage 3 approval was received in March 2021. Works Tender was advertised on etenders on 9<sup>th</sup> November 2021 with a closing date of 10<sup>th</sup> December 2021. Upon identification of the preferred Tenderer Stage 4 will issue to the Department in Q1, 2022.
- Sycamore Drive, Ballycumber (10 Units) Stage 1 approval was granted by the Department on 11<sup>th</sup> May 2021. Design Team have been appointed and Stage 2 will be lodged in Q1, 2022 on completion of site surveys and investigations by appointed contractors.

#### **Vacant Houses Initiatives**

- 1 Newbridge Street, Birr: Stage 4 approval was granted on 21<sup>st</sup>
   October 2021. The Contractor has been appointed (Ridge Road Construction) to carry out the works which commenced on 16<sup>th</sup>
   December 2021.
- 4 Hillview, Holly Park, Birr: Progressing as an acquisition.
- 121 Lakeview, Clara: Stage 1 submission will be submitted to the Department in Q1, 2022
- 3 x Compulsory Purchase Orders (CPOs) completed in 2021.

#### **Approved Housing Bodies Schemes**

- Sofia Housing: Stage 2 approved (39 units) at Presentation Lands, Portarlington. Stage 2 submission was made in October. Sophia Housing have lodged a planning application for the development further information is being sought from the AHB.
- Sofia Housing, in a joint initiative with Midlands Simon Community, acquired Clonamore Hotel in Q3, 2020. The facility will be developed as an enhanced centre for the provision of supported accommodation for homeless Under the terms of a people. landmark agreement Midlands Simon Community will operate the facility, with a team of qualified social care workers providing support on a 24/7 basis. Following refurbishment, the facility will provide professional supports for up to 17 people. Permission to proceed to tender approved in December 2021.

### Turnkey Developments/Part V

- 6 Turnkey Schemes (82 units) which received departmental approval in December 2020 are progressing as follows:
  - Mucklagh, 8 units Under Construction
  - 2. Woodfield, Birr, 34 units 5 completed in 2021 and due for allocation in January 2022
  - 3. Bog Road, Portarlington, 28 units Under Construction
  - 4. Walsh Island, 4 units Under Construction
  - 5. Tullamore, 5 units discussions ongoing

#### **Housing Grants**

The total allocation in 2021 towards private housing grants, i.e., Housing Adaptation Grants for Older People; People with a Disability Scheme and Mobility Grants was €1,600,000. 20% of this funding is provided from the Council's Housing resources. Housing staff are liaising with all applicants who have been approved for works in an effort to ensure that all works are progressing and to facilitate the drawdown of funds.

#### **Disabled Person's Grants**

The Council received notification from the Department for a significantly increased funding for Disabled Persons works on Local Authority housing units for 2021. A number of adaptations and extensions are progressing and finalising on a number of our housing units.

#### **Retrofit Programme**

The Council received notification on 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2021 of an increase in their allocation under 'Just Transition for the Midlands Region' programme to €4.2m.

Lot 1&2, Birr: The Contractor for the works has been appointed (Retrofit Design Ltd.) and works are in progress on the Birr houses.

Lot 3&4, Tullamore: The closing date for the Works Tender for the 42 houses in Tullamore was 24<sup>th</sup> November 2021. 4 no. tenders were returned. The preferred Tenderer will be appointed to the works once all due diligence required by the contract is completed. Works should begin in Q1, 2022.

Lot 5&6, Edenderry, Daingean, Clara, Ferbane, Shannonbridge, Cloghan: The appointed consultants have surveyed the 43 houses and are preparing the works tender which will be advertised on <a href="https://www.etenders.gov.ie.in">www.etenders.gov.ie.in</a> Q1, 2022.

# **Local Community Development Committee (LCDC)**

Offaly LCDC held their monthly meeting on Thursday 9th December, 2021. Main agenda items included the Rural Development LEADER Programme 2014 – 2020 & Transitional LEADER Programme 2021 - 2022, the Social Inclusion & Community Activation Programme 2018 – 2022 (SICAP), Local Economic and Community Plans Guidelines 2021 and the Community Activities Fund Members were informed that the 2022 SICAP budget allocation for Offaly has been increased by 15% on the 2021 budget by the DRCD. This is an acknowledgement of the crucial role of SICAP in tackling social exclusion, poverty, isolation and marginalisation. Members were given a detailed presentation on the new LECP Guidelines which were launched on the 12th November 2021 and advised that the new funding scheme, the Community Activities Fund 2021 would open for applications before Christmas.

Offaly Public Participation Network Offaly PPN with Green Offaly hosted a <u>Cop</u> <u>26 Event</u> in Charleville Castle hosting the Dingle Hub who were en route to Cop 26 in Glasgow. The event included key staff from Offaly Co. Co., the Cathaoirleach Cllr Declan Harvey who welcomed the contingent from Dingle Hub to Offaly.



Funding Information Meetings held in the three Municipal Districts were well attended. Facilitated by the PPN, Bridie Costello Hynes delivered a presentation on Community Enhancement funding and gave a summary on Covid funds. Olwen Cummins, AO Regeneration, presented on Town & Village Renewal, Outdoor Recreation Scheme, Rural Regeneration Development Fund & Urban Regeneration Development Fund. **OLDC** represented by Roisin Lennon, Catriona Duggan and Cormac Mahon who delivered a presentation on LEADER Funding and the importance of Community Planning.

Public Participation Network Elections took place with representatives now nominated for PPN seats on the Housing Strategic Policy Committee, Climate Action, Environment, Water and Transportation Strategic Policy Committee, Joint Policing Committee and the Heritage Forum. The PPN plans to hold further Elections in the spring to address the remaining vacancies.

#### **Age Friendly Alliance**

- The review of the Age Friendly Strategy 2018-2021 was finalised in December.
- The Winter issue of Connecting the Faithful Newsletter Winter/Christmas edition was circulated across the county in December.
- A further meeting took place with an Interdepartmental team with a view to developing Clara as an Age Friendly town in 2022 and Age Friendly input into the Town Centre Master Plan Initiative 2021 for Clara.

#### **Community Activities Fund**

Community Activities Fund (CAF). This once-off fund will be allocated by the LCDC under the Department's Community Enhancement Programme. The closing date for applications is 12 noon on Friday 11th February 2022.

The CAF is funded by the Department of Rural and Community Development with €277,102 approved for Offaly. On this occasion Offaly LCDC has decided to ring fence up to €75,600 towards grants of up to €7,000 each to support established community playgrounds with replacement of equipment or running costs.

The Community Activities Fund will support not-for-profit community or voluntary groups:

- 1. With their non-pay running costs, e.g. utility bills (electricity costs, refuse charges, heating charges) or operating costs e.g. rental/lease costs, insurance bills). For grants towards operating/running costs, claims must be related to the period 1st July 2021 to 30th June 2022 in order to be eligible.
- 2. Groups will also be able to use the funding to carry out necessary repairs and improvements to their facilities, purchase equipment, for example tables and chairs, tools and signage, lawnmowers and training equipment etc.

Applicants must have completed all works funded under previous Community Enhancement Programmes, and have submitted the required documentation to Community Section to be eligible under this Fund.

Exhibition in Charleville Castle for COP 26 Delegates: On the 1st of November, Comhairle member Grainne Hannigan presented the Trash Talk app that Comhairle na nÓg have been working on in 2021, at an exhibition in Charleville Castle for COP 26 Delegates with Duncan Stewart. The Sacred Heart School joined Comhairle on the day as they had completed one of the workshops to help schools become Single Use Plastic Free. 


