REPORT AT A GLANCE

National Community Weekend

Members of the LCDC approved a recommendation from the Sub-Committee to allocate bursaries and were informed that the events taking place over 4th-6th May 2019 are to be known nationally as "The Big Hello". The event management plan for the day is currently being prepared with extensive marketing and promotion to take place over the coming weeks.

Comic Con

Tullamore library will host the first Comic con on Saturday 18th May. This will include a number of stalls, cosplay competition for adults, children and families, Viking Reenactment group from Rhode, workshops, game stations and much more. The library will open from 10am – 5pm for this event.

ENVIRONMENT / WATER SERVICES:

Litter and Waste complaints 2019

Waste complaints thus far 55, Litter complaints 250, this includes 77 clean-ups carried out by local groups. We continue to work with Tidy Towns & Community Groups on the National Spring Clean Initiative. We provide groups with equipment to assist in the clean-ups and arrange collection of waste collected. Green school assessments have been completed & submitted to An Taisce for consideration. Schools will be notified of the outcome in the coming weeks. The Litter Management Plan will be considered by the Councillors at the April meeting.

Water Quality

Water Quality staff continue to participate in the Water Framework Directive Operational Committees in both the Eastern & Midlands Region, and also the South East Region. The implementation of the River Basin Management Plan for Ireland 2018-2021 is progressing with the LA Shared Services Catchment Assessments Teams commencing work on the ground in the Priority Areas for Action (PAA). The Silver River catchment in Kilcormac will be assessed by the Catchment Assessment Team.

WATER SERVICES Capital Projects

Works in Mountbolus and Brosna South are completed. Works are ongoing in Crinkle. The design and build contract for the major upgrade of the Tullamore and Birr Water is progressing. Design for Clonin, Croghan, Blundelwood, Clonmullen Lane & Newtown is progressing. The Tullamore Drainage Area Plan 2018 will inform sewerage network upgrade going forward.

Consultants have been appointed to look at storm water design in Cloghan and Shinrone - this is at design stage at present. Ground Investigation is being completed in Cloghan and Shinrone for tendering purpose. This is planned to go out to tender in Q2 2019. works Upgrade at Banagher Water Treatment plant are complete, commissioning works are being agreed and implemented.

Watermain Rehabilitation works are reaching completion at Mucklagh and Screggan. Works have commenced in Crinkle and Mountbolus with Brosna South to commence in January.

Belmont Rising Main is completed; this will reduce tankering costs into the future.

Tullamore Sewer Rehabilitation works have commenced & 505 of the works have been completed to date.

Housing Grants

Departmental approval was received on 11th March advising that Offaly County Council's 2019 grant for Housing Adaptation Grants; Housing Mobility Grants; and, Housing Aid for the Elderly is $\in 1,244,948$ of which $\in 248,990$ must be from the Council's own resources. (Offaly's 2018 original allocation was $\in 1,203,009$, and later raised to $\in 1,443,397$)

ROADS:

The Road Works Programme for 2019 was presented at the Council meeting of 25th March 2019. The 2019 budget of €14.63m includes €2.96m from the TII for National Roads, €9.88m from the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport for Regional and Local Roads and €1.79m in own resources. The Roads Section and three Municipal Districts will deliver the programme in 2019.

LOCAL & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The Local Community Development Committee

(LCDC) met on 14th March 2019. Agenda items included the Rural Development LEADER Programme 2014-2020, National Community Weekend and Local Migrant Integration Strategy.

Local Migrant Integration Strategy

It was agreed by the members that the LCDC would lead the development of a Local Migrant Integration Strategy for Offaly. It is anticipated that this Strategy will be completed by June 2019 and forwarded to the members of Offaly County Council for final adoption at the July 2019 monthly Council meeting.

Age Friendly Strategy

The Age Friendly Alliance Meeting was held on March 7th Updates were given from Offaly Sports Partnership, Local Link Laois/Offaly, HSE, An Garda Siochana, OLDC and the Offaly Older Persons Network. Projects highlighted included the Intergenerational Programme in conjunction with Music Generation Offaly Westmeath; Bealtaine Festival and the Offaly Explorer venture in conjunction with Local Link. The Offaly Older Person's Forum Housing Showcase took place on 4th April 2019 in the Darmagh Centre, Tullamore. Offaly Co. Co. staff from the Housing & Community & Culture were in attendance.

Public Participation Network

The Green Offaly Environmental Trust Consultations took place in Birr, Ferbane, Tullamore & Daingean. These were well attended with considerable interest in the Environment in terms of Community sustainability. The results of Community Planning took place in Lusmagh with OLDC, Offaly PPN & Offaly Co. Co staff in attendance. Discussions took place with the arts office to ensure Bealtaine events take place this year and with a view to planning towards a larger project in 2020. The Community Watch meeting was facilitated with good attendance and the establishment of the establishment of a Community Federation to manage CCTV in communities across the county.

Comhairle na nOg

The Executive met on 27th March and decided on their 2019 Project under the theme 'Promoting Positive Mental Health – Dealing with Exam Stress and Anxiety'. 4

members of the executive attended a Consultation Day on Reform of RSE (Relationships and Sexuality Education) in schools on 13th March in the Department of Children & Youth Affairs. The Comhairle Coordinator and PPN Resource Worker are currently exploring the possibility of running a certified Leadership Skills Training course to be delivered by Youthwork Ireland, in conjunction with Laois and Offaly Public Participation Networks which will could be jointly funded by Comhairle and PPN.

NOTICE OF ELECTION

An election of members for each of the local electoral areas of Offaly County Council is about to be held. Nomination papers may be obtained during the usual office hours. A person may nominate himself/herself as a candidate or may, with his/her consent, be nominated by a proposer who is registered as a local government elector in the local electoral area of the local authority for which he/she proposes to nominate the candidate.

A nomination paper from a candidate of a registered political party must have a certificate of political affiliation attached which must be produced to me with his/her completed nomination paper. If no certificate is attached, the candidate must, before the latest time for receiving nominations, either-

• secure 15 assents to the nomination by way of statutory declarations by local government electors registered in the relevant local electoral area (forms available from me or the registration authority), or

• make a deposit of €100 (deposit may also be made on the candidate's behalf).

Completed nomination papers may be delivered to Mary Flynn Kenny, Returning Officer in person by the candidate or his/her proposer at any time when she is at her office, from 10am on the 27th day of April, 2019 until 12 noon on the last day for receiving nominations 4th May 2019.
