#### **Forward Planning**

The first stage of public consultation for the making of the draft Birr Local Area Plan 2023-2029 was carried out in May in accordance with Section 20(1) of the Planning and Development Act 2000 as amended which states that 'a planning authority shall take whatever steps it considers necessary to consult the minister, the OPR and the public before preparing a LAP including consultations with any local residents, public sector agencies, non-

governmental agencies, local community groups and commercial and business interests within the area'.

- A Public Consultation Issues Paper was placed on display on the Council's Birr LAP webpage, hard copies were placed for inspection at council offices and the Birr library.
- A newspaper notice was published in locally circulating newspapers advising of the Issues Paper and of a public consultation drop-in session.
- Public Consultation Drop-in Session at Birr Civic Offices 9th May 4-7pm
- Notification was provided on social media and to the Birr related PPN groups, Oireachtas members, elected members and members of the Land Use, Planning and Economic Development Strategic Policy Committee.
- Notification was sent to public sector agencies and non-governmental agencies inviting written submissions from them with a closing date of 20th May.

SEA Scoping report and accompanying notification sent to Environmental Authorities inviting submission by 13<sup>th</sup> June

#### Outdoor Recreational Infrastructure Scheme

#### *Grand Canal Greenway*

The stretch from Daingean to Edenderry is nearing completion, having been funded by a €3.1m allocation from the national government budget, 2021. This will bring the total length of greenway developed (including the Ballycommon branch) to c. 60km. An exercise will soon be undertaken to provide information and distance signage over the completed stretches to enhance the visitor experience. The Grand Canal

Greenway is currently being advertised on National radio By Offaly Tourism.

### **Just Transition Strand 2 Project - Lough Boora Connections**

The resurfacing and enhancement of approx.



9.5kms of walking & cycling trails in the Lough Boora

Discovery Park is nearing completion, having commenced in late 2021 as part of a €998,000 Just Transition grant. Please see pictures below.



This project, entitled Lough Boora Connections, will give extremely high quality access from the Grand Canal Greenway at Turraun lakes to the Lough Boora visitor centre via 'short' (4.2km) or 'longer' route (c.10km) options.



#### **Architecture / Heritage**

BHIS 2022: 27 applicants received Provisional Approval, total allocation of allocation of €126,400. Nine projects are currently on site varying from window repairs to structural and lime render repairs and thatch. Three projects are complete, 1 Eden Row (roof and lime render repair), Bloomfield Mausoleum structural repairs (with combined funding sources) and Clonavoe Thatch.

#### ROADS

#### **Roads Programme 2022:**

Roads Programme 2022: Delivery of the 2022 Roads programme continues across all of the Municipal District areas and is making good progress. As outlined in the Approved Roadworks Scheme for 2022, it is proving challenging to deliver the programme for the originally estimated budgets given recent fuel and materials inflation, which impacts all aspects of road construction and maintenance. It will now be necessary to revise the programme and each Municipal District will now identify reductions across specific headings and present to their respective Municipal District for approval in order to deliver the greatest percentage of the agreed programme. It is hoped that the extent of the reductions within the current program of works will be identified, discussed and agreed and implemented by Mid July 2022.

Killina Cycleway: The contract for the construction of the new walking and cycling track at Killina School, Killina, Rahan, Co. Offaly has now been awarded. Works on the scheme are due to commence in early July on completion of the Leaving Certificate exams.

Birr Distributor Road: Valid Tenders have been received for Technical Consultancy Services for the Birr Distributor Road. Approval to award this tender will be issued to the Department of Transport for approval and it is hoped that Design works will commence on this scheme in July 2022 subject to Department of Transport approval.

**N62 Corr Hill Pavement Scheme:** Tenders approval and contract award has been completed for the proposed pavement

strengthening works on 2.3Km of the N62 at Corr Hill. The works are due to commence onsite in Mid-June 2022 and are programmed to last 5 to 6 weeks.

#### **Edenderry Town Inner Relief Road:**

Works on the Edenderry Inner Relief Road Phase 1 are now substantially completed. A detailed Design of Phase 2 of the scheme has now been completed, reviewed and issued to the Department of Transport for assessment and approval to proceed to Tender.

LIS Program 2022: Offaly County Council received approval from the Department of Rural and Community Development to proceed with our submitted LIS scheme for 2022. The Roads Department have advertised for the submission of additional schemes across the County under this program in May 2022 so as to ensure that a program of schemes can be assessed, priced and programmed for future funding under the LIS program.

#### **ENVIRONMENT AND WATER**

### Climate Action: Climate Action Plan:

Decarbonized Zone (DZ): The DHLGH proposed DZ's which were to be "testbeds" of decarbonizing the economy and wider society, envisaged to be 12-24 months ahead of the CAP roll out, have been transferred to DECC and are now being encompassed into the LA CAP's.

A number of staff have completed the Green Teams National Programme training developed by the EPA to help organisations set up their own "Green Teams" from scratch.

The CCMA ran a workshop for LA Energy Performance Officers, which was attended by OCC staff, on DECC policy updates and DoT EV strategies. There were presentations on funding supports both nationally and from the EU.

3 Counties Energy Agency (3Cea), have been reappointed as energy consultants to the 5 MEA counties, which included Offaly. It is proposed to carry out an energy audit on 4 of OCC buildings before end of year.

#### **Environment:**

#### Litter & Waste Management:

We have received 341 litter and waste complaints.

Litter fines issued: 17 and we are in court on Monday with two illegal dumping cases. E&WS continues to provide an efficient service to the public regarding investigation of complaints

#### **Rural Water Programme:**

The Multi-Annual Rural Water Programme 2019 – 2021 is ongoing. Of the 19 projects awarded funding 14 are now complete and the remainder are due to be completed by the end of quarter 3/22 and the GWS committees are making good progress towards this target. In addition, three Group Water Schemes have been approved for funding for projects that have arisen during the term of the current funding programme and three more projects are awaiting confirmation from the Rural Water Uint.

The next Multi Annual Rural Water Programme circular and measures is due to be issued to Local Authorities in late 2022 and we are contacting all relevant Group Water Schemes to advise them to begin preparing their submissions. In advance of that, the Rural Water Unit have issued a circular and guidance for a new MARWP measure – A8 – Waste Water Collection and Treatment Needs for Villages and Settlements without access to Public Waste Water Services – a workshop on the new measure will be attended by OCC staff on 15/06/22.

Annual Group Water Scheme Subsidy Forms are being returned by the GWSs and we are currently calculating their subsidy payments. Any outstanding applications are due to be returned to OCC by 24/06/22

#### **Burial Grounds.**

The tenders for the extension of Kilcoursey cemetery have been assessed and the letter of Intent has been sent to the preferred tenderer. It is anticipated that works will take place in Q3.

#### **Veterinary**

OCC is continuing with its shared service agreement for veterinary services with Westmeath Co. Co. and we are providing veterinary inspection services in 12 abattoirs across both counties.

In the first quarter of 2022 a total of 59 stray or surrendered dogs were cared for by the Control of Dogs team. Of these, 12 dogs were reunited with their owners, 3 were rehomed directly from the Dog Shelter and 32 were rehomed by registered Animal Welfare charities, nine dogs remained in the Dog shelter at the end of the quarter. We have also had two successful prosecutions for control of dogs related issues in 2022.

#### **May Housing Update:**

- There are 503 on the Social Housing List awaiting housing support at the end of May 2022.
- A further 735 active tenancies are currently being supported under the Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) Scheme, 8 signed up for HAP and 21 exited from HAP in May.

• At the end of May, 17 single people and 10 families were being supported in emergency accommodation.

### **Housing Stock – Number, Maintenance & Repair:**

- Total housing stock at end of May 2022 is 1,985.
- 249 maintenance calls were logged in May.

#### **Housing Capital Programme Update:**

   The Stage 4 approval application was approved by the DHLGH on 24th February 2022. Project retendered with closing date in June using the new Public Works Form of Contract and a new Stage 4 application will lodge with the Department following due diligence with the lowest tenderer.

- Sycamore Drive, Ballycumber (9 Units) Stage 1 approval was granted by the Department on 11<sup>th</sup> May 2021. Design Team have been appointed and all surveys completed. Stage 2 will be lodged in Q2, 2022.

#### **Housing Grants (Private):**

Housing were notified on 28<sup>th</sup> March that the 2022 Allocation - Housing Adaptation

Grants for Older People and People with a Disability Scheme for private homes is €1,543,750 which composed is €1,235,000 funding exchequer (representing 80%), €308,750 and authority matching local funding (representing 20%) to be provided from Offaly County Council's own resources. Housing are progressing the 2022 works programme and continue to liaise with all applicants who have been approved for works in an effort to ensure that all works are progressing and to facilitate the timely drawdown of funds.

### Disabled Person's Grants (Social Housing):

On 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022 Housing were advised that the allocation for Disabled Person's Grants for Social Housing Units is €658,800 (representing 90%), with €65,880 matching local authority funding (representing 10%) is to be added from Offaly County Council's own resources.

#### **Retrofit Programme:**

The Council received notification on 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2021 of an increase in their allocation under 'Just Transition for the Midlands Region' programme to €4.2m.

Lot 1&2, Birr: The Contractor for the works has been appointed (Retrofit Design Ltd.) and works are in progress on the Birr houses. Completion in June 2022

Lot 3&4, Tullamore: Works are still awaiting Department funding approval.

Lot 5&6, Edenderry, Daingean, Clara, Ferbane, Shannonbridge, Cloghan: The appointed consultants have prepared the works tender which will be advertised on <a href="https://www.etenders.gov.ie">www.etenders.gov.ie</a>. When and if funding is approved by the DHLGH.

### LOCAL & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

### Offaly Community Response Forum

Minister Peter Burke visited Offaly in May to see first-hand the Offaly response to the Ukrainian crisis. The Community Response Forum has met 9 times since mid-March and continues to meet fortnightly to oversee the local response. Up to 400 Ukrainian refugees are located in currently. Offalv 14 member organisations attend the Community Forum and details of services and contacts are available on offaly.ie. An additional €5m has been announced nationally **SICAP** to support the

programme Ukrainian response.



*LEADER Projects* Eleven LEADER Projects were approved to the value of €271,330.68.

Community Response Forum: Members were briefed in relation to the ongoing work of the Community Forum in response to the emerging Ukrainian refugee crisis and advised that the inter-agency forum continue to meet on a regular basis with updates given from groups involved in managing the ongoing needs of the displaced. Members agreed that a continued coordinated, cooperative interagency approach will ensure efficient responses to optimise outcomes in the most challenging situation.

- The Age Friendly Interdepartmental Team within Offaly County Council met on 11th May to progress plans for Clara as the Age Friendly Pilot Town in Offaly.
- The Older Persons Convention took place in Trim on the 12 & 13th May and was well attended. Offaly OPC was represented by Frances Kawala and Declan Costello. The Regional

Age Friendly Manager and the Offaly Age Friendly Manager attended.

### ARTS Arts Programming

In the Open | Faoin Spéir: a collaborative partnership, led by Offaly County Council's Arts Office, including Birr



Theatre and Arts Centre and Birr Festivals Collective saw an array of programming with events taking place in Tullamore, Birr and Lough Boora. The

programme was completed in April and the Arts Office received an evaluation report in May. This demonstrated that In the Open had something for everyone and was based upon principles of inclusion and diversity. The events endeavoured to establish sustainable connections with underrepresented groups and communities and well as with the general public. Audiences including online and in person were over 17,000 for the duration of the project which was promoted via the Arts Office website and social media, along with all other partner media outlets.

# Creative Places: continues to develop its

continues to develop its programme led by Creative Lives in



partnership with Offaly County Council Arts Office and Edenderry Municipal District, with a host of opportunities for artists and communities coming down the line. A recent update on the project claimed that one of the strong messages that had emerged from the conversations with the local community is how much they value their own local artists. The 'Dancing Shoes'



project was able to support a number of dancers from Offaly and further afield to offer dance workshops to all ages. The workshops were offered for free. Following these, there have already been two new dance classes that have been set up in the town by local dancers. Creative Lives continue to work with existing initiatives such as the Edenderry Festival and Hullaballoo Festival to collaborate on opportunities for artists and creative engagement.

Art in the Landscape Seminar: The seminar took place at the end of May. The online seminar had over 240 people register for the event, showing huge interest in an exploration of the intersect between art in the landscape, culture, environment, tourism and social engagement. The

seminar was led by independent curators Studio Response and invited artists, curators, authors, and researchers to debate the multi-dimensional opportunities across various sectors and to share knowledge from local, national, and international examples of potential and explore cocollaborative ways of working that can inform future initiatives in Ireland and beyond. The seminar also presented a film of local participants who had engaged in artist workshops, expressing their own views on the future potential of Lough Boora Sculpture Park. Esker Arts: Work continues and great progress is being made with regards to the much anticipated opening of Esker Arts in 2022.

Edenderry Library and Arts Space: The Arts Office will be continuing to work in collaboration with the county librarian in the development of plans for a multipurpose arts space to be incorporated into the planning of the new library for Edenderry, this will include developments as part of the Creative Places Edenderry project.

Creative Ireland: Creative Ireland projects are underway, the Film Animation Residency has been selected and the new animators are in place in Birr.


Artist Support: The Arts Office continue to provide opportunities for artists to upskill and develop.

#### **Music Generation Offaly Westmeath Strategic Review Findings**

Music Generation Offaly Westmeath (MGOW) was established in 2013 as a twocounty Local Music Education Partnership Area (LMEP), comprising Laois Offaly TB, Longford Westmeath ETB, Westmeath County Council and Offaly County Council as Lead Partner. Over the past nine years the programme has grown substantially. In preparation for its new 5-year phase of development, the statutory partners undertook a strategic review to examine in detail the current two-county model from structural. governance, finance and resources, operations, workforce, partnership, local factors, and programming perspectives.

Based on the findings and recommendations of this review, the local partners have decided that in order to secure the longer-term quality, growth and sustainability of Music Generation in Co.



Offaly and Co. Westmeath a re-structuring of the current two-county model into two distinct LMEP Areas is now required. The lead partner for Westmeath Music Generation will be Longford Westmeath ETB while the lead partner for Offaly Music Generation will be Laois Offaly ETB.

Following an assessment of the strategic review and its findings, the Board of Music Generation has accepted this proposal and fully supports the decision of the local partners, in order to bring MGOW in line with established national structures.

As Music Generation is now approaching national coverage, it is timely that the current arrangements for MGOW are brought in line with established national LMEP Area structures. The management committee of the MGOW partnership is committed to planning for a careful and strategic move to the new structures that, ultimately, will achieve the best possible outcomes for children and young people in both counties from 2023.

The MGOW board now wishes to advise all stakeholders involved in MGOW of the plan to align with the 1 county model in place across the country and to support everyone affected by the change process with information and communication. Of paramount importance in this process are the MG staff and musicians as well as local and national partners and funders. In the coming weeks and months, a number of opportunities will be provided to engage all



stakeholders on the change process and its implications.

While the official commencement of the new structures will happen from January 1st 2023, the period from September to December 2022 (the new school term) will be a key transition period where services will start to streamline on a county by county basis and will be branded as MG Offaly and MG Westmeath.







#### **Funding News**

Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys, announced on June 8<sup>th</sup> the launch of a series of new initiatives that will make remote working more accessible and attractive for thousands

of people. One of these initiatives is the



An Roinn Forbartha Tuaithe agus Pobail Department of Rural and Community Development

Connected Hubs Voucher Scheme, which will give remote workers free use of their local digital hub.

Another initiative announced is the Connected Hubs Call 2022 which is a €5m

investment to improve 81 remote working facilities nationwide.

We are delighted to report **streamBIRR** have been awarded funding under this initiative of €24,952.50 which will be used to upgrade existing facilities, branding and signage and also the purchase of two specialised sound proofed booths to allow for privacy and podcasting/ recording facility for members of the hub. This funding will also provide for the purchase of air purifying equipment and the installation of a Bike Rack to promote Active Travel.

We are pleased to say that hubs in Offaly have been awarded a total of €311,751 in funding as part of Connected Hubs Call

2022, which is funded by the



Department of Rural and Community Development, This initiative is to support and complement the development of the National Hub Network, which is a key action of the Rural Development Policy - Our Rural Future and also the National Remote Working Strategy – Making Remote Work. The Connected Hubs Call 2022 aims to add additional capacity to the existing remote working infrastructure in Ireland by upgrading existing hubs and Broadband Connection Points (BCPs).

€149,000 of this funding is for 5 Broadband Connection Points in Birr, Moneygall, Rhode, Roscrea and Tullamore. This investment will support the BCPs in growing their remote working offering in rural areas of the county, providing local remote workers and students alike with modern facilities such as defibrillators.

charge points for Electric Vehicles and office and kitchen facilities. Full details of the funding are available on the Offaly Local Enterprise page.

The other initiative announced is that all local authorities will receive €50,000 in funding to promote remote working opportunities in their areas. We look forward to promoting Offaly as the best place in the country to work in.

### **Innovation and Remote Working Hubs update**

The Just Transition Fund is providing 85% of the funding (€476,000) for the expansion of **The Junction**. The expansion project involves the conversion of a current warehouse at 25J into high-end office spaces for new and growing enterprises creating 3,000 sq. ft. of additional office space. This will create spaces tailored for current and future work demands such as a podcast/presentation room.

The current project status is that planning permission has been granted and a project manager is currently being sought through e-Tenders.

In the 2021 Connected Hubs Call, The Junction were awarded €75,000 which resulted in a new layout in 19H to increase capacity. There is a new 3 desk office and 7 new desks added to the shared workplace bringing capacity there to 15. In total at 19H there are 5 own door offices, including one very large ground floor office. Currently, all offices are occupied. There are 15 desks in the shared office, of which 6 are available as hot desks. In 25J there are 4 own door offices. All are occupied as is a warehouse which is rented by one of our members.

streamBIRR is centrally located in the Birr Technology Centre. Current facilities provide for five offices, a conference room, and has recently expanded to include a nine desk shared cowork area that incorporates a small meeting room. The shared cowork space and adjoining meeting room is the latest demand led expansion that is



facilitating a growing hub community. All five offices are tenant occupied with recent onboarding of the OFFline Film Festival Animation Residency and dedicated I-LOFAR research office. The provision of hot desks, office space, training facility, meeting rooms and the close connection to LEO Offaly, Enterprise Ireland, IDA, I-LOFAR, TUS Midwest, TCD and DIAS attracts a diverse range of start-ups and remote workers.

#### In the spotlight!

In May, streamBIRR were delighted to contribute an article to the Sunday Business

Post – Working Life that provide advice and direction when considering the setup of a remote work hub in a rural location.





Also in in May 2022, a European case study prepared for the SFEC (Sustainable Futures for Enterprise Centres) in 2021 that looked at best sustainable business practice for remote work hubs was published and highlights The Junction Tullamore as a model of note.
