3. Regeneration/Project Updates

Andrew Murray, A/Director of Services informed the Members that the results of successful TVR schemes are out, noting the application for Kilmalogue was unsuccessful. Mr. Murray noted that we are expecting an update very shortly in relation to the Rural Regeneration Development Funding for the new Library/Arts space and we are examining requirements of a very complex application form in relation to the new Large Scale Sports Infrastructure Fund.

Cllr. Fitzpatrick noted how Tullamore and Birr have been successful in TVR funding and even though Kilmalogue has been turned down there is still a lot of work going on there, stating he would have preferred if the total monies received through this funding stream were divided out through the three Municipal Districts.

Mr. Murray stated that the intention is to provide a Portarlington Masterplan that could be used as leverage for any future applications that may be submitted.

All queries raised by the Members were addressed by Mr. Briody.

Cllr. Cribbin confirmed that himself and Cllr. Quinn had recently attended a meeting with Bord Na Móna, noting their recent partnership with Amazon and a €1.5bn investment in North Offaly.

Cllr. Quinn raised the issue that these potential developments also bring challenges, stating that larger companies concentrate on enterprise and development in these areas but disregard the fact that they are within communities. He questioned if these companies like Amazon would consider the construction of small housing estates, as Bord Na Móna did in the past, to encourage their staff to live there and ensure these communities remain. Cllr. Quinn suggested that representatives from Amazon be invited to attend a future meeting of the Municipal District.

Cribbin also stated the Canoe Club, Pitch & Putt and Skate Park are all in existence as a result of lands made available by Offaly County Council, all of which are excellent facilities for young people. He wished all the candidates the best of luck in the upcoming elections.

Cllr. McDermott congratulated Cllr. Cribbin on his year as Cathaoirleach, stating that all the Members set aside their party differences and worked for the good of the people and the area. He also mentioned the construction of two new estates in the town during this Council term.

Cllr. Fitzpatrick presented a painting of the Town Hall to the Members.
