Go gcuirfí gach seirbhís poiblí, foirmeacha agus foilseacháin le fáil dátheangach - i dtús i nGaeilge (gnáth-cló) agus béarla sa dara áit (cló iodálach). 2. Go mbeadh oifigeach Gaeilge lonnaithe san Chontae chun freastal ar Gaelgeoirí ina conaí i Uíbh Fhailí, agus tiomnaithe maidir le dul chun cinn don Gaeilge. 3. Go mbeadh an ceart ag gach saoránach lonnaithe i Uíbh Fhailí an leagan Gaeilge dá n-ainm aug dá seoladh baile á úsaid as Gaeilge. 4. Go mbeadh gach comhartha bóithre as seo amach le Gaeilge sa céad áit (gnáth cló) agus an béarla (cló iodálach) sa dara áit - mar shampla: TULACH MHÓR / Tullamore (*italics*) 5. Go mbeadh na comhartha bóithre atá ann anois á iompú chuig an Ghaeilge san céad áit and an leagan béarla (cló iodalach) de réir a chéile. 6. Go meadh na moltaí atá luaite i bhfeidhm, ní amháin idir 2021 - 2017, ach go leanúnach as seo amach. In the public consultation - issues paper, the aim is to achieve transition to a ... low carbon, climate resilient and environmentally economy The proposed Plan for 2021 - 2017 shall be in compliance with an agreement for the rehabilitation of the cutaway bogs in Offaly and the Midland region in general. An agreement was established in 1995 between the EC and the minister for energy and enterprise at the time (Michael Lowry) as our first commitment to Kyoto (1997) that the cutaway bogs were to be planted, landscaped and flooded for tourist and amenity benefit. Offaly county council, in giving planning permission to Edenderry Power was in full knowledge of this long term plan for the cutaway bogs. It must be implemented in the proposed plan. In summary, we are now in climate and biodiversity crisis. For your information, [REDACTED] and I are co-ordinating the implementation of this plan and look forward to your co-operation via the Plan etc. on this critical issue.
