Forward Planning

A public consultation drop-in session was held at Edenderry Town Hall on 19th September 2022 in relation to the making of the future draft Edenderry LAP. Seven people expressed their views on the future development of Edenderry.

Residential Zoned Land Tax

The Residential Zoned Land Tax (RZLT) was announced in Central Government's Budget 2022 and was introduced into Part 22A of the Taxes Consolidation Act 1997 by the Finance Act 2021. The principal purpose of the RZLT is to encourage the timely activation of zoned and serviced

residential development land for housing. Ministerial Guidelines The titled 'Residential Zoned Land Tax – Guidelines for Planning Authorities June 2022' clarifies the requirements for planning authorities in relation to RZLT. In order to implement this tax measure, local authorities are required to undertake mapping to identify lands in-scope for the tax, with provisions allowing those landowners identified as being within the scope to make submissions and appeal. The draft map of these lands will be placed on public display from 1st November 2022 until 1st January 2023. The administration of the tax will be undertaken by the Revenue Commissioners, with the tax in effect by 2024.


Architecture

- BHIS 2022: <u>27 applicants</u> received Provisional Approval, total allocation of allocation of €126,400. 7 withdrawn, 20 projects complete to complete with all payments through by mid-October. Final forms then to Department.
- HSF 2022: Three projects underway and grant allocations carried out, Lowland House (€38k) – window repairs, Tullamore Gaol (€25) - railings and wall repair and Cloneyhurke House (€38k) – arch, steps and render repair.
- Creative Ireland –Annual Follies Project €10,000, Bloomfield Mausoleum complete, site visits reports etc. Vernacular Architecture fund projects - €5,000
- Follies Trust –Repairs of Bloomfield Mausoleum €3,500, complete
- Heritage Council Stewardship Funding: €15,000 approved for OCC, 4 new Offaly projects. Funding includes edits and printing costs for new

publication - Traditional Architecture in Offaly by Rachel Mc Kenna, to printer October 2022, c.286 pages. Hawkswood Dowry Chest – repairs complete $\notin 1,300$. Lime Workshop Birr Heritage School – complete.



 CMF – application by AP, Emmel Castle roof repairs underway to be monitored by Architect, €85,000 funding. Department meeting on site – secured additional €15,000 funding for this project bringing it to the maximum grant of €100,000.



REGENERATION

Streetscape Enhancement Measure

Tuesday 30^{th} August, 2022 Minister Humphreys announced the successful nominated towns under the Streetscape Enhancement Measure 2022. Clara is Offaly's town for this Measure in 2022. As 60 applications were submitted due to the great assistance of Clara Tidy Towns and Regeneration team personnel, the eligible grant of €100,000 was well oversubscribed. 40 properties were selected and are now sent to Department for final approval on 7th of October.

Croí Cónaithe

On 14th July, 2022 Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage Darragh O'Brien TD announced the new Croí Cónaithe (Towns) Fund. The new fund will provide grants of up to a maximum of €30,000 for the refurbishment of vacant properties for occupation as a principal private residence. Where the refurbishment costs are expected to exceed the standard grant of up to €30,000, a maximum top-up grant amount of up to €20,000 will be available where the property is confirmed by the applicant to be derelict (i.e. structurally unsound and dangerous) bringing the total grant available for a derelict property up to a maximum of €50,000.

The Regeneration Section, Derelict/Vacant properties staff have received 40 queries about the fund since it was officially launched.

Applications received to date

- 13 application forms with supporting documentation.
- 1 successful application has been approved, 2 pending approval.
- 10 other applications were not approved due to being outside the

criteria or due to incomplete application forms.

On the 29th September the fund was expanded to allow the provision of funding for applicants to purchase existing serviced sites.

Some of the main conditions of the grant are as follows,

- There is a grant of up €30,000 to refurbish a vacant property, there is also a maximum top up grant of €20,000, (total of €50,000) if the property is derelict and structurally unsound and dangerous, this will have to be confirmed by a quantity surveyor or engineer.
- The building has to have been vacant for at least two years and have been built before 1993, confirmation of vacancy must be confirmed.
- Applicants will have to also submit other documentation such as Tax clearance, proof or ownership or actively negotiating to buy a property, a quotation for the construction works, local property tax and others demands.
- Persons availing of the grant must live in the property when the work is completed and will have to provide proof of residence.
- The grant is for properties located in a town or villages currently and this is being revised currently.

Town and Village Renewal Scheme

The Department of Rural and Community Development announced a call for TVR 2022 funding on 27th May, 2022. 10 applications were developed and prepared in a very quick turnaround time by Regen Team in conjunction with other relevant sections, community groups and stakeholders for the closing date 22nd July, 2022. Applications are now being assessed by the DRCD and announcements pending hopefully in Q4 2022.

ROADS

Roads Programme 2022

The annual Roads programme is ongoing with works substantially completed across specific funding programs.

Emergency Repairs on our Roads constructed over Peat Subgrades

Due to the extended dry spell during the months of August and September, we have experienced significant failures across our Road Network constructed over Peat subgrades. In recognition of the Health and

Safety risks associated with these failures, we have received approval for the reallocation of our Peat Roads Pilot monies towards these necessary interventions. We have further secured additional monies to assist in these interventions across the County. These emergency-targeted works have been agreed and are ongoing currently in order to mitigate the highest risk locations. The main risk factors affecting the delivery of these works are weather conditions and contractor availability. Both of which we believe we can manage and mitigate if they arise.

Active Travel Works

Active Travel works are ongoing throughout the County. The majority of the approved schemes for 2022 have commenced and are currently at either design stage, procurement stage or construction stage.

Procurement for Technical Consultancy Services for the Spollenstown Pedestrian Bridge and the Birr Riverside Walk scheme are now approaching award stage.

Tenders have been issued for Badgers Lane in the Edenderry Municipal District, and Brockagh Road Mucklagh in the Tullamore Municipal District in September. Outstanding Tenders for footpath improvement on Spollenstown Road. Tullamore and Ballycumber will be issued in early October.

Offaly County Council have issued a Pathfinder proposal for consideration to the Department of Transport for the construction of pedestrian and cycling links to the Grand Canal Greenway throughout the County.

National Road Pavement Improvements TII funding has been received in September under the HD28 works program for targeted upgrades on roads sections only at the Cloncollig Roundabout on the N52 and on the southbound approach to the N52/N80 roundabout in Tullamore.

ENVIRONMENT AND WATER SERVICES

Climate Action& Energy

The Climate Action steering group Bulbs 4 Bulbs initiative ran for the week of $12^{th}-16^{th}$ September with fair exchanges at 4 locations. This initiative saw 5000 pollinator friendly flower bulbs being distributed among staff in exchange for recycled light bulbs.



The library service are currently running their Positive Age Week where they are providing pollinator friendly bulbs in attractive gift bags to age appropriate patrons.

All initiatives were registered with the Department for Environment, Climate and Communication for the SDG Week.

Offaly County Council are signed up for the OPW's "Optimising Power at Work". This is a 100% free programme provided by the OPW where they install energy metering

equipment to monitor energy consumption, they prepare detailed energy awareness campaigns, they appoint energy conservation specialists to optimize settings in buildings i.e. summer/winter settings, organize staff awareness days, conduct annual out of hours audits, and issue monthly and annual reports on energy consumption.

This is in conjunction with SEAI's "Reduce Your Use" staff awareness campaigns. This is in line with recent Department guidelines requiring public buildings to reduce their energy consumption by 15% over the next six months.

Offaly library services have 8 Home Energy Saving Kits (funded by OCC CA) available for hire. An order for 1000 Guide to Home Energy Savings booklets has been placed, and we hope to have those in the coming week or two. Both the kits and booklets have been developed by Codema, Dublin's energy agency.

Environment

Community groups in Offaly have undertaken 231 litter picks, with pickers and bags supplied by OCC.

Solar compaction litter bins

Offaly County Council has installed 10 solar compaction litter bins since April and these have proved to be very successful. This type of unit can hold up to 8 times more waste than the standard 120 litre street bins.

Using a sensor, these state-of-the-art bins determine the amount waste in a bin and compact the waste, when required, to provide more holding capacity. When they are ready to be emptied, they send an electronic message to council staff. This new technology will mean fewer collections, lower collection costs and fewer emissions. In addition, the fullyenclosed design means they are bird and vermin-proof, can be operated using a foot pedal and provide data on which streets generate the most binned litter.

Water Services

There are a number of schemes being designed, developed and constructed around the County.

A few of these include:

Ardan, Birr & Clonaslee WTP

The three new water treatment plants at Ardan, Birr and Clonaslee are all commissioned (with the exception of some minor snags and outstanding paperwork). During the upgrade works the plants were operated by the DBO contractor and OCC expect to take back direct operation of all three in early 2023.

In the **Leak Reduction Programme (Find** & **Fix)** Works are ongoing in Birr, Doon, Edenderry, Rhode and Tullamore.



Tullamore commenced the celebrations of the 400th Anniversary of the beginning of the Township of Tullamore with a historic family day in Millennium Square, Main Street, Tullamore on Friday 30th September 2022 from 2pm to 6pm.

The event included an outdoor exhibition of 400 years of Tullamore 1622 to 2022 which will be displayed in the Áras. The event was opened by Joey Mooney, playing the bagpipes to commence the event with the Cathaoirleach of OCC, Cllr Frank Moran and Cathaoirleach of TMD Cllr Neil Feighery.

17[™] OCTOBER 2022

Local historian Michael Byrne of Offaly History gave a speech on the history of the town followed by local songwriter and musician Dominic Madden including his song *Tullamore I Miss You* and poet Cormac Lally, with his poems including *Tullamore Poem*. Tullamore Comhaltas brought the evening to a close at 6pm.



It was a successful day with support from the local businesses on Main Street to

commence the Tullamore 400 celebrations and encourage interested groups arrange will their own Tullamore 400 celebrations throughout the year in the Town.

LOCAL & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Local Community Development Committee (LCDC)

Offaly LCDC held their monthly meeting on Thursday 8th September, 2022. Main agenda items included the Rural Development LEADER Programme 2014 -2020 & Transitional LEADER Programme 2021 – 2022, Local Economic Community Plan (LECP) (Update), Community Activities Fund (CAF) 2022 (Update) and Community Response Forum (Update).

LEADER Projects

Four LEADER Projects were approved to the value of $\notin 27,841.52$.

LECP

Members were updated in relation to progress on the preparation of the new Local Economic Community Plan, due for completion in 2023. An Advisory Steering Group (ASG), which meets bi-monthly, was set up in May 2022 in order to assist in preparing. drafting. adopting. implementing and monitoring of the LECP and a Terms of Reference has been agreed by the members. The LECP Guidelines require both economic elements and community elements. Draft high level goals are currently being developed by the ASG. The Offaly Economic Development Strategy Plan will be available shortly and it will feed into the LECP. Eighty business stakeholders were consulted, also students and education providers. Baseline data has been collected in relation to Key Economic Indicators, Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) trends.

Community Activities Fund (CAF) 2022 (update)

Members were provided with a detailed account of the CAF scheme that had been approved by Offaly LCDC in early 2022.

The one-off fund of €277,102 was used to support not for profit community and voluntary groups in Offaly with non-pay running costs e.g. utility bills; capital repairs and improvements to facilities and purchase of equipment. The sum of €64,557 of the fund was ring fenced to help support community playgrounds for upgrades and maintenance costs. The hugely successful scheme saw 136 groups across the county approved for funding. Details were provided to the members on the funding allocations across different community streams and the progress on payments to date.

Community Response Forum (update) Members were advised that the Community Response Forum continues to coordinate the response to the Ukraine crisis. The Forum, consisting of key local agencies, continues to meet on a regular basis to share information and updates. The total number of Ukrainians in Offaly has increased in recent months, with the majority of families accommodated in Tullamore, Birr, Portarlington and Moneygall. All agencies play important roles in responding to the needs of the families. An update on the various programmes and supports being provided was outlined to the members.

Comhairle Na nÓg

Highlights this month:

 In September Comhairle Na nÓg members presented to a Greek Delegation as part of an Exchange EU programme, which took place in the Council Chamber. The Exchange EU Programme is an initiative of the EU Platform for Coal Regions in Transition and this event was organised to enable similar regions in transition to share common experiences and gain knowledge and learnings from each other. The regions of Western Macedonia and the Midlands have similar characteristics in terms of development population, & landscape. Comhairle Na nÓg Executive Members represented the Youth Voice – Being heard in Just Transition. The group raised the issue of the lack of awareness raising that has been done on the Just Transition and the need for more engagement and consultation with young people on the topic as it will impact their lives, deeply.

- Niamh, Offaly's National Youth Assembly Representative, attended the Assembly Catch up Meeting. The Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment requested engagement with young people in relation to Artificial Intelligence as part of the first Strand of its Strategy - AI- Here for Good.
- Comhairle members have been preparing for their AGM, which is taking place in October.

Public Participation Network

September was a very busy month for Offaly PPN. We held the first Offaly Social Inclusion Week, a countywide initiative with social inclusion supports and services opening their doors to the public. Planning for this project was ongoing for a number of months.

Promotion of the Age Friendly Business Recognition Programme is underway with online training commencing in October 2022.

ARTS

The Arts Office Funding Applications

The Arts Office have submitted two funding application to the Arts Council, one for annual partnership funding for the arts programme 2023, plus an application for the Invitation to Collaboration which is a proposed collaborative project that will take place at Lough Boora Sculpture Park and Tir Saile in County Mayo in 2023.

FilmOffaly Awards 2021

The Arts Office FilmOffaly Award 2021 winner Mixed Bag Media's film Personal Space will be premiered at the 2022 OFFline Film festival in October.

FilmOffaly Review

The Arts Office have put out a call for a researcher to carry out a review of Film in Offaly. The review will examine the development of film production and the film sector in Offaly to date and will offer recommendations for the potential growth of Film in Offaly going forward. The report will focus on the developments of the film commission FilmOffaly, the Offaly County Council Arts Office and Creative Ireland Film and animation programmes, and other key film activity that takes place in the county. The purpose being to demonstrate the value of Film to the county as a social, cultural and economic driver.

Birr Writer's Residency

The Arts Office provided funding for the delivery of the Birr Writer's Residency, which is now underway. Five writers selected to the residency programme for 2022, included an additional residency or a writer to work in schools through Irish as part of their residency.

Culture Night 2022

15 large scale events across Offaly at 13 venues with over 90 artists involved. The night attracted almost 800 people with huge engagement on social media with a dedicated campaign on the Culture Night Offaly Facebook Page reaching 26, 023 There were four specially people. commissioned art works for Culture Night, 'Follow The Leader' by Donlon Dance Company, Tullamore, 'Palimpsest' by Eileen Casey and Emma Barone in Birr, 'The Black River Of Herself' by Sheila and Patrick Hough in Banagher and 'Neart Fir/Strength Of Men' with Eugene O Brien and guests in Edenderry. In its twelfth year, Culture Night Offaly had a focus on diversity, inclusion and community in the eclectic cultural programme that reflected the cultural exuberance within the county.



The first fully in-person programme delivered since 2019 attracted huge media interest and community participation from all sectors with culturally diverse events and an event with Offaly Travellers proving hugely popular. Two events 'The Black River of Herself' (Banagher) and 'Neart Fir'



(Edenderry) made national news several times, being selected as top pick's in The Irish Times, Journal.ie and RTÉ out of 1,700 events nationwide. Culture Night featured prominently across all local media, making front page of the Offaly Topic.





As well as fifteen events programmed across the County, the big reveal in recent weeks, was the announcement that Offaly's Lough Boora

would be the location for RTÉ's live National Culture Night broadcast. Tullamore's Tolü Makay opened the show, in an exciting collaboration between RTÉ, Offaly Arts Office and Music Generation Offaly Westmeath.

A choir performing during this year's Culture Night celebration featured children Music Generation from Offaly's Tullamore-based partner primary schools in St. Joseph's N.S. and Scoil Eoin Phóil. Joined by members of the Singfest Regional Choirs, this unique intergenerational choir sang the stunning 'Aye' with Tolü Makay, Felispeaks and the RTÉ Concert Orchestra. The performance can be enjoyed on the RTÉ player for those who missed the live show. Culture Night is co-funded by the Arts Council.

Planning for Hullabaloo Children's Art Festival has been taking place since July with partner organisations, Offaly County Council Arts Office, Birr Theatre and Arts Centre, Clara

Resource Centre and Offaly Libraries. Collaboration has also taken place with artists and organisations in Edenderry and Tullamore. This year the programme is fully back with in-person events at all locations. The festival will take place 2nd-5th November. The full programme of events is now being distributed and the booking is open

Mini Movie

The Arts Office are again running the Mini Movies programme in schools this year. Film maker Julie Forrester will be working in Banagher College, St Rynagh's NS and St Mary's NS in Banagher and the film created by students will be showcased as part of the OFFline Film Festival in Birr later in the year.

Creative Places in Edenderry continues to develop its programme led by Creative Lives in partnership with Offaly County Council Arts Office and Edenderry Municipal District, with a host of opportunities for artists and communities on the way. A recent update on the project claimed that one of the strong messages that had emerged from the conversations with the local community is how much they value their own local artists.

CAPITAL PROJECTS Arts Infrastructure Strategy

The Arts infrastructure Strategy for the County continues to be progressed by People Places Consulting: Caoimhín Corrigan and Siobhán O'Malley. The strategy will explore how all the Arts Infrastructure (existing and planned) can be developed in a collaborative and harmonic manner, resulting in a cohesive, complimentary and self-sustaining network of arts infrastructure that is beneficial to the whole county.

Esker Arts

Work continues to great progress and the much awaited opening of the new art centre is drawing closer. The Esker Arts board of management have recently begun a recruitment drive and positions for jobs in the Arts Centre have been advertised locally and nationally.



Edenderry Library and Arts Space

The Arts Office will be continuing to work in collaboration with the county librarian in the development of plans for a multipurpose arts space to be incorporated into the planning of the new library for Edenderry, this will include developments as part of the Creative Places Edenderry project.

HEALTHY OFFALY
