It brings together communities, families, organisations, cultural institutions, academics and enthusiasts, to build awareness about the value of heritage and support its conservation.



Storytelling Homes Exhibition

For the month of August including National Heritage Week, Tullamore Chatters and Matters Group are proud to present their exhibition, 'Storytelling Homes' this August in Tullamore Library.

The exhibition comprises of a series of miniature wooden models created by the



group over the past few months that serve as visual representations of their culture, their homes, their childhood memories, and of their ancestors.

Oein De Bhairduin, writer and Traveller Culture Collection Development Officer at the National Museum of Ireland, will launch the exhibition in Tullamore Library on Thursday, August 14th at 6pm.

The exhibition will remain **on display in Tullamore Library for the duration of August.**

This collection is the culmination of a project led by visual artist Teresa Doyle, assisted by Tullamore Travellers Men's Shed, and kindly funded by Offaly County Council's Creative Ireland Community Grant programme, 2025 - 2027.

Seen and Heard: Exhibition and Talk Exploring Children's Rights in Ireland



This Heritage Week, discover how **Birr**, Co Offaly became the birthplace of one of the world's earliest child protection laws the Cáin Adomnáin, written in 679AD. The **Museum of Childhood Ireland** has worked with artist Fergal McCarthy to create a thought-provoking exhibition in **Birr Library** exploring the history of children's rights in Ireland.

Seen and Heard Drop-in Workshops, Birr Library 10:30 am-12:30 pm

Take part in drop-in workshops with artist Fergal McCarthy that delve into the history of children's rights in Ireland. A specially-created suitcase with interactive games and activities about children's rights will stay with the exhibition in Birr Library until Saturday 23 August. Open to all ages.

Seen and Heard Panel Discussion, 1:30-3:00 pm

The Museum of Childhood Ireland will host a Seen and Heard Talk: From Cáin Adomnáin to Today - Exploring the Evolution of Children's Rights in Ireland. A panel of historians and children's rights advocates will trace the development of children's rights from early Irish law to present day protections and future ambitions.

A copy Cáin Adomnáin, illustrated by artist Caroline Conway, is on permanent display in Birr Library.

No booking is required for the Seen and Heard Drop-In Workshops from 10:30 am-12:30 pm and these are open to children of all ages.

Unstitching the Shinrone Gown

The Shinrone Gown, a remarkably well preserved early 17th Century Irish dress was discovered in Cangort Bog, Shinrone in 1843.

Commissioned by the Shinrone Heritage group and painstakingly recreated by local craftswomen Rosalind Fanning and Bernie Stapleton, with the goal of engaging the community and exploring Irish history, the replica will be on display in Edenderry Library from 16th August. It will be accompanied by a short documentary exploring the history and making of the gown.

Unstitching the Shinrone Gown is a celebration of craft, heritage, and imagination. It proves that history doesn't need to remain behind glass—it can be lived, touched, recreated, and shared.

To coincide with this exhibition, Fashion Historian, Laura Fitzachery will discuss the history of the Irish dress in Edenderry Library on Wednesday 27th August, 18:30 pm.







En vogue: Fashionable Irish women from the 15th to the 17th century

The Late Medieval period and Middle Ages saw a distinct form of dress emerge among aristocratic women of Europe. From elaborate headdresses to intricate outerwear, such fashions also reached Ireland.

This talk will aim to look at Irish dress through the lens of European fashion history with particular focus on the Shinrone gown.

Laura Fitzachary is a historian and historical consultant based in Dublin, Ireland. She is known online as @seekthehistoric where she delves into the history of art, beauty, fashion and archaeology.
