Fishamble returns for a limited tour of its multi award-winning HEAVEN by Eugene O'Brien, following its hugely successful Off-Broadway, Edinburgh, and Off-West End runs. Irish Times Best New Play Award Irish Times Best Actress Award Scotsman Fringe First Award Heaven is set in the Irish midlands, during the weekend of a local wedding. Mairead and Mal are struggling to keep their marriage together. Perhaps attending a wedding will help, or it might raise questions that are difficult to answer.





Vanbrugh & Friends Saturday 29th March, 8pm

The Vanbrugh and their guests present two highly contrasted works from the string quintet repertoire.

Mozart's miraculously joyful and relaxed C major string quintet dates from the spring of 1787. More adjectives have been heaped on this music: elegant, sublime, majestic, bewitching... call it what you will, they are all testament to its timeless appeal.

Brahm's wrote two magnificent quintets for string quartet plus an extra viola. For each of these works he provided the option for the clarinet part to be played on the viola and so created four treasured additions to the viola as well the clarinet repertoire. In the quintet the qualities of the viola bring a different perspective to one of Brahms' most loved works.

Sharon Shannon Saturday 12th April, 8pm

In June 1989 Sharon was rehearsing and demoing tracks for her first album, when she was whisked away to the Glastonbury festival with The Waterboys. In the 30 years that have elapsed since then, Sharon has recorded 10 studio albums, 5 live albums, 4 'Best of...' compilations and 3 live concert DVDs. She has received many awards including being the youngest ever recipient of the Meteor Lifetime Achievement Awards in 2009. In 2023 Sharon released a new compilation album Now and Then to celebrate 30 years at the forefront of Irish Music.
