Thursday 14th January, 8pm

Featuring two Cork musicians, the Carducci Quartet is one of the longest established and most admired string quarters on the world stage. They return for their latest tour of Ireland with a beautiful programme including one of Shostakovich's finest string quarters, marking the 50th anniversary of his death in 1975.

Highly celebrated for their interpretation of contemporary repertoire, the Carducci Quartet has curated many diverse projects and is regularly invited to preform new works. Recent and upcoming premieres include works by Simon Rowland-Jones, Gavin Higgins, Karl Jenkins, Jonny Greenwood and Kate Whitley. In 2015 they curated projects around Philip Glass and Steve Reich as part of the Royal Philharmonic Society Award winning 'Minimalism Unwrapped' at Kings Place in London.

Wednesday 26th February, 8pm

The world is drowning in this exquisite dive into troubled waters by Ireland's Blue Raincoat Theatre Company, touring the fourth of a series of devised shows after premiering in Sligo in 2022. It's there in the stormy seas conjured up by the five people on stage who use shadow puppets, model houses and all manner of impressionistic techniques to make their point without having to hector or harangue. Director Niall Henry's exquisitely realised construction focuses on a pearl diver and her struggles to survive with her daughter in the face of a seismic typhoon. With houses blown away and boats wrecked by waves, the seabed has become a junkyard, and the chances of finding buried treasure are rare.

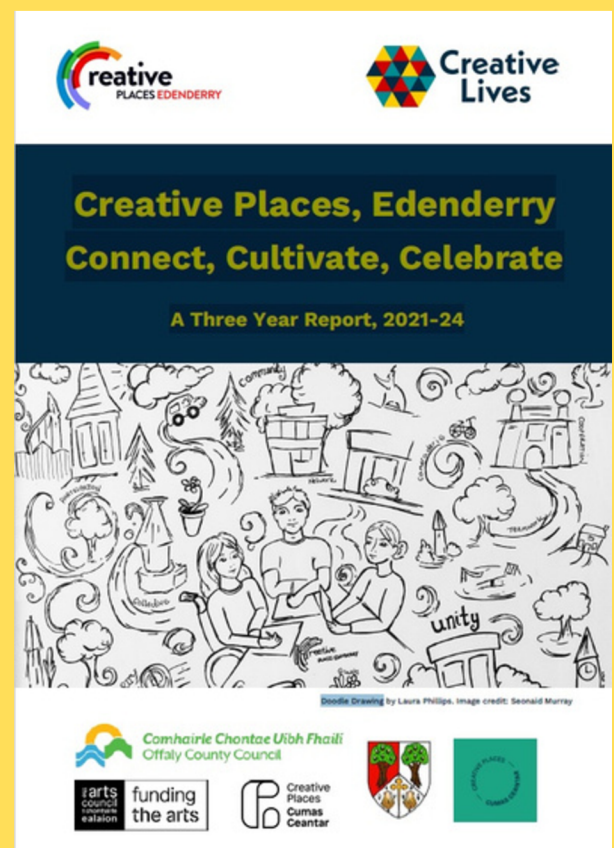
CP Edenderry 3 Year Report **'Connect, Cultivate, Celebrate'**

Gathering 2025 Freelance Artist Bursaries Support

Offaly County Council Arts Office is offering 2 bursaries for arts practitioners based in the Offaly area to attend the Performing Arts Forum Gathering in Limerick on 27 and 28 May 2025.

Hundreds of artists, arts workers and arts organisation people from arts centres and production companies, festivals and funders are getting together in Limerick for two days of conversation, provocation, and inspiration. Sessions will take place in the Lime Tree Theatre with an artistic programme on the first evening of the event. The event happens from approx. lunch time on 27 May to a late lunch on 28 May.

Each Artist Bursary will cover:

- Ticket to Performing Arts Forum Limerick Gathering (includes all day sessions, two lunches, dinner, coffee breaks and the artistic programme)
- Artist Honorarium of €150
- Accommodation and Travel Contribution of €150 (To be arranged by the artist - see www.performingartsforum.ie for details of accommodation deals)

Creative Ireland **Grant Programme** **NOW OPEN**



Offaly County Council, with financial support from the Creative Ireland programme, seeks to award grants to communities and artists working together to explore and present aspects of Offaly's heritage through varying art forms. These grants will range from incubator grants (exploring a project idea) to project delivery grants. Projects may be phased over a few years¹, exploring concepts and developing relationships between the artist and community in year one and building on this in future years.

It is envisaged that grants will range from €250 - €1,500 for incubator /exploratory concept grants and developing the artists' work with the community – to a range of projects supported up to €5,000, with grants up to €8,000 (awarded for the delivery of exceptional projects).

The closing date for receipt of submissions is noon on Friday 21 February 2025

At the end of January we will be launching the FilmOffaly Short Film Award for 2025. As part of this we are holding a launch night at Esker Arts, Tullamore on 29th January. Since its inception in 2009 the award has fostered creative filmmaking and compelling cinematic storytelling-all shot entirely in Offaly.

During the evening there will be screenings of previous award winners, many of which have gone on to win accolades on the film festival circuit. There will also be an opportunity to hear more about the award, and a chance to network afterwards. We're especially keen on organising regular meetups for the Offaly filmmaking community and hope this will be the first of such events. This evening will be a great night out for those working in the industry, cinema enthusiasts and the curious alike.

Elsewhere, 2024's FilmOffaly award winner *For The Cure* completed principal photography in Banagher in early November and is currently in post-production. The film used local extras, production assistants, catering and props.

Upon wrapping Director Conor McCormick said 'Offaly's been a lovely place to shoot in. We found everyone really helpful, and such a kindness and openness with having our whole crew here. Getting to work with the local people has been a dream.'
