The scheme is available to attractions, hotels, restaurants, cafes, public houses or other tourism and hospitality business establishments, including pubs not in procession of a food licence. A grant of up to €4,000 is available and applications are being accepted up to 30th Sept.

CLÁR 2021

Offaly County Council received an allocation of €47,025 under CLÁR 2021 Measure 1 and 2 funding from the Department of Department of Rural and Community Development on 30th August for St. Kieran's National School, Broughal for safer road side parking & footpath to the school (€36,000) and Shannonbridge Community Services Group wheelchair accessible picnic benches, new planter boxes with flowers & shrubs. canopies, bins, poop a scoop dog dispenser (€11,025). Forward Planning

A copy of the Material Alterations to the draft Offaly County Development Plan 2021-2027 and all accompanying determinations and reports were available for public inspection from 17th June 2021 - 16th July 2021 (both dates inclusive). 2376 no. submissions were received.

A Chief Executive Report was prepared on the submissions and circulated to Members on 11th August for their consideration in advance of Special Council Meetings that are scheduled for September 2021.

ROADS

Roads Programme 2021

All construction works commenced on the 4th May and Roads and the three MDs are completing road improvement and maintenance works throughout the County.

N52 Tullamore to Kilbeggan Link

Public consultation stage 3 will commence on 17th September 2021 where the emerging preferred route will be presented. There will be a presentation for the elected members on 16th September before the public consultation commences.

N62 Ballynacard Pavement Scheme

This scheme was complete in July with 1300m of the national secondary south west of Kilcormac overlayed to improve skid resistance.

Edenderry Town Inner Relief Road

This scheme has received approval from the Department of Transport to progress to the Construction Stage for Phase 1. The Contractor, Tower Civil Engineering will be appointed in September 2021. Construction works will commence in October.

Local Improvement Scheme 2021

OCC received an additional allocation of €246,369 for the Local Improvement Scheme in 2021 for the Department of Rural and Community Development, a total of €545,240. The scheme was advertised in August and the closing date for applications is Wednesday 1st September 2021.

NTA Active Travel

The NTA Active Travel and schemes are progressing throughout the County to improve walking and cycling infrastructure and changes to traffic management arrangements to facilitate the reallocation of overall road space to improve facilities and safety for pedestrians and cyclists.

Climate Action

ENCORE Conference 23rd-24th September. ENCORE 2021, the Environmental Conference of the Regions of Europe which is being hosted 'virtually' by the Eastern and Midland Regional Assembly on 23 and 24 September 2021.

At ENCORE 2021, Member Regions will sign the Declaration', 'Tullamore а common position which will allow them to effectively exert their collective influence on the formulation of environmental policy within the European Union, as well as their national and regional contexts.

Tullamore Living River Project

Work continues on the Tullamore Living River Project site, with a clear impression of the project now visible. This project sets out to deliver a landmark project for the residents and future visitors to Tullamore town which provides amenities, improves water quality, enhances biodiversity, allows flood relief and engages the local community with their spatial surroundings. Most of the excavation work has been completed, with the finer shaping works continuing before planting of the Wetlands can begin at an appropriate time within the season.

Litter & Waste Management

Litter and Waste Enforcement continued over the summer months, with each complaint received being logged and investigated. There are a number of legal actions for littering and illegal dumping under various Sections of the Waste Management Act 1996 before the courts. An increased number of these legal actions are in relation to individuals paying unauthorised contractors to remove waste. Under WMA 1996, it is an offence to give waste to an unauthorised waste collector.

In relation to the Community Environment Action Fund, the deadline for the 2019/2020 projects has been extended by the DCCAE until June 2021. E&WS has completed all projects by the deadline. The roll-out of a 2021 CEAF scheme will be considered when all projects under the previous scheme have been completed and when there is more clarity on the Covid crisis situation.

Wastewater

Aecom Consultants have been appointed for the upgrade the of the Edenderry Plant,

this project will be led by Irish Water, an initial meeting took place in August.

Daingean WWTP: Plant improvements include increasing the capacity of the inlet, new screen and a new sludge holding tank. Works are ongoing and expected to be completed by end of October.

Rahan WWTP: Currently the effluent is tankered into Tullamore WWTP on a weekly basis and this will be replaced with a new plant. It is expected the Plant will be up and running by end of September.

Walsh Island: The design of reed bed is progressing.

Water

Works on the upgrade of the Tullamore, Birr and Clonaslee Water Treatment plants are on-going.

Find and fix works are ongoing in Tullamore, Ferbane, Edenderry, Banagher, and Ballybeg (Dromakeenan, with Clonbullogue due to start.

Watermain rehabilitation works are ongoing in Newtown and Croghan.

Disinfection programme is nearing completion at Tubberdaly, Coolderry, Clonbullogue, Edenderry and Walsh Island. Design works have commenced in Geashill and Holmshill.

Rural Water Programme

The Multi-Annual Rural Water Programme 2019 – 2021 is ongoing. Of the 19 projects awarded funding 8 are now complete and the remainder are due to be completed by the end of quarter1/22. An additional 4 projects have requested extra funding for projects that have arisen during the term of the current funding programme and these

requests have been forwarded to the Dept. Of Housing for their consideration.

The Annual Group Water Scheme Subsidy Applications have been received by the Rural Water Team and are currently being processed and paid.

Burial Grounds

Kilreaghan Cemetery, contract documents have been signed, it is hoped the work will be completed by the end of October.

The tender documentation for the Kilcoursey Lawn Cemetery is currently being prepared for going to tender in October.

July / August Housing Update

- There are 532 on the Social Housing List awaiting housing support at the end of August 2021.
- A further 816 active tenancies are currently being supported under the Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) Scheme, 17 signed up for HAP and 12 exited from HAP in August.
- At the end of August, 18 single people and 4 families were being supported in emergency accommodation.
- 19 Rebuilding Ireland Home Loans applications have been received in 2021. 2 has been approved, 7 declined, 2 ineligible, 1 withdrawn and the remainder are awaiting decisions. Overall 15 RIHLs have been drawn down since the commencement of the programme.
- The Housing Section are finalising the Rent Review of Local Authority housing units. All communications in relation to the Rent Review can be emailed to rentreview@offalycoco.ie
- Summary of Social Housing Assessments (SSHA) 2021 to determine all open and qualified applicants as at 17th November 2021. Applicants will be notified in the coming weeks.

Housing Stock – Number, Maintenance & Repair:

- Total housing stock at end of August 2021 is 1,934.
- 364 and 258 maintenance calls were logged in July and August. Maintenance of non-emergency

works is continuing with Covid-19 precautions in place.

Housing Capital Programme Update

- Raheen, Clara development (38 units) Stage 3 approval application (permission to proceed to Tender) was received from the Department on August 26th 2021; Works Tender will be advertised on etenders in Q3 2021. Stage 4, permission to proceed to construction will be submitted in Q4 2021.
- Dargan Drive, Chancery Lane (20 Units) received Stage 1 approval in April 2020. The Design Team have been appointed. Stage 2 submission to the department will issue in Q3, 2021.
- Moneygall (4 units) Two no. Tenders were received on August 23rd 2021. Stage 4 submission will be submitted to the Department in September 2021 with a view to starting on site in October 2021.
- Beechgrove Belmont (7 units) Four no. Tenders were received on August 19th 2021. Stage 4 submission will be submitted to the Department in September 2021 with a view to starting on site in October 2021.
- Sr. Senan, Edenderry (4 Units) Stage 3 submission lodged on 27th July 2021.
- Banagher, Kylebeg (18 Units) Stage 4 approval received on 25th June 2021. Contractor has been appointed (Pat Loftus Construction Ltd.) Construction due to start on or before 8th September 2021.
- Circular Road, Daingean (9 units) Stage 3 approval was received in March 2021. Works Tender will issue in Q3 2021 with a view to

- commencing construction in Q4 2021.
- Circular Road, Daingean, Site 2 (9 Units) Stage 1 approval application was granted on August 3rd 2021 for the site adjoining the OCC housing site on Circular Road.
- Sycamore Drive, Ballycumber (8 Units) Stage 1 approval was granted by the Department on 11th May 2021. Design Team appointments are in progress along with site investigation procurement. Stage 2 application to be submitted in Q4 2021.

Vacant Houses Initiatives

- 1 Newbridge Street, Birr: Refurbishment of derelict dwelling to provide retrofitted 3-bedroom dwelling. Stage 3 granted on 14th July 2021. Tenders are due back on 31st August 2021. Stage 4 to be submitted to Department in September 2021.
- 4 Hillview, Holly Park, Birr: Progressing as an acquisition.
- 121 Lakeview, Clara: Stage 1 submission will be submitted to the Department in Q3 2021.
- 3 x Compulsory Purchase Orders (CPOs) complete in 2021. Contractor appointed for the refurbishment of two of these units.

Approved Housing Bodies Schemes

- Cluid Housing Association: Construction on the 26 units has recommenced with completion date projected for February 2022
- Oaklee: Clonminch, Tullamore (19 units) Contractor is appointed and construction is progressing well
- Oaklee: Kearney's Field (41 Units)
 Contractor is appointed and construction is progressing well

- Sofia Housing: Stage 2 approved (39 units) at Presentation Lands, Portarlington. Stage 2 submission was made in October. Sophia Housing have lodged a planning application for the development.
- Sofia Housing, in a joint initiative with Midlands Simon Community, acquired Clonamore Hotel in Q3, 2020. The facility will be developed as an enhanced centre for the provision of supported homeless accommodation for Under the terms of a people. landmark agreement Midlands Simon Community will operate the facility, with a team of qualified social care workers providing support on a 24/7 basis. Following refurbishment, the facility will provide professional supports for up to 17 people.

- 4 No. Part V units in Silverbrook Drive, Tullamore have been completed and allocated.

Housing Grants

The Department has advised that €1,368,805, of which €273,761 is to be

provided from Offaly County Council own revenues, will be made available for private housing grants, i.e., Housing Adaptation Grants for Older People; People with a Disability Scheme and Mobility Grants. Funds are being allocated to qualified households and staff are following up with households who were awarded grants to ascertain the status of the work programme.

Disabled Person's Grants

The Council received notification from the Department for a significantly increased funding for Disabled Persons works on Local Authority housing units for 2021. €790,556 has been approved for works, of which €79,056 is to be provided from Offaly County Council own revenues. Design details and tenders are currently being progressed for several extension and adaption grants.

Retrofit Programme

The Council received notification on 8th September 2020 that €3.3m was being awarded to Offaly for the 'Just Transition for the Midlands Region' programme.

Lot 1&2, Birr: A Letter of Acceptance issued to the Contractor (Retrofit Design Ltd.) on August 25th 2021 to carry out the retrofitting works. Works will commence in early September 2021 on the 35 houses.

Lot 3&4, Tullamore: The appointed consultants have surveyed the 42 houses in Tullamore and are preparing the works tender which will be advertised on www.etenders.gov.ie.in Q3 2021.

Lot 5&6, Edenderry, Daingean, Clara, Ferbane, Shannonbridge, Cloghan: The appointed consultants have surveyed the 43 houses and are preparing the works tender which will be advertised on www.etenders.gov.ie.in Q3 2021.

Offaly Covid-19 Community Response Helpline

The Offaly Community Call Helpline continues to operate from 9.00am to 5.00pm, 7 days per week helping those who are vulnerable and who need help accessing essential services or a listening ear. The Helpline number for Offaly is FREEPHONE: 1800 81 81 81. A dedicated team of Community & Culture staff answer queries, with two staff working each weekend.

Local Community Development Committee (LCDC)

Offaly LCDC held their monthly meeting on Thursday 8th July, 2021 with members attending by video link. Main agenda items included the Review of **LCDC** Membership, Rural Development Programme 2014-2020 LEADER Transitional LEADER Programme 2021-2022; Social Inclusion & Community 2018-2022 Activation programme (SICAP)-Mid-Year and Review the Community Enhancement Programme 2021.

Following an ongoing Review of Membership of Offaly LCDC to ensure compliance with legislative requirements in respect of Tenure of Office, Ms. A. Dillon, Chief Officer, informed the Committee of changes to the membership. Sincere thanks was expressed to outgoing members: Chris Byrne, Slieve Bloom Development Co-Dominic operative and Doheny, Construction Industry Federation for their commitment and contribution to the LCDC and new members were welcomed.

LEADER: Under the Transitional LEADER Programme 2021-2022, 9 Projects were approved and the total amount of funding awarded €114,273.87.

SICAP: A detailed presentation was provided to the members in relation to SICAP Mid-Year Review 2021 outlining progress to date. The members were briefed on key actions and programmes being delivered across the County and how the Offaly Team adapted programmes due to COVID-19 and public health restrictions. The members approved and welcomed the SICAP Mid-Year review as recommended by the Empowering Working Group. Communities members were advised that the Department of Rural and Community Development have decided to extend the SICAP 2018-2022 Funding Agreements for a period of months, up to 31st December 2023. This was agreed and welcomed by the members.

CEP 2021: A comprehensive overview on the Community Enhancement Programme 2021 was presented to the members, detailing the number of applications received and the amounts allocated to community groups across the county. The members agreed and welcomed the

recommendations and allocations as outlined in the presentation. A total amount of epsilon 138,550 was approved for allocation in CEP 2021.

Offaly Community Recognition Awards 2021

Members were advised that the first Offaly Community Recognition Awards 2021, in partnership with Offaly Independent took place virtually on 18th June. The awards were very well received with a lot of positive social media coverage and it is envisaged to continue these awards as an annual event.



Public Participation Network

The PPN has set up a subgroup to look at the potential to bring a Trishaw service to Offaly via the (ORS)Outdoor Recreation Scheme with a view to establishing a Pilot project in Pullough. The Trishaw is designed to facilitate people of all ages and to give people with disabilities an opportunity to enjoy the outdoors with the sensation of travelling with the same level of freedom as others

The PPN continues to promote funding opportunities and other opportunities of interest to the Community & Voluntary sector via email, Newsletter and Social Media.

Work is underway on a Nationwide PPN structural review with all stakeholders with a number of consultations taking place over the last few months.

Age Friendly Alliance

Cllr. Tony McCormack gave great energy to Ed Devery's poem Faithful Followers on Midlands 103 Chatters & matters programme on the morning of August 15th, 'Perfectly timed', in late autumn.

The next edition of Connecting the Faithful Newsletter will be distributed at the end of September.

Workshops were held for the writing project in the new ETB offices in Birr with some participants there in person while others tuned in via Zoom.

The Writing Project 'The Way We Were' closing date was 22^{nd} August. Over 30 contributions are now being collated by Denise Dunne in the LOETB. The plan is to produce a Book with the contributions in in late Autumn.



The Intergenerational Teddy Bears Picnic took place on August 22^{nd} at the Charleville Centre Tullamore. This was a Garda initiative supported by members of the Age Friendly

Comhairle na nÓg

Comhairle na nÓg held two meetings in July on the 8th and the 14th. The meetings were in relation to an app for use on apple and android devices that they are currently developing which will help schools in Offaly become single use plastic free.

Council At the meeting on the 22nd of July a policy that the Comhairle Executive consulted on and helped to write was officially adopted. policy The 'Women named





and Diversity in Local Government'. It is hoped this Policy will create more awareness and help more women and more people from diverse backgrounds run for local elections in 2024. The Comhairle Executive are very proud of the contribution they made to this Policy.

On the 13th of July Comhairle members Grainne Hannigan and Ruth Egan, joined Cathaoirleach Declan Harvey and Cllr. Clare Claffey and Offaly County Council Senior Management to launch the Period Poverty Initiative which was adopted in April after a motion from Cllr Clare Claffey. The initiative is very much welcomed by the Comhairle Executive who

believe that no woman, girl, trans or nonbinary person should be excluded from daily activities due to not being able to access sanitary products.



On the 15th of July the Comhairle Executive completed a Spring Clean Litter Pick around the Tullamore Grand Canal. They collected 8 bags of litter. It was the first time many of them had met in person since restrictions began in March 2020 and it was a fun day!



Four of the members of the Comhairle Executive prepared and submitted videos for TEDx Junior. They hope to speak about issues that are important to them on this public forum in November. The Comhairle Executive also took part in several consultations over throughout July and August such as:

The Arts Office continues to plan for a very busy annual programme for 2021. The annual programme will be delivered in response to the current and anticipated restrictions, therefore will be a combination of online and where possible on the ground projects.

Lough Boora - Art in Landscape Seminar

Planning for an Art in Landscape seminar is in progress, with the cultural the producer's Studio Response, selected and contracts in progress. Funding for this seminar was made available through the Arts Council's Invitation to Collaboration Scheme, as a continuation project / partnership with Mayo County Council. This seminar will focus on a discussion of how arts, culture, tourism and climate change policies can align / work together and how this collaboration can inform future policy. The Cultural Producers will devise a number of lead-in workshops, community engagement initiatives with local communities / stakeholders starting from October and into early 2022, prior to the seminar, planned to take place April 2022. The key audience for the seminar will include people interested in and working in the arts, culture, tourism and environment sectors, people living locally who engage with art in the landscape, and experts in their field nationally and Internationally. The cultural producer will expand on this audience base, to reach as wide as possible existing and new audiences.

Grants & Awards

Arts Acts Grants, Professional Artists Support Scheme, Festival Arts Grants – a reminder for the drawdown date of end of November 2021 will be sent out shortly to all recipients of the grants.

Arts Council Funding In the Open | Faoin Spéir

The purpose of the award is to generate a sustained and curated programme of multidisciplinary, inclusive arts activity in public or open spaces in towns and communities around Ireland between July

2021 and April 2022. This is a collaborative partnership, led by Offaly County Council's Arts Office, including



Birr Theatre and Arts Centre and Birr Festivals Collective. With the aim to develop an exciting and innovative curated programme of outdoor events, planned for Birr, Lough Boora, (in conjunction with the Sculpture Park) and Tullamore, in anticipation of the opening of the new Arts Centre for the town next year. Funding award of €90,000 is in the planning phase with delivery partner Birr Theatre and Art Centre. The programming is underway and will be launched Sept./Oct.

Creative Places

The Arts Office in conjunction with the national charitable agency, *Creative Lives*, has been successful in an application to the Arts Council for funding under their Creative Places scheme. This ambitious three-year funding stream (which will have a value of nearly €500,000 to the town over the period) will be led by Creative Lives in partnership with Offaly County Council Arts Office and Edenderry Municipal District. The partner meetings with all

stakeholders are due to commence in September

Capital Projects

Arts Infrastructure Strategy: The Arts Infrastructure Strategy for the County continues to be progressed by People Places Consulting: Caoimhín Corrigan Siobhán O'Malley, and a first draft of the report has been submitted for review. The strategy will explore how all the Arts Infrastructure (existing and planned) can be developed in a collaborative and harmonic resulting in a complimentary and self-sustaining network of arts infrastructure that is beneficial to the whole county.

Tullamore Art Centre

Work continues with regards to the opening of the Arts Centre in 2022. The Arts Office are continuing to develop a series of arts events, funded by Creative Ireland Funding and will this also include events as part of the In the Open/Faoin Spéir project. This programme will aim to re-engage an audience / local community participation in advance of the Art Centre opening. The Arts Office, in conjunction with the Arts Centre committee are currently developing a questionnaire to assess local community, art organisations and artists interest in room rental as an information gathering exercise to be used by the Art Centre management upon opening.

Edenderry Library and Arts Space

The Arts Office will be continuing to work in collaboration with the county librarian in the development of plans for a multipurpose arts space to be incorporated into the planning of the new library for Edenderry.

FilmOffaly: FilmOffaly Script Mentorship programme is progressing as is the FilmOffaly Short Film Award 2021. We

are collaborating with Screen Skills Ireland and LOETB with regards film courses for the 2021 season and beyond. We are also in preparations for our annual FilmOffaly Industry Day at OFFLine Film Festival and the premiere of our FilmOffaly Award winner 2020.

Poetry Town:

Offaly Arts office is partnering with Poetry



Ireland on the Poetry Town programme. Tullamore has been chosen by Poetry Ireland as one of this year's Poetry Town's. We are currently in the process of organising events and workshops which will take place in mid-September.

Offaly Culture Night 2021

We are in the final stages of planning Culture Night event and will be moving towards promoting same in the coming weeks.

Youth Arts Forum

Offaly Arts is continuing to work with a Youth Arts Facilitator in the establishment of a Youth Arts Forum. The forum broke up for the summer and plans are now underway to reconvene the group.

TOURISM

Offaly Tourism worked closely with the sector to provide support and continued to strengthen their marketing activity in order to push domestic demand in the county.

Offaly on TV

The team have been working on a number of TV shows in recent months and are excited at the prospect of Offaly's

attractions featuring on TV to a captivating audience.

- 'Ireland County by County' is a US cable TV show which will be broadcast on 239 public TV stations across the USA, reaching an audience of 40+ million. It was filmed $9^{th}-11^{th}$ June in glorious weather. Editing is continuing on the piece and it will be ready for broadcasting later in the Autumn.
- TG4's 'Heartlands' Series featuring Sharon Shannon in conjunction with Ireland's Hidden Heartlands, filmed in Clonmacnoise & Shannonbridge in July. The show was broadcast on TG4 on Wednesday 25th August & repeated on Sunday 29th and was widely acclaimed.
- The TG4 music documentary 'Fleadhfest 21' filmed in Lough Boora & Clara Bog in June and the show was broadcast on 11th August. It showed our natural landscape in a different light with the backdrop of traditional Irish music.

Videography

In July for the first time ever, Offaly Tourism launched a series of promotional videos. Four distinct videos to target different market segments were completed. They were launched on various social media channels and websites throughout July and showcased all the great things to see and do for visitors and locals alike. The videos are live on www.visitoffaly.ie and will be a great marketing tool into the future.

Radio Advertising

In Summer 2021 the tourism team continued to strengthen their radio presence with a number of campaigns on different radio platforms:

- For the second year running we collaborated with our midland neighbours in Laois and Westmeath. A series of adverts were broadcast on Midlands 103 from Mid-May to Mid-July, encouraging

the listeners to explore the 'Magical Midlands' on their doorstep.

- Advertisements on the popular national stations Today FM & Newstalk ran for a 2 week period, commencing 12th July.

These campaigns complemented the iRadio campaign broadcast over two weeks in June 2021.

Fáilte Ireland Campaign

The very successful Fáilte Ireland 'Keep Discovering' Campaign continued throughout the Summer with TV, print and radio advertising encouraging people to take domestic breaks. We are very proud to have Birr Castle Demesne feature in the IAE TV advert and cruising on the River Shannon on the IHH advert.

The Offaly specific adverts featured in the national newspapers; Irish Times, Irish Independent and Irish Examiner, over a 3-week period in July.

Polar Ice gets the green light for expansion!

news that they have been given the go ahead for an extension adjoining its factory at Portarlington Industrial Estate. The development will consist of the construction of a proposed two storey factory type building containing office accommodation, packaging area with canopied truck loading to rear, truck wash and a canopied link to the existing Polar Ice factory facility.




