COVID 19 UPDATES

Finance

Restart Grant

Offaly Council is taking applications for the Covid-19 Restart Grant Scheme. This grant will give direct grant aid to micro and small businesses in Offaly to help them with the costs associated with reopening and reemploying workers following Covid-19 closures. The closing date for application is August 31st 2020 Before making an application, please check <u>https://www.offaly.ie/eng/News/Covid-19-Restart-Grant-Scheme-Press-Release-22nd-May.html</u> to see if your business is eligible.

Local Enterprise Office

The Local Enterprise Office Offaly team continues to work remotely and provides a full service to new and existing enterprises in Offaly.

COVID 19 Supports - Trading Online Voucher (eCommerce) Grants Available

LEO Offaly continues to experience high demand for the Trading Online Voucher scheme. The voucher is a financial incentive to small businesses to develop or enhance their ability to trade online. Under the scheme a qualifying business may apply for funding to a maximum value of ϵ 2,500 or 90% of eligible expenditure (exclusive of VAT), whichever is the lesser. Following approval of their application, a successful applicant can engage suppliers and upon completion of the work, submit a request for payment to the LEO in line with the terms and conditions of their voucher. One to one mentoring and information seminars are available online or by conference call to prospective applicants to support them in their application process and it will be a condition of applying for the vouchers that applicants participate in one of these mentoring sessions or seminars. The mentoring attendees will be informed of the purpose of the scheme and how best to use and get value from the application of the voucher. The application process for the vouchers will be a competitive process.

The vouchers are targeted at businesses with the following profile:

- Limited or no e-commerce presence;
- 10 or less employees;
- Turnover less than €2m;
- Applicant business must be trading for at least 6 months;
- Business are located in County Offaly.





COVID 19 UPDATES

Planning

In the context of the most up-to-date public health advice during this COVID-19 Emergency, the Minister for Housing Planning and Local Government commenced Section 9 of the recently enacted Emergency Measures in the Public Interest (Covid 19) Act 2020. This section inserts a new provision (Section 251A) into the Planning and Development Act, 2000 as amended which froze all timelines associated with statutory processes under the Planning and Development Acts. Subsequently, the Government made an order under Section 251A(4), to the effect that the period from 29th March 2020 to the 20 April 2020 inclusive (i.e. 23 days), may be disregarded when calculating timelines.

Final Extension of time to 23rd May has now ended and timelines have recommenced on all Planning Applications. Some Applications from prior to 29th March are completing their submissions period whilst all applications received during the COVID-19 emergency period recommence simultaneously on 24th May 2020. Approximately 140 applications were affected by the timescales.

Planning Administration continued to receive Planning applications throughout the Covid-19 Planning emergency period. As stated above all timelines for permissions have recommenced and this has resulted in a significant workload to be addressed in the coming weeks.

Heritage

Despite the C19 restrictions, the majority of projects planned to be delivered under the Heritage Plan 2017-21 are proceeding or have been adapted for delivery under the circumstances.

Library Services

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COVID 19 UPDATES

Housing

During this period of Covid-19 the Housing Section has continued to provide critical essential services as set out by the Government during the period of lockdown. We have modified a number of our processes to enable services to continue and ensure that essential repairs, housing allocations, HAP, rent reviews and continued work with persons presenting as homeless and Traveller welfare issues are addressed.

All Housing staff, working in the office and remotely, have ensured that service delivery has continued during this time. To assist us in streamlining service delivery we would encourage the use of the following email addresses:

Our housing allocation process was modified, to allow us continue to allocate and conduct pre-tenancy courses, and 8 allocations to Council properties, AHB and RAS/Leasing units were completed in May (26 allocations completed since March 2020).

Our HAP Section has continued to be busy and staff have successfully assisted many to secure accommodation and have completed 26 HAP tenancies from March to the end of May. Staff continue to provide guidance and support to tenants and, where appropriate, households' differential rents, for both Council and HAP tenancies, have been recalculated.

Since the introduction of Phase 1 of Ireland's Roadmap for Reopening works on our capital build programme, in Chancery Lane, Tullamore and in Edenderry, have recommence. Pre-letting works on a number of properties have also recommenced. The pace at which houses can be completed is affected due to the restrictions that are required. Housing have continued to secure additional leased accommodation and are in the final stages of securing a number of leasing properties in both Tullamore and Edenderry.

Working in partnership with the Gardaí, Housing have continued to investigate anti-social behaviour complaints in line with the Council's policy and tenancy agreements. Staff have worked very effectively with other agencies to ensure that services continue to be provided to those in emergency accommodation or at risk of becoming homeless. The Council's HAP Place Finder has arranged interviews for and secured a number of HAP properties since his appointment in December 2019.

In line with essential works, we assisted contractors to finalise turnkey houses in Cloneygowan and Moneygall. These units were finalised in May and 5 families have been allocated to their new homes. The Council have continued to work with and made nominations to the AHB. We have received a number of Expressions of Interest for the provision of Turnkey Developments for Social Housing across the county following our recent advertisement campaign and these are being assessed. A number of AHB have also submitted their proposals for the Council's *AHB Register of Social Housing Opportunities*.

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COVID 19 UPDATES

Offaly Covid-19 Community Response Helpline

The Helpline call centre has been operating from the 30th March 2020. The Helpline number is **1800 81 81 81.** To date it has operated from 8.00am to 8.00pm, 7 days per week, but this will change to 9am to 5pm, 7 days a week from the 8th June 2020, due to the significant reduction in calls in recent weeks.

The Helpline co-ordinates the delivery of food, fuel and medicine to vulnerable people where their usual source of support has become unavailable. It only deals with non-medical and non-emergency calls and refers callers to appropriate community supports or to the Gardaí or the HSE in the case of emergencies.

- There were a total of 405 calls to the Helpline up to 8pm on Sunday 31st May 2020.
- The total numbers of calls have reduced significantly in the last 3 weeks as people become more aware of who to contact locally to obtain services, and as the national and local media information campaigns becomes increasingly effective in delivering the message
- 18% of calls to date relate to deliveries of food, fuel or medicines
- 22% of calls relate to medical supports or HSE issues
- 6% of calls relate to problems of social isolation
- 2% of calls relate to Meals on Wheels services
- 1% of calls relate to Garda matters
- 51% of calls relate to other general queries, with a large proportion being offers of support from people who wish to volunteer their services and help in some way

Offaly Community Response Forum

An interagency Community Support Forum has met 8 times to date, and will continue to meet regularly for the duration of the crisis. The next meeting will be held on 11 June 2020. The members of the Forum are Offaly County Council, HSE, GAA, OLDC, An Garda Síochána, ALONE, SVP, An POST, Offaly PPN, Local Link, Citizens Information Service, Túsla, IFA, Offaly Traveller Movement, Kildare Volunteer Centre (covering Offaly), Civil Defence, Offaly Library Service and Family Resource Centres. There is excellent co-operation and sharing of useful information between all of the agencies on the Forum.

Covid-19 Emergency Fund

On the 11th April 2020 the Department of Rural and Community Development allocated €65,553 in COVID-19 Emergency Funding to Offaly County Council. The grants are for current or capital expenditure and priority is given to locally based community and voluntary groups in disadvantaged urban and rural areas of Offaly dealing with the COVID crisis, such as Meals on Wheels and other similar activities. A total of 37 applications were received and were assessed by the Evaluation committee. Development Management

The Development Management Planners have been allowed to carry out site inspections with effect from 25th May and are assessing/undertaking: planning applications, planning compliance matters, minor pre-planning requests (via email) and planning queries (via email), which can be processed in light of the current Covid 19 restrictions and in accordance with the updated Government guidance.

Forward Planning

Due to extension of Covid-19 legislation, the pre-draft Offaly County Development Plan was submitted to elected members for their consideration on 10th June.

REGENERATION

Urban Regeneration Development Fund: (URDF)

The Regeneration team in conjunction with Tullamore Municipal District and other sections submitted a URDF 2020 application for Tullamore Town Centre on the May 29th 2020 to Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government. This application consisted of a suite of integrated urban regeneration projects to rejuvenate Tullamore Town and compliment previous URDF and ERDF successful projects. The following is a list of projects submitted –

Project A – O'Connor Square to Church Street Link, Urban Garden and Remote Working Hub

Project B - High Street to Tanyard – New Street Link

Project C – Meath Lane Link and Civic Space

Project D – Tullamore Regeneration Framework

Project E - Tullamore Harbour Development Option, Viability Appraisal and Master Plan

Project F – Acres' Folly Enhancements

The total cost of above projects for the application was $\notin 2,993,876$, amount of funding sought $\notin 2,245,407$.

Rural Regeneration Development Fund: (RRDF)

Town and Village Renewal Scheme

The Department of Rural and Community Development announced a call for TVR 2020 funding on 27th May, 2020. There is a new strand to TVR for 2020. Planning Section, Regen Team will develop and prepare applications in conjunction with Municipal District and other relevant sections.

TVR 2020 accelerated measures in response to Covid 19

This strand focuses on immediate interventions that can be delivered in the short-term to assist towns and villages to adapt to COVID-19. The 2 main objectives

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are assisting with measures to deal with social distancing and measures to deal with increasing footfall into rural towns and villages.

OCC can submit 10 projects over 2 rounds with projects of $\in 25,000$ each.

Round 1 closing date 3rd July, 2020 Round 2 closing date 14th August, 2020

TVR scheme 2020

The standard Town and Village Renewal Scheme is open for applications and 6 in total per Local Authority for 2020. The closing date is 28th August, 2020. Maximum fund available €100,000.

Outdoor Recreational Infrastructure Scheme: (ORIS)

The Department of Rural and Community Development announced a call for ORIS 2020 funding. On 29th May 2020. Applications will be developed and prepared for Measure 2 and 3 by Planning Department, Regen Team in conjunction with other relevant sections for 30th November, 2020.

HERITAGE

Heritage Council funding

€23,000 has been secured in 2020 for two projects. The first is embedding the Offaly County Archive Service following the completion of the archive building at Axis Business Park. The official launch of the Offaly County Archives Service has had to be postponed, but work on the cataloguing and process of archives has continued. The second project receiving Heritage Council funding is the removal of the invasive Himalayan balsam plant on the Camcor and Little Brosna River Catchments which is a continuation of work done in 2018 and 2019.

Creative Ireland

In 2020 a budget of \notin 97,000 is allocated to the Offaly Creative Ireland programme. In Offaly the team involves the libraries, arts, architecture, corporate, heritage and community all working together. There is an addition budget of \notin 15,000 for Cruinniu na nOg (June 13) which is managed by the library service. The work programme is being evaluated on an ongoing basis to see what projects are appropriate to deliver in 2020.

Decade of Commemorations

An application for €10,000 from the Dept. of CHG in 2020 is currently being assessed. The foundation for the project applied for is the social history of the Rathrobbin Estate near Mount Bolus which is shown through the unique Magan photographic collection.

Offaly Biodiversity

- National Biodiversity Funding of €16,000 has been applied for to develop actions in the All Ireland Pollinator Plan; to assist in the recording of biodiversity data and in the removal of invasive species.
- As all field club and workshops have been cancelled we have changed direction and worked with John Feehan to prepare short YouTube clips on the Wildflowers of Offaly, hosted on the Offaly Heritage YouTube channel. <u>https://www.youtube.co</u> <u>m/user/offalyheritage</u> These have been extremely popular with over 5,000 views to date and very positive feedback.
- For **Biodiversity Week in May** we worked with Midlands 103 radio and featured daily interviews of different aspects of biodiversity.

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- In May we also joined with heritage officers nationally on a joint initiative to launch a **free booklet on** *Gardening for Biodiversity*. This came at a particularly good time with people based at home and relooking at their gardens and it has been very much in demand.
- With Westmeath and Laois County Councils we have continued to run the 'infomercials' about **pollinator actions on Midlands 103**.

Medieval Churches

Work has commenced on measures to conserve Roscomroe medieval church following extensive consultation with the Dept. CHG in 2019. With C19 measures lifting, the work to carry out maintenance at other medieval church sites will restart.

Publications

This is an area where work can continue fully during lockdown. We worked with Offaly History to publish the book on **Poet Egan of the Meelaghans** which has been launched on line in April. We are currently working with James Scully to publish a book on the memorials of St Ryanagh's medieval church in Banagher and with Stephen Callaghan on the burials in the Military Cemetery at Birr Barracks in Crinkill. **Derrinlough Briquette Factory**, a photographic book by James Fraher is printed and awaiting an online launch.



ROADS

The Roads Programme 2020

The Programme has commenced throughout the County. All works are proceeding with Covid safety measures in place. The following road works are currently ongoing or due to commence in the County:

- N52 Tullamore bypass resurfacing works were complete in May;
- N52 Eglish & N52 Ballindown & Ballynaguilsha TII Capital Maintenance Works to commence in July;
- Offaly Greenway Digby Bridge to Ballycommon Bridge (6km) works commenced in June;
- Low Cost Safety scheme Erry Mills, Clara, works recommenced in June;
- N80 Tullamore to Killeigh Road (HD 28 scheme) Contractor appointed;
- Resurfacing on William Street programmed to commence on the first week of July;
- Works on the Collins Lane junction / Arden Way / Arden View Junction to commence in July;
- Works on the N52 Mucklagh junction and N80 Killeigh village will commence in June;
- Road Improvement Schemes and Surface Dressing in the County commenced in May and will continue throughout June and July;

N52 Tullamore to Kilbeggan Link Road

TII Major Capital scheme is in Phase 2: Option Selection. The first phase Public through Consultation the website. brochures and letter drop commenced on 15^{th} with June 2020 the website www.n52tullamoretokilbeggan.ie going live with receipt of submissions to Monday 27th July. A briefing session was held by zoom on 9th June.

Local Improvement Scheme 2020

Offaly County Council received an allocation of €278,871 for Local Improvement Schemes from the Department of Rural and Community Development. Following advertising for applications in May the list of schemes has been submitted to the Department for approval.

National Transport Authority

The NTA has commenced a national project for the installation of wheelchair accessible bus stops serving high floor coaches in towns across Ireland. Tullamore and Edenderry have been identified as priority locations for this project. OCC working on behalf of the NTA are currently designing the bus stops and engaging with landowners to acquire the required land.

CLÁR

The Department of Rural and Community Development (DRCD) announced the CLAR Programme for 2020. Applications for Measure 1 - support for school's/community safety measures and Measure 2 - community recreation areas will be submitted by OCC to the Department by 28th August, 2020. Applications for Measure 3 - to assist groups providing mobility and cancer care transport services and organisations that provide meals on wheels services are made directly to the Department.

ENVIRONMENT & WATER SERVICES

Water

Works on the upgrade of the Tullamore, Birr and Clonaslee Water Treatment plants recommenced on May 18th, following the suspension of works due to Covid.

IW are currently preparing the design for replacement reservoir at Clonbullogue and considering a replacement reservoir at Walsh Island. Leak repair: Find and fix works are ongoing in Dunkerrin, Rhode and Tullamore. Irish Water has confirmed that a National Conservation Order Water commonly referred to as a hosepipe ban will be in place from Tuesday 9 June until Tuesday 21 July. This restriction is necessary due to the exceptionally dry weather we have experienced. May 2020 was the driest May on record since 1850. The amount of rainfall needed to replenish supplies varies around the country and is site specific however Irish Water estimate that a minimum accumulation of 100mm rainfall spread over a number of weeks would be required and normal rainfall levels after that before the threat to water sources would pass.

ENVIRONMENT

Civic Amenity Sites

All Civic Amenity Sites, bottle banks and Derryclure waste transfer station continue to see increased levels of usage over the past month. There were 10,474 trips to the three Civic Amenity Sites and Derryclure waste transfer station, that is a 2850 increase on May 2019.

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Illegal Dumping

An application was made to the DCCAE for funding under the Anti-Dumping Initiative to clean up some very littered areas and to provide funding for CCTV at bottle banks, Offaly County Council received €64,534. Work is now commencing on the initiatives which were successfully funded.

Community Clean ups

There were 26 community clean ups so far this year, where the Environment Section provided assistance to the communities.

Water Quality

Water Framework Directive sampling programme has been suspended during the current restrictions in place for Covid-19. Detailed submission has been returned to the EPA regarding the 3rd Cycle Characterisation of local rivers under the EPA's River Basin Management Plan.

Burial Grounds

Part 8 approval was granted for an extension to the cemetery at Kilcoursey, Clara. The works are now being scoped out

Tullamore River Enhancement Project

The Part 8 process for the Tullamore River Enhancement Project has been extended due to ministerial order following on from the Covid 19 pandemic. Public consultation/ submission ended on the 4th June.

HOUSING

- There are 671 on the Housing Waiting List awaiting housing support at the end of May 2020.
- A further 850 live tenancies currently being supported under the Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) Scheme, 8 signed up for

HAP and 1 exit from HAP in May 2020.

- At the end of April 2020 there were 20 single people and 6 families in emergency accommodation.
- 6 Rebuilding Ireland Home Loans applications were received in 2020 to date and 2 RIHL have been approved.

Housing Stock – Number, Maintenance & Repair

- Total housing stock at end of May 2020 is 1,901.
- 1,224 maintenance call logged from 1st January to the 31st May 2020

Housing Capital Programme Update

- Works recommenced at Chancery Lane, Tullamore 18 units on 18th May works.
- An architect led Integrated Design Team has been appointed for the Raheen, Clara development. Site Investigations are ongoing and stage 2 is being prepared at present and should be ready to submit to DHPLG in June 2020.
- Offaly County Council will act as Architect with Design Team consultants who are appointed for the development of Church Street, Clara (3 OPD units); Beechgrove Belmont (7 units); Moneygall (4 units) & Sr. Senan, Edenderry (4 Units). Site investigations on all sites completed and the Stage 2 submission will issue to the department in June.
- Dargan Drive, Chancery Lane (near new Chancery scheme): Consultants to be procured by Offaly County Council as part of new consultant framework for 16-

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20 units; OCC are acting as Architects; Stage 1 granted on the 5th March 2020. Consultant Tender have gone live on e-tenders on May 30th and are due back on June 30th. The scheme design will progress in tandem with the tender period.

- Banagher, Kylebeg 18 Units, a second stage 3 submission was made in April 2020. Stage 3 was approved by the DHPLG in May 2020 and the Tender documentation is being prepared and will issue in the next fortnight.
- Circular Road, Daingean 9 units -Stage 2 approval was approved on the 4th December 2019 with a request to increase the number of units. Part 8 application is ready to go pending reopening of services and will be advertised when public display can take place.
- Rectory Lands, Birr options for consideration are being developed.

Approved Housing Bodies Schemes

- Mid Offaly Housing Association: Mountbolus - 4 units are substantially completed and the AHB have informed the successful nominees when the units will be made available. Works on concluding the houses has been delayed due to Covid 19 but have resumed since the lifting of restrictions on 18th May.
- Oaklee: Clonminch, Tullamore 19 units, stage 3 approved on the 26th of March. AHB has sought expressions of interest from contractors.
- Oaklee: Kearney's Field 41 Units, AHB has sought expressions of interest from contractors.

- AHB Killane Drive 27 units Construction resumed on the 18th May
- Sofia Housing: Stage 1 approved for 32 units at Presentation Lands, Portarlington. Stage 2 submission from AHB will issue in June with an additional 9 units.
- Cluid Housing Association are finalising a Turnkey development, of 26 Units, on Rahan Road, Tullamore. Construction is scheduled to start in June 2020.

Turnkey Developments

- MacGregol, Birr: 12 Units Works resumed on the 18th May, 8 units will be delivered in 2020.
- Advertisement for expressions of interest for Turnkey schemes closed on the 28th May 2020. Currently assessing over 20 submissions across all MD's.

LOCAL & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Local Community Development Committee (LCDC)

Offaly LCDC held their monthly meeting on Thursday 21st May with some members in the Council Chamber and the remainder attending by video link. Agenda items included the Rural Development LEADER Programme 2014 – 2020; COVID 19 Emergency Fund 2020, Updates on the Community Response Forum and Community Helpline and the Offaly Age Friendly Alliance. Members approved revised actions for the Healthy Offaly Programme for 2019-2021 and the redistribution of funding.

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Under the Rural Development Leader



Programme, 8 Projects were approved and the total amount of funding awarded was $\notin 168,683.44$. It was agreed by the members to issue 2 target calls inviting expressions of interest under the following:

- Hospitality and Tourism Re-Opening Grant Scheme: To assist local businesses and social enterprises in the tourism and hospitality sectors towards the costs of re-opening in light of the COVID 19 Pandemic and support them to put in place the essential health and safety measures that will facilitate the public to safely use their businesses again. The call will be widely advertised and will close the end of August.
 - Support for Community Facilities Grants: To assist and support the re-opening of community facilities in the wake of the COVID 19 Pandemic and to support them to put in place the essential health and safety measures that will facilitate the public to safely use their community centres, facilities and services again. The call will

be widely advertised and will close the end of September.

Age Friendly Strategy

Information & Communication are two



key elements of the Age Friendly Strategy. Edition 2 of the Age Friendly Newsletter 'Connecting the Faithful' was delivered 4.000 to

homes where people are cocooning. An Post are delivering the Newsletter at no cost to Offaly Co. Co. The online version is attracting lots of attention too via Social Media and the Offaly Co. Co & Offaly PPN



Websites. Contributions from a range of Age Friendly Alliance members and others help make for interesting reading. Healthy Offaly have committed also Healthy Ireland funding to assist

with the printing of the publication.

Public Participation Network

The PPN continues to deliver information in a timely manner to membership both from a National & Local Perspective. The PPN contributes to the Offaly Community Response Forum and continues to support the call centre phone service. A family magazine consisting of helpful information and about 20 pages of puzzles, colouring

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and much more to stimulate all ages both mentally and physically. It was compiled by the PPN in collaboration with Clara & Tullamore FRC's and distributed to

10,000 households across the county with the assistance of OLDC, Laois Offaly Local Link and the GAA. Requests for more magazines are coming in, however this was a once off publication enabled by PPN & Healthy Ireland Funding.

A call for Nominations for PPN Vacancies took place during May. Covid-19 impacted heavily on the process as groups are not meeting or making decisions, however enough nominations were submitted to address the majority of vacant posts.

Comhairle na nÓg

Gender Balance and Diversification in Local Government. We are preparing for webinars which will take place next week for the Gender Balance and diversification project. Communication was made with all 12 secondary schools in Offaly and 1-2 students from the TY programmes have been selected to attend a webinar on zoom in conjunction with existing Comhairle na nÓg members.

Arts Grants

Arts Grants: We are assessing the arts act grants, professional artist support grants and festival grants on a continual basis, with a view to aid community groups and

Festivals Online

Culture Night

The Arts Office is concentrating on an online response for Culture Night. It is intended to produce a short film showcasing our artists and venues. A call for film makers and interested artists was issued in mid-May. Proposals are due back in June. There will also be some restricted physical independent events taking place.

Hullabaloo!

An evaluation of the artist's submitted proposals has been undertaken. The Arts Office are progressing to scheduling of workshops and events. Two possibilities for the programme – restricted physical workshops – pending approval and a series of online workshops and performances.

Youth Arts

We have been working with youth arts facilitator Oísin Robbins to create an online project entitled 'Capture Your Creativity'. Young creatives have been invited to capture their artwork (any medium) and submit same to us. The art work will be curated together and showcased though a short film on social media, depending on response there may be more than one film. The project aims to capture the range and diversity of youth art for ages between 12-20 years. This project aims to celebrate and showcase the creativity that's inside young people and to encourage young voices to be heard and to develop a youth-led, Youth Arts Forum for the county.

The report *The Makings Fostering Youth Creativity* – currently evaluating print and design quotes for approval.

Child Protection Policies

In response to ongoing initiatives with Youth Arts it was legally required that we update all the arts Child Safeguarding Policies/statements plus produce a Child Safeguarding Policy specifically for online activities with guidelines for facilitators, this has been completed.

Anam Beo

The intergenerational music project with Andy Spearpoint is currently on hold as engagement for this project is with older people and young people (between 16 - 24 years) and a focus on the mental health and well-being of each demographic. Will work with Andy to see if there are any ways we can progress the project.

The Arts Office are one of the partners for an Arts Council funded award through their Invitation to Collaborate Funding – The lead partner in this project is Laois County Council Arts Office. The project is a regional project titled Mapping Arts

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Provision in Health Settings. Partner organizations are Laois County, County, Westmeath County Council, Offaly County Council, Music Generation OW, Anam Beo, Helium Arts, Waterford Healing Arts Trust (WHAT). The project members have held their first meeting and are in discussion with regards developing a brief for a researcher for the project.
